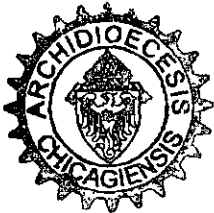

I am writing to you in order to formalize my handwritten note of June 23, 2007 in response to your letter of June 18, 2007, regarding the matter of **Reverend Thomas Job**, a priest ordained for the Archdiocese of Chicago who resigned from priestly ministry many years ago, and the allegations of sexual misconduct that were made against him by [REDACTED]. This matter was discussed in a Review for Cause by the Review Board at their meeting of June 16, 2007.

I accept the Review Board's determination that there is reasonable cause to suspect that this misconduct occurred. Since Thomas Job has already resigned from ministry and his faculties have been removed, any further action on my part to restrict his ministry would be superfluous. I ask that our Assistance Ministry continue to provide any appropriate outreach to [REDACTED] as might be needed.

At a Review for Cause the Review Board determines, based on the information that has been gathered and made available to it, whether there is reasonable cause to suspect that the accused priest engaged in the sexual misconduct of a minor.

In the Review for Cause of this matter on March 17th, the Board determined that there is reasonable cause to suspect that the alleged misconduct occurred. Cardinal George has accepted the Board's determination.

In an 8-0 vote in light of the information presented, the Board determined that this matter warrants additional investigation The Board asked that the following information be obtained

- Check with records from St Mary of the Lake Seminary to determine where and when Thomas Job served as a deacon
- To attempt to speak with Rev John Tapper, one of possibly two individuals still alive who were assigned to Santa Maria del Popolo during the time period of the alleged abuse, also to specifically ask Fr Tapper if he can recall who from the seminary may have provided supply work to Santa Maria del Popolo during the time of the alleged abuse
- Attempt to determine if Rev Peter Wilkin is alive and speak with him [as per Rev Daniel Smilanic, Peter Wilkin is either resigned from the priesthood or deceased]
- Talk with Rev John Canary to ask if he can remember who from the seminary provided supply work to Santa Maria del Popolo during the time of the alleged abuse
- Attempt to obtain the school records of [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] to determine if there is any mention of [REDACTED]
- Attempt to determine if any teachers, religious, etc may be located who would have been assigned to/working at Santa Maria del Popolo at the time of the alleged abuse

In a 7-0 vote in light of the information presented, the Board determined that there is reason to suspect that the former Fr. Job did sexually abuse [REDACTED].


But the events of the past six months have brought so very much turmoil and emotional upheaval back into my life that I had to reach some definitive decision.

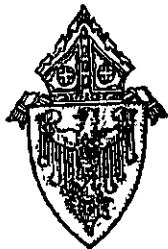

The following is an account of events regarding Fr. Tom Job on Monday and Tuesday, June 16 & 17, 1990.

1. Over the past few weeks (May 18 was my last appointment with Tom) a letter was to be sent to the pastor, Fr. Bob Fitzpatrick, and to the associate pastor, Fr. Job, indicating a change of pastoral status for Fr. Job from Pastoral Associate to Pastoral Resident for 2 reasons:

1) Fr. Fitz had indicated that he couldn't afford Fr. Tom as an Associate and there was an issue of jealousy.

2) Fr. Tom was going to take a job with Lake County as an alcoholism counselor. (Fr. Tom has been doing volunteer work at an outreach alcohol center at Benet Lake -- an outreach of St. Catherine's Hospital in Kenosha). I have been encouraging Fr. Job to move eventually into this ministry full time. I so reported this to the Vicar for Priests and Personnel Board. Fr. Job was gone on vacation and I could not resolve a point that Bishop Gorman, the Vicar, raised -- namely that Fr. Tom was going for training initially with Lake County until November. What would Fr. Job's status be then. Before Fr. Job went on vacation he called to tell me that he had talked to the pastor and it was agreed that he stay on as associate without pay. In order to clarify the situation I asked to meet with Fr. Fitz after talking to him on the phone and also Fr. Job on Monday, July 16, at 9:30 at Lake Forest Oasis. In this preparatory conversation with Fr. Fitz, Fr. Fitz requested a sentence be put in the letter saying that the original arrangement of Fr. Job's appointment be once more mentioned.

2. On July 16, around 7:45 A.M., Fr. Job left a message on my telephone recorder that the meeting at 9:30 was being cancelled, that he was leaving St. Bede's that day, that he was going to send a letter of resignation to the Cardinal, that he had not disgraced the Church, that he was going to take a week or two off and that he would call me later in the week.

I tried to reach Fr. Tom on the rectory phone and his private phone to no avail. I then called Fr. Fitz who confirmed the telephone message. Fr. Fitz seemed to be upset. There were interruptions on the phone. Fr. Fitz said he was helping Tom pack and would talk to me in the afternoon. Actually, he called me back shortly. We talked for a long time. Fr. Fitz seemed guarded in his comments. He talked about Fr. Tom teaching in the school (about 1½ hours a week). Fr. Fitz said he himself was always there at the same time. He said boys were visiting Fr. Tom in Fr. Tom's house (which incidently is in St. Bede's parish -- a house Fr. Tom has had for many years with Tom Franzman).

He said he know of some boys who have stayed overnight. He said he talked to Tom about this situation 3 months ago and that maybe Fr. Tom should consider leaving. He said he wanted to have the meeting with me about the letter of appointment because he wanted to make sure the sentence about "special arrangement" between Fr. Fitz and Fr. Job be re-emphasized. I asked him how he knew the kids were visiting. He said he knows without amplifying his remarks. We agreed to meet after Quinn Corcoran's funeral in Waukegan the next day.

3. Fr. Fitz and I met for about 50 minutes in I.C. Rectory in Waukegan after the funeral. We went over most of the material treated in the telephone conversation on Monday. I felt Fr. Fitz was much clearer or at least I seemed to get a better grasp of the concern that Fitz had. He said he has been worried about this much more than his other problems. He said he questioned the mother of one of 3 boys who he thought stayed overnight. The mother confirmed the fact. He said he heard other boys talking among themselves about being at Fr. Tom's house. Fitz told me he confronted Fr. Tom last Friday morning about raising the issue of "the arrangement" at our Monday meeting. I presume this panicked Tom who over the weekend must have made his decision to leave here. Fitz and I talked briefly with Bishop Gorman.

Tom Job came to see me at my request. He was pretty disturbed after getting my call last week. [REDACTED]

I reviewed my relation with Tom Job. I first saw him professionally during 1976-77-78 at the request of Fr. Richard Keating, at that time Chancellor of the Archdiocese, because of inappropriat behavior with some childred in Northlake. The monthly meetings were terminated in early '78 as there did not seem to be any reason to continue (This was mistake - we (Tom and I) agreed today because if we had continued he feels that events in 1983 would not have occurred.

I explained that [REDACTED], agitated by some recent personal problems at St. Cletus, once more raised the issue of whether or not T.J. was getting professional help and supervision in his present assignmnet. I told him how [REDACTED] reviewed those years of difficulty with [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] She told me about finding a letter of apology from T.J. to [REDACTED] which he had while residing at [REDACTED]

(T.J. , today, 1) claims he never wrote such a letter, 2) that he called [REDACTED] at the insistance of T.V. for purposes of personality growth to apologize for his (T.J.'s) behavior 3) that he never talked to [REDACTED] after that 4) that [REDACTED] attempted to reach him (T.J.) on the phone at late hours.) [REDACTED]

I explained our concern for T.J. and the Archdiocese, how easy it is for people to sue, how vulnerable our priests are in these kind of situations and how it can pop up anytime. This is the reason that the representative of Archbishop (in this case Vicar of Priests' Office) have contact with supervisor [REDACTED] in the event any charges are filed or litigation develops. [REDACTED]

T.J. also gave me permission to check with Fr. Fitzpatrick, his pastor. I also advised T.J.:

1. Diocese administration has obligation to monitor anyone who has had this kind of problem.
2. Attorneys constantly remind us if there was to be a relapse civil authorities would want to know exactly what kind of supervision there is for a previous violator.

I constantly advised T.J. during the interview that we are trying to care for him and the diocese and people involved.

We discussed my desire to develop a group for people who are having difficulties in this area and T.J. offered to help.

I related to him my relationship and conversations with John O'Donnell and Jim O'Connor and their questions about T.J. These conversations were not pursued by me because no deeper questions were presented.

T.J. said he was more comfortable about this visit. He is leaving for Europe on Friday with Tome Franzman.

1. [redacted] called today. Her phone number is [redacted] [redacted] is the mother of [redacted] the child whom Fr. Job molested while at St. Cletus. [redacted] indicated that she had seen Fr. Ventura several times in the past and when she called him, he suggested she contact Fr. Coughlin and/or myself.

2. Her son, [redacted] and she came across a letter that Fr. Job had written to him. This was back in 1983. She showed that letter to Fr. Ventura. She now has it in safe-keeping. [redacted]

[redacted] He is now 21 years old. [redacted]

3. [redacted] was calling today about both Fr. Gallagher and Fr. Job. [redacted]

[redacted] said that she is quite friendly with Sr. Jean, the former principal at St. Cletus. Sr. Jean knows the whole story. [redacted] feels that there ought to be something done about the situation. [redacted]

4. [redacted] said she talked to Fr. Ventura and he said something would be done but she hasn't heard anything in a year or more. About two months ago she received two different phone calls, one about [redacted] and the other about Fr. Job. [redacted]

[redacted] The other phone call was one from someone who knew the situation about Fr. Job and had heard that he may have acted up again up in Libertyville. At least she knew that he left there rather suddenly and didn't know where he was. I did tell her that he left with permission and was on a leave in order to [redacted] and that he is presently reassigned. She wanted to know whether he was dealing with the altar boys again and I said I would have to talk to Fr. Ventura about that. —But I said I also doubt it very much, because now a days we notify the pastor of the nature of

the problem and we place a mandate upon the individual that he must not be in the presence of children without another adult. [redacted] wanted some assurances that Fr. Job is under control. She said that he has an enormous amount of money. He would always have a different explanation of where he got the money. One time he would say that [redacted]

[redacted] But he spent a lot of money on the boys. [redacted] said that there were six or seven boys, [redacted] who were known around the parish as Fr. Job's boys. [redacted] and all but her son [redacted] went with Fr. Job on a trip to [redacted]. Fr. Job has very expensive tastes. He eats at a restaurant that the average person wouldn't go to except on a very, very special occasion. He belongs to one of the most exclusive hunt clubs in Illinois, the [redacted], and he would take the boys hunting there. Her son [redacted] got a lot of money from Fr. Job. About a year ago, [redacted] came home and lived there for a while. During that time he indicated that Fr. Job would show porno movies and fondle the kids. At one time [redacted] got \$ [redacted] from Job and another time \$ [redacted]. The letter that Job wrote to [redacted] back in 1983 was by way of an apology, etc.

1. Tom requested that I continue to work with him during his 6 month leave of absence which will end January 14, 1988. Thus I met with him today at the mid point. Here is a summary of that meeting:

- Despite some health problems (broken foot & toe etc.) Tom says this has been a very good time for him.

He is working on a weight reduction program. He has helped on weekends at St. Paul Parish in Ingleside as needed. He has enjoyed working on a program for The W. Clement Stone Foundation at their request. He will attend fall courses at the College of Lake County in Psychology and Carpentry.

- Looking ahead, he hopes to return to parish ministry since he has rediscovered a deep love for the Church, the priesthood, and parish ministry. He is trying to develop a clear idea of the kind of pastor he can best work with in his next assignment.

- He would like to have another meeting with the Cardinal in late October (after things settle down following the Papal visit). He found the first meeting with the Cardinal very cordial

but extremely frustrating since it lasts only seven minutes. He realizes that it was a very hectic day for The Cardinal, but he would like to have more time since this deeply affects his entire future.

- A key issue for Tom is this: ongoing depression. He realizes that he has been involved in extremely serious problems, but has worked hard on it and wonders if he will have to "wear an albatross around his neck" for the rest of his life as a priest. Does he have to meet on a regular basis with The Vicar for Priests? Does he have to have on site supervision by a pastor who is fully informed of his background. This is a very painful area for him and he would like clarity as to what is required.

7. Reflections

- Tom needs to be congratulated on his work on his problem. [REDACTED]
- Tom has not, to the best of my knowledge, shared any of this with any close friends. Nor am I aware that he has a real spiritual director. That concerns me. [REDACTED]
- Tom seems excessively private & sensitive.

Tom Job:

- In my opinion, it would be unwise not to insist on an ongoing system of supervision. I think Tom should be in periodic contact with the Vicar for Priests for a progress report. (Perhaps twice a year.) His pastor should always be informed of Tom's background and be alert to any signs of concern. On the other hand, the pastor should be sensitive and supportive and not a nag or a "guard."
- If Tom balked at this, I would not allow him to return to active ministry. I realize that it is very difficult to feel that you are a "marked man." But I feel that we have an overriding obligation to do our best to protect our people from any & all potential harm.

Today I met with Father James O'Connor, pastor of St. Joseph Church in Libertyville.

Jim said when Tom Job was transferred to him, Jim received an anonymous letter saying, "Watch out for Job. He plays with boys and he steals from the collection."

Fr. Frank Gill, [REDACTED] was staying with Jim. When he saw all the teenage boys going up to Job's room he asked Jim, "What is going on here with Job and these teen-age boys?" Jim called Tom Ventura who suggested that Jim confront Tom about it. Jim did. Tom denied anything was wrong, but the boys didn't come up anymore or if they did it was always in groups.

Tom always claimed to have inherited a fortune from his parents. He was an only child. He certainly has had a rich lifestyle. Frequent first class trips all over the world; a lot of money poured into a Fox Lake home; membership in an expensive hunt club, etc.

For the last three years, Jim O'Connor has been keeping track of the collections. When Tom is away in June and July the collection jumps about \$2,000 per Sunday and the percentage of loose money jumps to 6%-14% of the total collection instead of 2%-3%.

After their parish pledge drive, Jim showed these figures to Tom Hanrahan who said "Something funny is happening with your collection. Keep an eye on it."

Jim started using money bags with a key and two weeks later a combination lock and the collection shot up again.

Job is leaving the parish in June. Supposedly he told the former principal at Carmel High School, Father Greg Klein, "When I leave St. Joe's, I'll retire."

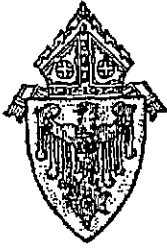

PRA received a message from [REDACTED] on May 18, 2004 regarding "a priest." [REDACTED] called PRA again on May 19, 2004 to discuss "a matter about a priest from grammar school."

[REDACTED] informed PRA that he was "molested by a priest" when he was approximately 11 or 12 years old and a student at St. John Vianney. He also informed PRA that the priest "molested other boys." [REDACTED] [REDACTED] clearly expressed his main concern that he wanted to ensure that Thomas Job was no longer a priest and/or in a position to hurt [abuse] other young boys.

At this point in the conversation, [REDACTED] accepted PRA's offer to briefly explain the Office of Professional Responsibility, with mention of the Office of Assistance Ministry. [REDACTED]

PRA provided [REDACTED] with the information that Mr. Job is a resigned priest of this diocese. As requested by [REDACTED] PRA also provided him with Fr. Job's assignments and the year he resigned from the priesthood. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] filed a police report against Fr. Job at the time of the abuse. [REDACTED]



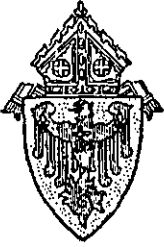

1. Tom and I had not met for some time -- a number of phone calls. He says he has been attempting to get his work schedule changed so he could join the [REDACTED]. I told him about our ongoing concern that he is not in a more closely supervised environment. I told him about our concern for him because his name had been mentioned in one of the Depositions. Even though the behavior referred to occurred some 12 years ago, it could be a source of interest to some people. Tom has been [REDACTED].

3. We talked about his letter of resignation which he wrote in January of this year. He still would like to remain in the priesthood and is willing to give the St. George Rectory a try. He said he has renewed efforts to get off on Tuesday night and expects to be at next week's meeting. He could talk then about the St. George living situation.

4. After our Advisory Committee Meeting last Saturday, [REDACTED], I did not stress the actual opening date with Tom. He knows about it. If he follows through with [REDACTED] we will move on from there. If he doesn't, it seems there is no other choice than to accept the resignation. I do think we should try to provide some appropriate residence if it is at all possible. [REDACTED]

Bishop,

I would like to preface this letter with the comment that I have always wanted to serve as a priest of the Archdiocese, and that I still do. However, circumstances have led to my attached offer, should you decide to accept it, of resigning from the active priesthood.

You have been aware for years of my personal problem. I can only reiterate my sorrow over the embarrassment I have been to the priesthood and to the Archdiocese. I have done everything I knew how to do to rectify the situation and to keep it from repeating. I have [REDACTED], I have complied with every request made upon me by the diocese [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] These past few years I have been seeing [REDACTED] and until last July, serving in St. Bede Parish in Ingleside (where you graciously assigned me at my own request).

In July, I left the parish - without permission. The living conditions had become intolerable and unhealthy for me - to the point where depression was becoming a very serious issue again. I made the decision to leave because I felt my mental and emotional stability was threatened. In my twenty plus years of serving the Archdiocese, I have had only two assignments that were supportive, where communication within the Rectory was existent and good, where the priests living together were not threatened by the talents and expertise of the others but instead worked together, and where there was a genuine desire to serve the people of the parish. This was sadly missing from the rest. In no way do I blame others for what existed - for I was as much a part of this as the others. Since leaving St. Bede, I have been living by myself in my own home and working as an addiction counselor, preparing for my certification examination. This work was entered into with your permission and with Andy McDonough's encouragement.

I see this work as a calling from God - a new direction of ministry for me which accomplishes a number of things. I have always felt that God puts us in the right place at the right time. This work, and leaving the parish when I did, allowed me to get away from the temptations that regular parish life made present to me. There was no more involvement with children, parish families, parish schools. I was able to cultivate creative, supportive, mature adult friendships. My goal and hope was to eventually assist Andy McDonough in his ministry serving the special needs of the priests of the archdiocese. A hope which I see slowly fading away.

Whatever I have done in the way of ministering as a priest I have done well. I am an untiring worker who loves challenge. I have thrown myself into this new ministry in the same manner - educating

myself, working with individual priests whom I've met through my work, intervening in the lives of the laity to help them [REDACTED]. I have no doubt that I could benefit the priests of the diocese in many ways - [REDACTED]

But I have come to an impasse. I have come to realize that I will never be trusted to function without supervision and that I will never be fully accepted as a "normal" priest again - whatever that means. I'm sure that the legal department of the diocese would rejoice over your acceptance of my resignation - and I truly can understand why. My unresolved conflict is that I am being told I must reside in a rectory or religious institution. This is for my own 'safety' and that of the diocese liability-wise. [REDACTED]

I also need to feel that I have some control over my life - I'm forty-six years old.

I ask that you consider some compromise that would permit me to continue ministering as a priest of the Archdiocese in what I see as a healthy atmosphere. I am most willing to continue working with and for Andy McDonough, [REDACTED], to do 'supply' work on weekends. I have no doubt that I am healthy enough to minister to the unique needs of fellow-priests. But I need to maintain my own dignity and self-esteem, which I have worked long and hard to regain. If no compromise is possible, than you have my formal letter of resignation attached. I would appreciate it if you would let me know of your decision through Andy.

Speaking of Andy - you have a tremendous asset in this priest. I cannot praise him enough for his compassion, empathy and devotion. I leave with you the advice given me by my Deacon-pastor, Monsignor Peter Meegan: "a good pastor ministers to the needs of his staff, and because he does that, his staff takes care of the parish". Take care of Andy - he's one of a kind and your priests need him!

1. I received a telephone call from Tom Job this morning about 8 A.M. on the recorder that he and Fr. Bob Fitzpatrick were cancelling their appointment with me at the Lake Forest Oasis on the Tri-State Toll Road scheduled for 9:30 A.M. Fr. Tom said he never disgraced the Church. He said he was sending in a letter of resignation to Cardinal Bernardin today and moving out of St. Bede Rectory in Ingleside. Tom sounded very agitated.
2. I tried to call him on his private line but to no avail. I contacted Fr. Bob a short time later and he, Fr. Bob, confirmed the fact that Tom was leaving the parish. I talked to Fr. Bob two or three times this morning about the situation.
3. The reason I had for meeting with the two of them this morning was to work out the wording of a letter of appointment for Fr. Tom to change from being Pastoral Associate to Pastoral Resident while in a training program for the Lake County Health Center -- Alcohol Division. My theme with Tom in recent months: become an alcoholic counselor and make this your full-time ministry for the future. He was amenable to that.
4. Bob Fitz saw the meeting this morning as an occasion to insert a sentence in the letter of appointment: that the original arrangement for Fr. Job at St. Bede be maintained and stressed. In a long, rambling conversation Fr. Bob said he has been very concerned the last 3 or 4 months about Fr. Job's behavior in the parish with the children. He talked to Tom about considering leaving St. Bede in view of the fact that Fr. Tom was having children at his home in the parish. Some parents told him about their children visiting there. There were no complaints, however. Fr. Bob has been becoming increasingly uneasy about the situation. Fr. Tom has been in the school for an hour and a half once a week. Fr. Bob has always been there. This has been going on since last September.
5. Fr. Bob told Fr. Tom he did not like the idea of kids being at his (Fr. Tom's) home. Fr. Tom did not deny that. Kids are there over night. Fr. Bob would only say that he knew these facts to be true. He never disclosed how he knew this.
6. Fr. Bob explained how he invited the Filipino priest in to live. This priest says Mass every morning -- first Mass -- thus making it easier on Fr. Bob and Fr. Tom. Fr. Bob says he is aware of the Filipino priest's background. Fr. Bob does not know how long the Filipino priest will stay.
7. Fr. Bob has invited Fr. Jasinski from St. John of God to come and be an associate there. Fr. Bob sort of expected Fr. Tom to leave the parish and was pleased this would happen because he has been very worried and wanted to be sure

to have someone.

8. Fr. Bob has written a letter of resignation and was thinking of sending it in to the Pastoral Center the 2nd or 3rd week. I am to see Fr. Bob after John Corcoran's funeral in Waukegan tomorrow. I have tried to reach Fr. Job but to no avail. I left my number.

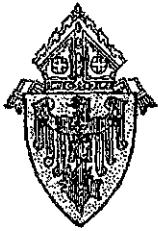

Tom Ventura told me that Tom Job really does not keep in touch with him. He suggested that I call Bob Fitzpatrick around the first of June just to see how things are going. 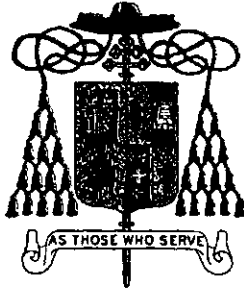

1. By the strangest of coincidences, you and I were discussing the case of Tom Job when I met you this morning in the subway. This afternoon, I received a phone call from Jim O'Connor (████████), the pastor of St. Joseph in Libertyville, expressing concern about Tom Job.

2. As background information, Jim said that when he first went to St. Joseph's, he received two anonymous letters. The first was a warning that "he plays with boys and steals from the collection". The second letter said something to the effect: "When are you going to do something to keep him from stealing from the collection?" Jim reported all this to Bob Kealy. Apparently the collection jumped sizeably each time Job went on vacation. The difference in collections would be two to three thousand dollars. Jim has had to resort to a combination lock system on the money bags.

With regard to the other charge, Jim admits that he has never seen any evidence of inappropriate activity on Job's part. However, when Frank Gill was living at St. Joseph's for two or three months at the beginning of 1985, Frank asked Jim one day what was going on, because he noticed frequently a group of teenagers going to Tom's room and the door would be closed.

Jim states that he talked to you about this and that he also confronted Job. He further stated that Job left St. Joseph's last June and informed the people that he was going on some sort of sabbatical.

3. Jim's concern at the present time stems from reports he has heard recently to the effect that Tom is still taking kids up to his cottage at Fox Lake. Apparently this is a cottage he owns with Tom Franzman. Jim said that one of Tom Job's friends, a boy who is now a senior in high school, served his Mass on the feast of the Immaculate Conception and Jim just asked him whether he ever sees Fr. Job any more. The boy replied in the affirmative. He told Jim that he sees Fr. Job at the "factory". Apparently this is a gym in Lake Forest and this boy said that Fr. Job video tapes the people going through their gymnastic routines. Jim did not want to make any accusations, but he thought that this was a rather strange thing for a priest to be doing.

Jim also mentioned that when Tom Job was at his first assignment in Northlake, there was a big complaint about him there, too. Jim knew the former principal and she told him that some of the people were ready to kill Job.

4. I told Jim I would pass this information along to you. I'm not quite sure what the next step will be. Maybe you could give me a call on this. I can see why Tom might not want to switch to me for supervision, but it certainly seems

as though he has to be supervised by someone, and someone will have to check out the rumors that he is still taking youngsters to his cottage. I'd appreciate it, Tom, if you'd give me a call on this when you have a chance.

1. Tom Job, after long and difficult pondering, has decided to request a six month Sick Leave for reasons of emotional health from June 14, 1987 to January 14, 1988. He will contact Ken Velo for an appointment to see you about this request. I recommend that you grant it to him.

2. Background:

- I began working with Tom Job in November 1983 after having been contacted by a High School chaplain and the father of a student about alleged inappropriate activities by Fr. Job with his son. Fr. Job was cooperative, [redacted] and met with me since then on a regular basis for support and supervision. I also contacted his pastor for assistance as an on-site supervisor. These arrangements seem to have worked well.

- Last Autumn Tom and I began discussion about the transition period which he would encounter in Spring, 1987. He learned that a) he would have to transfer to a new parish since his 5 year term would be ending and b) I would be leaving office. He was concerned about the kind of pastor who would be supervising him, the traveling distance from [redacted], his relationship with the new Vicar for Priests, and the possibility of [redacted]

- Tom has discussed all of these factors at length with [redacted] and, to a lesser extent, with me. He feels that he needs some time and space to sort out the experiences of these last few years, to reflect upon his progress, and to work for greater emotional stabilization in order to prepare to enter a new assignment as well as possible.

- He loves priesthood and would like to continue to work as a priest. But he wants to do all he can to be as good a priest as he can. He also sees this leave as an opportunity to acquire additional ministerial skills by taking some college courses.

3. Practical plans.

A. He would live at a cottage which he owns with a classmate:

4. Recommendation: I think this is a good decision. I think it would be appropriate to request a comprehensive progress report from [REDACTED] as well at that time. I feel that we need to be both supportive to Tom and conscientious about our legal and moral responsibilities as well.

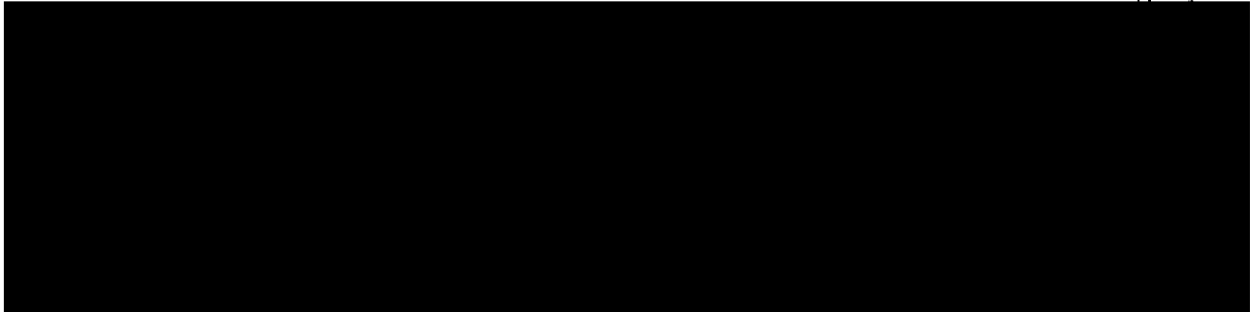

November 1983: Rev. Peter Heidenreich, O.P., informed me that [redacted] age 17, told him that he had engaged in sexual activities with Fr. Job while he was associate pastor at St. Cletus, La Grange.

A meeting was arranged between Fr. Heidenreich, [redacted] father and the Vicar for Priests to discuss the accusations.

I confronted Fr. Job. On Nov. 22, 1983 he [redacted]

Fr. Job agreed to monthly supervisory sessions with the Vicar for Priests. He was also ordered to avoid further contacts with young people.

The pastor of St. Joseph's Parish Libertyville is serving as on-site supervisor.

April 1984: [redacted] mother, contacted the Vicar for Priests to report that her son is [redacted]. She is relieved to know that Fr. Job is [redacted] and expressed the hope that this never happens again.

November, 1985: Sister Peg Ivers, former principal of St. John Vianney Parish, Northbrook, Il., informed me that there had been accusations of improper activities between Fr. Job and boys when he served as associate at that parish during her time as principal there.

I contacted Fr. Mike Adams who had been on the Personnel Board at that time. He said that he knew very little about it but that Fr. Richard Keating had dealt with the case and had arranged treatment for Fr. Job. He thought that Fr. Keating had served as Fr. Job's supervisor during that period.

[redacted]

September 1986: [redacted] and Sister Jean Oursler met with me. [redacted] expressed her happiness with the progress she has made personally as a result of the Families Anonymous program. Sister Jean was the Principal of St. Cletus School during the time Fr. Job was an associate at that parish. She said that there were no signs that anything was amiss, and that she was very much surprised when she had heard of Fr. Job's involvement with [redacted]. Both expressed the wish that we continue to help Fr. Job with this problem.

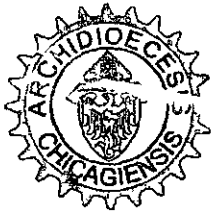

In connection with  allegation of sexual abuse against the former Rev. Thomas Job, I contacted Sr. Peg Ivers via phone on March 26, 2007 due to the fact that she was the principal of St. John Vianney at the time of the alleged abuse.

When I introduced myself, Sr. Peg indicated immediately that she remembered me from past conversations related to a different matter received by this office concerning Fr. Job and his past assignment to St. John Vianney. I informed Sr. Peg that I was calling in connection with an allegation against Fr. Job and when asked, she indicated that she did have the time and would be willing to speak with me. Prior to continuing, I informed Sr. Peg that this was a confidential investigation, to which she replied that she understood.

I informed Sr. Peg that  had recently come forward to formalize an allegation against Fr. Job. Sr. Peg stated that she does know that  Family and  from St. John Vianney. I then asked Sr. Peg if Fr. Job had any type of office located in the school building. Sr. Peg informed me that the school buildings were built at different times and as a result, there were small rooms that remained at the end of each hallway of the original school building. As per Sr. Peg, one of these small rooms was the nurse's office and on the second floor in one of these small rooms as Fr. Job's office. Sr. Peg stated that Fr. Job wanted to run the religious education program when he arrived at St. John Vianney, a request that was honored by the pastor. I asked Sr. Peg if Fr. Job's office included some sort of sink within it. Sr. Peg stated that Fr. Job's office had a little bathroom with a sink attached to it. She remarked that Fr. Job insisted upon having this little office on the second floor in the school building. Sr. Peg then expressed that her "...heart is broken for all the damage that has been done [the sexual abuse of boys by Fr. Job]..." She stated that before she knew of any of the abuse by Fr. Job, she had always been suspicious about him "...because he was always with boys...and had no adult friends."

Sr. Peg expressed her memories of Fr. Job always taking kids out of class. When asked, Sr. Peg stated that Fr. Job always only took boys out of class and spent time with boys and never any girls. Also when asked, Sr. Peg stated that Fr. Job did have the boys help him set up for and clean up after CCD. Sr. Peg stated that after CCD, Fr. Job would take the boys out in his car for a treat. She also expressed her knowledge of Fr. Job taking boys to his parents' place in Wisconsin for two or three days at a time.

Sr. Peg then shared many of her personal frustrations with attempting to notify the appropriate archdiocesan individuals/offices regarding her concerns with Fr. Job and boys when she was still the principal of St. John Vianney. As per Sr. Peg, she finally resigned from her position because she "...couldn't take it anymore [reporting her concerns with Fr. Job's behavior and no action being taken]..." Sr. Peg continued by stating that four months after she resigned from St. John Vianney, she received a phone call from the mayor of the town [Northlake] in the middle of the night regarding Fr. Job. As per Sr. Peg, the mayor informed her that a boy told his father of the sexual abuse by Fr. Job and the father in turn was threatening to go with a shotgun to confront the accused cleric. Sr. Peg stated that Fr. Job was gone from St. John Vianney the next day.

Sr. Peg stated that over the years after Fr. Job had left St. John Vianney and had been assigned to subsequent parishes, she received more than one phone call out of more than one parish asking her how he could have gone from parish to parish [exhibiting the same concerning behaviors with boys].

When asked, Sr. Peg informed me that [REDACTED] did not go directly to her and inform her of any abuse by Fr. Job. However, Sr. Peg did confirm that [REDACTED] was one of the boys at St. John Vianney that Fr. Job had with him and help with CCD. Based upon [REDACTED] allegation, I asked Sr. Peg if she knew of any interactions Fr. Job might have had with [REDACTED]. Sr. Peg stated that, "...[REDACTED] eventually talked to me [about the abuse by Fr. Job]...I don't know how he survived the abuse [by Fr. Job]." Also when asked, Sr. Peg stated that [REDACTED] name did not ring a bell for her. Sr. Peg then remarked, "[Fr. Job] was very secretive when he was up in the room [his office in the school building] with the boys." I also asked Sr. Peg if the names [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were familiar to her, as [REDACTED] had mentioned their presence when helping Fr. Job with CCD classes. Sr. Peg acknowledged that she knew both boys and that she knows [REDACTED] family very well. When asked, Sr. Peg stated that neither [REDACTED] nor [REDACTED] disclosed any abuse by Fr. Job to her. Sr. Peg added however that it would be a "...safe assumption..." that Fr. Job abused them in some way, as they were a part of the group of boys the cleric had spent time with.



As Fr. Costello and I were thanking Mr. Job for his time, we realized that he had already hung up the phone.



Mrs. Jan Slattery of the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth provided PRA with information on December 11, 2006 regarding a voice mail message that she had received on December 8, 2006. As per Mrs. Slattery, Rev. Tom Refermat of St. John Vianney parish left her a voice mail regarding an adult male named [REDACTED] who disclosed that he had been “assaulted” by the former Rev. Thomas Job between 1971 and 1973. Fr. Refermat stated in his voice mail that [REDACTED] indicated that there were other altar boys “involved.” It was agreed that PRA would call Fr. Refermat to follow up.

PRA spoke with Fr. Refermat via phone on December 11th regarding the voice mail that he had left for Mrs. Slattery. As per Fr. Refermat, [REDACTED] had disclosed the “assault” by Fr. Job to the current deacon of St. John Vianney. Fr. Refermat’s deacon then informed him of the conversation with [REDACTED] the aforementioned information, and a phone number [REDACTED]. It was agreed that Fr. Refermat would call [REDACTED] to inform him that PRA would like to speak with him regarding the alleged “assault” by Fr. Job as well as to provide information on the Office of Assistance Ministry. Fr. Refermat agreed to determine if [REDACTED] would like to call PRA, or if PRA could call him. Fr. Refermat may be reached at [REDACTED].

PRA received a phone message from Fr. Refermat later in the day of December 11th. Fr. Refermat left the message that he had spoken to [REDACTED] and that PRA could call him [REDACTED] directly.

Victim Statement Abstract

This abstract replaces the summary prepared by Leah McCluskey, Professional Responsibility Administrator for the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Professional Responsibility, of Victim ES's statement, given to Ms. McCluskey on August 31, 2006, formalizing his allegation of abuse against Rev. Thomas Job. The alleged abuse consisted of Fr. Job providing Victim ES with pornography and masturbating Victim ES. Fr. Job would also buy Victim ES expensive gifts. The alleged abuse occurred at the St. Cletus parish rectory and at Fr. Job's private home in Northern Illinois. The alleged abuse began when Victim ES was in seventh or eighth grade and continued until he was a sophomore in high school, and occurred approximately on a weekly basis. Victim ES also reported that the abuse was reported to the pastor of St. Cletus, as well as Vicar for Priests Fr. Thomas Ventura, and the St. Cletus school principal in the early to mid 1980's.

Per Professional Responsibility Administrator's [PRA] request, PRAA reviewed the former Rev. Thomas Job's Seminary file on November 20, 2006. The following is a summary of information in the aforementioned file:

- In a document titled Philosophy I, Semester I 1965 under the Application section, it is written in part, "Wished to withdraw after one day here. Was not dissatisfied with seminary but felt that he should not be a priest. On the whole seems very sensible to me. Impulsive first act has thus far been quite out of character with what I see of him now".
- In a document titled Summer Letter for 1965, Thomas Job describes his taking care of the servers and taking an occasional camping trip where he takes groups of boys from the parish. The name of the parish is not on the document. He references having worked there for the past five years.
- A letter dated 9/3/65 signed by Barry Horner and addressed to Monsignor Foley states in part, "He (referencing Thomas Job) spent every day here at the church and rectory helping me in many ways and getting other boys of the parish to work with him on these projects".
- Fr. Dougherty wrote in a document dated 1966-67 under Dean's evaluation, "Tom is a serious young man who is generous with his time. He is very courteous and intelligent, mature in his appearance. He seems too apologetic and obsequious at

times. He seems to have many veiled or unspoken feelings. I am not sure how much he is making his own life here, his own little seminary. He seems very self-righteous when challenged. Vocation: The impression he makes is a bit spooky, somber and sad. I'm not sure I know him well at all. He does seem serious about his desire to be a priest.

- Thomas Job wrote the following in a letter titled Summer Letter 1967: "I took a trip during the summer – the last two weeks of July. I had my work pretty well in hand, so I took a week and a half off to do some camping, a pastime which I particularly enjoy. I took four boys from the parish along, and went down to the Smoky Mountains in North Carolina. The boys worked for me at the rectory doing maintenance work and putting what they earned toward the trip. The parish more or less sponsored the trip, but the boys earn it on their own."
- Fr. Thomas Horne from St. Peter Damian Parish in Bartlett, IL wrote in part in a letter dated 9/5/67 and addressed to Monsignor Gorman: "Tom has no serious faults and very few minor ones. But he is heavily freighted with good qualities and abilities. In him the prime mover is a real enthusiasm about his vocation and priestly work. This motivates him to undertake and carry through almost anything. While he is not pietistic he never fails at daily mass and communion. He is constantly in the church and rectory and works with me most faithfully. He does not work alone but has a group of boys who work with him".
- Fr. Robert Dougherty wrote in a document dated 1967-1968 on letterhead from St. Mary of the Lake Seminary, "I feel more positively towards him because I have seen more of him. I feel more trust in him. I feel there is some hidden tension in my relationship with him. I find it hard to determine how open he is. There is a certain uneasiness there. I like to see him as steady and dependable, more as a person and less of a functionary. I feel that he has not yet really matured or is confident in himself. He seems somewhat insecure".
- A positive evaluation was written by Fr. Peter Wilkin from Santa Maria del Popolo Parish-dated 9/9/69. The evaluation states in part, "There have been no problems to speak of in his relationship with members of the house. The people have responded enthusiastically to him as a person and as a Deacon".
- Fr. Job wrote to Monsignor Gorman or George Kane on September 15, 1969. The letter states in part, "In closing, I cannot begin to thank you for allowing me to come to Mundelein (the letter appears to be referencing the Santa Maria del Popolo Parish) – even with all of your misgivings. I would venture to say that things have worked out so well because I had shopped around and decided on this parish and they wanted me. In the future, perhaps we should let men choose their own parish if they have enough initiative to go out and find one."
- On his Personal Data sheet, Fr. Job describes an interest in continuing to work with "special religious education" and writes he had found "working in the

retarded programs very helpful to me personally as well as very fulfilling ministerially”.

PRA returned a phone call to Mr.  today. Mr.  left PRA a voice mail earlier in the day and identified himself as an attorney representing a client who was abused by Rev. Thomas Job at St. Cletus in the late 1970s, early 1980s when he was a minor. Mr.  had requested a return phone call to .

PRA reached Mr.  via phone and spent much time providing him information regarding the process of one coming forward to formalize his/her allegation against a cleric of the Archdiocese of Chicago. While on the phone, Mr.  accessed the Archdiocesan website where PRA directed him to *§1100 Sexual Abuse of Minors: Policies for Education, Prevention, Assistance to Victims and Procedures for Determination of Fitness for Ministry*, as well as to the information about the Office of Professional Responsibility. PRA offered to send Mr.  hard copies of the aforementioned information, which he indicated was not necessary due to the fact that he has Internet access. Mr.  was also provided with information regarding PRA's need to report allegations of the sexual abuse of minors to the Department of Children and Family Services [DCFS] and that all matters are reported by John O'Malley, Director of Legal Services to the State's Attorney's office.

Mr.  indicated that his client is concerned with confidentiality. PRA assured Mr.  of the confidential nature of individuals coming forward and identified the appropriate Archdiocesan individuals/offices notified of allegations, as well as the aforementioned reports to DCFS and the State's Attorney's office.

Mr.  then identified his client as . When asked, Mr.  provided  date of birth as . Mr.  also informed PRA that  was an altar boy at St. Cletus in the late 1970s, early 1980s when the abuse by Fr. Job took place. As per Mr. ,  has disclosed to him that the abuse included Fr. Job taking him and other boys to his home in

Antioch, Illinois on the weekends for hunting and the like. [REDACTED] also disclosed to [REDACTED] that abuse included Fr. Job teaching him and other boys to masturbate.

Mr. [REDACTED] indicated that [REDACTED] is interested in meeting with PRA in Chicago. It was agreed that Mr. [REDACTED] would speak with [REDACTED] about possible dates and times to travel to Chicago to meet. Mr. [REDACTED] also mentioned earlier in the phone conversation that he had an e-mail outlining the alleged abuse that he could forward to PRA. He confirmed PRA's e-mail address and indicated that he would forward the e-mail. [REDACTED]

At the end of the phone call, it was agreed that Mr. [REDACTED] would speak with [REDACTED] and then would contact PRA next week.



Assistance Ministry received a call today from an attorney, Mr. [REDACTED], asking for clarification on the Archdiocesan process for reporting an allegation against resigned priest, Thomas Job. He did not identify his client in the conversation, but offered the following information.

- The alleged abuse occurred when his client was a parishioner at St. Cletus in the 1980's.
- According to Mr. [REDACTED], the client's parents went to the pastor at the time, and continued to report to the Archdiocese by contacting then-Chancellor, Fr. Ventura.
- Mr. [REDACTED] has asked the client's mother to provide him with a written account (as best she can recollect) of the steps she took at the time to report to the Archdiocese her child's allegation.
- Mr. [REDACTED] did not share what the response was when the family reported to the Archdiocese in the 80's.
- Mr. [REDACTED] said his client currently resides outside of [REDACTED]. I responded that according to the client's comfort level, the Archdiocese, through OPR, could make arrangements for his/her travel to Chicago, or OPR and a representative from VAM could travel to [REDACTED] to meet with him/her in an appropriate/suitable meeting space. He appreciated the preference for a face-to-face meeting.

Mr. [REDACTED] had received some initial information from a fellow attorney, Mr. [REDACTED], but parts were incorrect. I clarified the reporting procedures, and then referred him to our Archdiocesan website for more detailed information.

I specified outreach to Mr. [REDACTED]'s client including his mother and other family members who may be in need. I also provided him with contact information for OPR, John O'Malley, and James Serritella. He was grateful for the information.

Mr. [REDACTED] assured me that he would relay the information to his client. He commended the Archdiocese for having services available to his client and family. With his client's approval, he will contact OPR to make the necessary arrangements.

PRA received a return phone call from Sr. Peg Ivers [formerly Sr. Sicna] on May 4, 2005. PRA had received Sr. Peg's name and contact information from Mr. Ralph Bonaccorsi of the Office of Assistance Ministry in connection with [REDACTED] allegation of sexual abuse against the former Rev. Thomas Job. Sr. Peg was the principal of St. John Vianney at the time of [REDACTED] alleged abuse by Fr. Job [see file].

PRA thanked Sr. Peg for the return phone call and suggested that she [Sr. Peg] was already familiar with the matter to be discussed. Sr. Peg replied by stating that she was certain that the phone call was in regards to [REDACTED] and Fr. Job. As per Sr. Peg, "...there is no doubt about it..." that Fr. Job abused [REDACTED]. Sr. Peg added that [REDACTED] is one of 20 boys abused by Fr. Job.

Sr. Peg informed PRA that she was a young principal at St. John Vianney at the time Fr. Job abused [REDACTED]. She spoke of reporting Fr. Job's abuse of boys to the Archdiocese of Chicago but that she "...couldn't get anyone at the Archdiocese to listen..." As a result of her knowledge of Fr. Job's abuse of boys, and the lack of action by the Archdiocese of Chicago, Sr. Peg left St. John Vianney Parish. Approximately four months after she left St. John Vianney, Sr. Peg received a phone call from a police chief informing her that Fr. Job had been arrested. Sr. Peg explained that [REDACTED] [see file]" had reported the abuse [REDACTED] by Fr. Job to the police, which resulted in the cleric's arrest. As per Sr. Peg, at the time the police chief expressed his fear to her that [REDACTED] might come back to the jail with a shotgun to kill Fr. Job.

When asked by PRA, Sr. Peg stated that she had been suspicious of Fr. Job "...for a while..." upon his assignment to St. John Vianney. She recalls that Fr. Job was a new priest when he was assigned to the parish in 1970. According to Archdiocesan Archives, Fr. Job was assigned to St. John Vianney from July 11, 1970 through June 1976. Sr. Peg

stated that there were "...more boys than [REDACTED]..." who came to talk to her about being abused by Fr. Job. When asked, Sr. Peg stated that Fr. Job was always with boys, taking them on trips and overnights at the rectory. Sr. Peg stated that Fr. Job had no adult friends when he was assigned at St. John Vianney. She also stated that Fr. Job's family had money and as a result, had purchased a house in Wisconsin and eventually purchased an airplane as well. As per Sr. Peg, Fr. Job would fly boys on his airplane to his home in Wisconsin.

One name of a former student of St. John Vianney who had spoken with her about abuse by Fr. Job was [REDACTED]. As per Sr. Peg, [REDACTED] was the first of two boys to come to her about abuse by Fr. Job. She stated that [REDACTED] parents came to talk to her about rumors of the abuse as well. When asked, Sr. Peg stated that Fr. Job instantly denied the allegations made by the boys of the parish. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] When asked by PRA, Sr. Peg estimated that [REDACTED] was in seventh grade when he disclosed the abuse by Fr. Job to her.

Sr. Peg spoke of a conversation she had with Mr. Bonaccorsi last fall in regards to this matter. She gave Mr. Bonaccorsi permission for him to provide [REDACTED] with her phone number so that they could talk. As per Sr. Peg, [REDACTED] did call her [in Fall 2004] and they spoke on the phone for approximately one and a half hours.

Sr. Peg shared her concern that Fr. Job "...is out there..." It was her understanding that upon his arrest, Fr. Job was given the option to leave the priesthood or this matter being turned over to the Office of the State's Attorney. As per Sr. Peg, Fr. Job chose to leave the priesthood. Sr. Peg stated that it was most disturbing to her that the Archdiocese of Chicago moved Fr. Job to a different parish shortly after he was arrested and was removed from St. John Vianney.

PRA thanked Sr. Peg for her time and the information she shared regarding this matter. She invited any future phone calls if necessary. Sr. Peg may be reached at [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] called this afternoon to let me know that he made contact with Sr. Siena, the principal of the elementary school. She told [REDACTED] that she'd been expecting his call for 30 years.

They discussed how Sr. Siena came to know that Job was abusing [REDACTED]. Sr. Siena reminded [REDACTED] that he and another boy went to see her in her office, and told her that Fr. Tom was doing something bad to them. A few days later, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Sr. Siena told the family that she would take it up with the pastor. When she came to get [REDACTED] and took him in her car to [REDACTED], it was because she wanted more specifics on the abuse so she could tell Fr. Boyle exactly what was happening.

Sr. Siena then told [REDACTED] about what happened after that evening with [REDACTED]. Sr. Siena and Fr. Shannon (the other associate pastor) went to Fr. Boyle and told him what was going on. Fr. Boyle didn't believe her. Sr. Siena and Job had some issues between them, so Boyle wrote it off to Sr. Siena trying to set him up. The pastor dismissed it and there was never any follow-up with [REDACTED] and his family.

The working relationship in the school became very difficult for Sr. Siena after that, and she ended up leaving at the end of the following school year, 1975. In October, 1975, new allegations against Job surfaced and [REDACTED] went to the Chief of the North Lake Police Department. The Chief then met with the Mayor, and the 2 called Sr. Siena. She told them that she was well aware of Job's history, named [REDACTED] and said she left the school because of it. Siena, the police chief, and the mayor then went to Fr. Boyle, who was "forced to believe it." Job was transferred to another parish in La Grange.

According to Sr. Siena, allegations arose at his subsequent parishes. The Cardinal then gave Job the option of turning himself into the authorities or leaving the priesthood. Job obviously chose to leave the priesthood. Sr. Siena believes that Job now owns a regional airport in the Chicago area ([REDACTED]). She also believes that he is in ministry still (in a "chapel on wheels") and they are both worried that his behavior is continuing.

Sr. Siena told [REDACTED] that she would do whatever she could to expose Job and help [REDACTED] said she feels very guilty over what has happened to him.

On or about October 14, 2004, I took a phone call from [REDACTED] had accused Thomas Job, a former priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago, of sexually abusing him [REDACTED] when he was a student at St. John Vianney School, Northlake, Illinois.

[REDACTED] was interested in speaking to the principal at the time of the abuse, Sr. Sienna Ivers, IBVM (now Sr. Peg Ivers). He stated that he remembers speaking to Sr. Sienna about the abuse. I searched out Sr. Sienna/Ivers' telephone number and passed it on to [REDACTED]

I contacted Sr. Ivers to tell her of my conversation with [REDACTED]. She expressed her willingness to speak with him. She commented to me that she remembered quite well the conversation with [REDACTED] when she was principal at St. John Vianney. She also remembered that another boy, [REDACTED] accompanied [REDACTED] when he came to meet with her.

As a follow up, [REDACTED] called me on October 28, 2004. He reported that he had recently spoken to Sr. Ivers – to whom he and another boy, [REDACTED] had revealed that then Fr. Job was abusing them. [REDACTED] confided that Sr. Ivers confirmed his recollections (and more) and described what actions she and one of the associates had taken to inform and convince the pastor (Fr. Boyle, now deceased) to take action. Sr. Ivers says she has carried her upset (that the Church did not act responsibly) for years and conveyed the same to [REDACTED]

There is more to the report that I will discuss with you. Perhaps, more importantly, can we discuss next steps? [REDACTED] He is represented by Jeff Anderson, but has not spoken to him or Marc Pearlman.

Let's talk.

Sr. Peg stated that she did write a letter to Cardinal George regarding the aforementioned matter as she had informed PRA that she would. As per Sr. Peg, she was calling to clarify some of the points in her recent letter to the Cardinal where she had also mentioned her past concerns with Rev. William Cloutier [Resigned/Deceased]. Referring to the letter that she wrote to the Cardinal, Sr. Peg stated that she did not "...want to give the wrong impression..." regarding her comments about Fr. Cloutier. Sr. Peg explained that at one point in time in the past, Fr. Cloutier was a member of her staff. She stated that "...there were problems..." with Fr. Cloutier and as a result, she spoke with Revs. William J. McNulty [Retired] and Tom Ventura. In Sr. Peg's words, she "begged them" to address the problems with Fr. Cloutier. Sr. Peg stated that Fr. McNulty was "very supportive" of her and her concerns, but that "...no one around Bill McNulty would act on my request [to have Fr. Cloutier removed]."

PRA spoke with Sr. Peg Ivers via phone on November 11, 2005 regarding a recent newspaper article that included information on the former Rev. Thomas Job [see file]. Sr. Peg expressed her concerns that in the newspaper article she read, Fr. Job was listed as deceased. She also remarked that the idea that Fr. Job's name was never mentioned in the media before in connections with allegations of sexual misconduct with minors was "crazy." Sr. Peg then informed PRA that Fr. Job's name had been mentioned publicly in connection with such allegations 30 years ago.

PRA agreed with all of the information that Sr. Peg stated, including that there was information regarding Fr. Job in the recent newspaper article that was incorrect. Sr. Peg was then informed that a civil attorney who represents alleged victims of misconduct released the recent information reported by the media on the aforementioned topic by clerics. PRA clarified for Sr. Peg that the aforementioned incorrect information concerning Fr. Job was not released by the Archdiocese of Chicago. Sr. Peg expressed her appreciation for the clarification.

Sr. Peg then voiced her great concerns for St. Bede's parish. She stated that her sister and husband live in St. Bede's parish and have endured the announcements of substantiated allegations of sexual misconduct with minors against several past priests assigned to the parish, including Fr. Job, Fr. [Norbert] Maday, and Fr. [redacted] [a name also released by the aforementioned civil attorney]. Sr. Peg also mentioned Frs. [redacted] who were assigned to St. Bede's in the past and have both exhibited negative behaviors, yet not sexual misconduct with minors. She then informed PRA her belief/suggestion that Cardinal George personally visit St. Bede's out of support for all that the parish and parishioners have endured.

PRA thanked Sr. Peg for her phone call and for sharing all of her concerns. Sr. Peg was informed that her concerns and suggestions would be conveyed to the Cardinal. PRA

Dear Mr. Job,

By now you are undoubtedly aware of Mr. Anderson's disclosure of the names of priests and former priests who were involved with the settlements of some of his clients. I suspect that you also know that yours was one of the names Mr. Anderson disclosed to the press. I want to assure you that the disclosure was Mr. Anderson's decision, not the Church's.

Since that news story broke we have received a number of inquiries as well as information about the men whose names were publicly shared for the first time, including you. We have also heard rumors that over the last couple of years you have been engaged in doing some of the things priests often do, like distributing Holy Communion and offering retreats and/or days of recollection. I hope this is not true. If this is true I ask that you cease doing so immediately.

The reasons I make this request should be obvious to you. First of all, you resigned from the active ministry several years ago. Secondly, as you know, Cardinal George has accepted our Review Board's determination that there is reason to believe that you engaged in sexual misconduct with a minor. Had you now still been an active priest in the Archdiocese of Chicago you probably would have been removed from public ministry. Now that your name has been made public we want to avoid the possibility of scandal. We do not want people to think you are acting in the name of the Church.

PRA contacted Francis Cardinal George via phone on November 2, 2005 regarding the former Rev. Thomas Job and the phone call received from his current employer [see November 3, 2005 Memorandum in file].

Cardinal George expressed his grave concern with all of the information provided by Mr. Job's current supervisor at the Lake County Behavioral Services Department, [REDACTED]. PRA informed Cardinal George that the information shared by [REDACTED] regarding Mr. Job was communicated to Rev. Vincent Costello, Mr. Job's Vicar for Priests. When asked by Cardinal George, PRA informed him that Mr. Job is resigned, but not laicized.

Cardinal George directed PRA to contact Bishop Raymond Goedert and share with him this information regarding Mr. Job. He stated that he wanted the process to begin to have Mr. Job laicized. Cardinal George supported PRA's suggestion to have a letter written regarding Mr. Job's status and standing as a resigned priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago shared with the "...nuns...and Catholic girls' home [see November 3rd Memorandum in file]..." Cardinal George also stated that Mr. Job is not to be administering communion. He requested that all of this information be communicated to Bishop Goedert.

PRA spoke with Bishop Goedert via phone on November 3, 2005 regarding the aforementioned matter. It was agreed that Bishop Goedert would fax to PRA a copy of a decree stating that Mr. Job is not in good standing as a cleric of this diocese. Bishop Goedert stated that he would contact Fr. Costello about this matter as well.

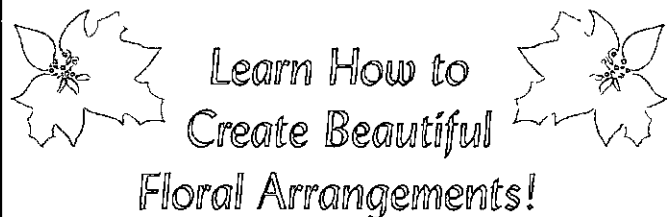

A Letter From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners of St. Bede,

Last week, I read in the newspaper that the Archdiocese of Chicago had settled a number of cases with victim-survivors of clerical misconduct. One case involved a former associate pastor from St. Bede, Thomas Job. It was through the victim-survivor's attorney that his name was released to the media, not through the Archdiocese of Chicago. I was surprised by what I had read, because I didn't have prior notice of the news item. At the same time, I was immediately concerned for our parish family and the reaction of the community regarding this new development. Thomas Job had served at St. Bede beginning in 1988, and resigned from the priesthood in 1992.

As you know, in the past, other priests' names have been announced as being removed from ministry because of a substantiated allegation of sexual misconduct with a minor. Thomas Job's name had not been part of that disclosure because he was resigned from the priesthood at the time this accusation was received by the Archdiocese. The Archdiocese, however, did follow its normal procedure in processing the accusation, and the Independent Review Board did make their recommendation to Cardinal George.

One could ask, why didn't the Archdiocese tell us that they had come to a settlement involving a priest that once served our parish? In order to maintain the privacy of the victim-survivors who come forward, it is the policy of the Archdiocese not to disclose details of any settlement. However, because the Archdiocese does not prohibit a victim-survivor or their attorney from revealing the details of a settlement, their disclosure might sometimes include the name of a priest that has not been previously made public in association with a claim of sexual misconduct with a minor.

It is a shock to see a priest's name in the newspapers associated with such a serious matter who served at St. Bede. Because we will never be able to know more than what we know now, perhaps we can suspend judgment against all involved. Instead, let us rise as the strong parish family of St. Bede and pray for all victims of sexual abuse and all those affected by this sin. I am available if anyone would like to speak with me about this matter.





Conference Call

Rev. James T. Kaczorowski arrived at the Office of Professional Responsibility just after the scheduled 12:30pm scheduled meeting time. PRA and Fr. Kaczorowski then contacted Mr. Patrick Reardon via phone at his office. Once Mr. Reardon was on the phone line, PRA contacted Mr. Thomas Job at his home via phone as well.

After introductions were made, PRA asked Mr. Job if he had any questions or concerns regarding the process of having an allegation of sexual misconduct of a minor made against him. Mr. Job responded by informing PRA that he did not have any questions or concerns at this time. PRA also offered to forward a copy of §1100 *Sexual Abuse of Minors: Policies for Education, Prevention, Assistance to Victims and Procedures for Determination of Fitness for Ministry* as well as a copy of  allegation to Mr. Job via mail. Mr. Job did not initially respond to PRA's offer to forward such information to his attention. Mr. Reardon did then request that PRA forward him a copy of  allegation against Mr. Job. It was agreed that PRA would fax and mail copies of the report to Mr. Reardon as requested.

PRA then began by reading  allegation of sexual misconduct against Mr. Job. PRA read the allegation in its entirety without any interruptions from either Mr. Job or Mr. Reardon. Once the entire report was read, Mr. Reardon stated that he and Mr. Job spoke briefly prior to the

October 19, 2004 conference call regarding this matter. Mr Reardon then stated that it was in Mr. Job's best interest to say nothing at this point in time [in response to the allegation], as Mr. Job is not seeking a review [of this matter] by the Review Board. He also indicated that the lack of his client's response was to protect Mr. Job from the possibility of being sued at any time in the future. Mr. Reardon informed PRA and Fr. Kaczorowski that upon receipt of a copy of the report, he and Mr. Job might provide a written response to the allegation. However, Mr. Reardon added that it would be more than likely that a written response would still not be provided to the allegation.


Fr. Kaczorowski then suggested that Mr. Job offer some sort of response to the allegation and mentioned the Review Board's future review of this matter and the possibility of [redacted] attorney releasing Mr Job's name publicly. Mr. Reardon again responded that based upon an initial conversation of the matter with Mr. Job, that they agreed that there would be no response by Mr. Job or on his behalf. When asked by Mr. Reardon during the October 19th conference call, Mr. Job verbally agreed with his attorney to not provide any response to [redacted] allegation against him.

Prior to ending the phone call, PRA and Fr. Kaczorowski thanked Mr Job and Mr Reardon for their time. PRA also asked Mr. Job directly if he would be interested in having the aforementioned information mailed to his home. Mr. Job indicated that he did not want copies of any of the information that PRA had offered to send to him. It was also agreed that PRA would not mail any correspondence to Mr. Job at his home without his consent.

Mr. Thomas Job reviewed this report and his signature is a statement of agreement of the accuracy of what he/his attorney Mr. Patrick Reardon shared in the October 19, 2004 conference call. The conference call lasted for approximately 45 minutes.



I don't know which draft of this letter this is...but all the rest of them get more and more difficult to read because of my handwriting, so I decided to type this one even though it seems terribly impersonal.

There is only one way to begin this letter, and that's by saying "I'm terribly sorry for what I did to you". The words seem so trite...but there's well over a year of agony and soul-searching behind them. There is no way [REDACTED] in which I can ever make-up to you for the way in which I used you...all I can offer is some of what I have learned about myself since I left LaGrange.

Within a couple of months of being transferred and after living for a while in somewhat of a normal situation here in Libertyville, I began to come to grips with what I had done to you. What took place was only between us - I had never been so involved at any other time with anyone else. Talk about feeling guilty... you see, [REDACTED] I really cared about you and what happened to you...and above all else I really wanted to help you. As I thought about how I felt about you and realized what I had done to you with such incredible rationalization I started to go into a deep depression. I had tried to contact you a few times after leaving, but was never able to get through to you. And then when I started realizing what I had done, it seemed best if I never interfered in your life again. I agonized for months over whether or not I was a homosexual. At times I could convince myself I was, at other times not. I lost just about all self-respect in myself and in my priesthood. And about fourteen months ago reached the point of seeing suicide as the only way to resolve what was going on inside of me. I never tried to commit suicide, but I came to the point of coldly working out the details of how to end my life. I was still rational enough though to realize that I was going out of my mind and that running could not be the only answer.

I've learned that what took place probably was caused by many events coming together in my life at once, making me extremely vulnerable...and knowing you at a time when you were extremely vulnerable. You were going through the confusion of adolescence as well as [REDACTED]. I was in between two of the most traumatic losses of my life - [REDACTED]. Both of which were very painful and agonizing. Both of which left me totally alone in this world. I have learned that what probably is at the bottom of all my actions is my extreme fear of being alone. I needed someone to care about me, to look up to me, to need me...and you needed someone too. And as much as I wanted to be able to help you and give you what you needed at that time in your life, I felt totally incapable of solving the problems of [REDACTED]. This produced even more anxiety and frustration. I have said a couple of times in this letter how strongly I felt about you - and still do. My problem was I cared so much about you that I couldn't come to grips with the fact that I could do nothing to help you. [REDACTED]

I still don't understand everything [REDACTED]. And as I reread what's above, it sounds so cold and removed. The fact is that for whatever reason I hurt you, and I will deeply regret that for the rest of my life. I am doing everything I can to put my life in order. [REDACTED] I realized that it has been over seventeen years since I can remember being truly happy. What I want for myself is to simply be able to be proud of myself again. I pray for you because I want you to find happiness and finally overcome the terrible things I did to you - you don't deserve any of it. I want you to forgive me...a thing that I realize you may never be able to do.

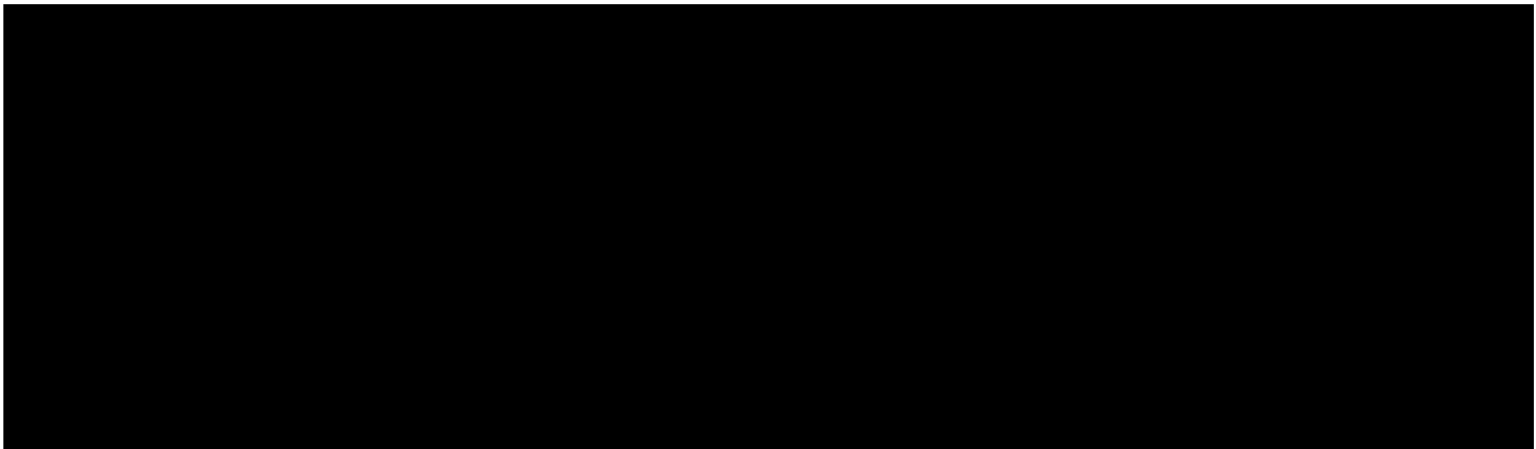
There's no way I can adequately express all that I've learned about myself - my fears and my wants. But I want to assure you that what took place between us will never be repeated and that I will continue to look for the end to my problems.

I would like to talk to you [REDACTED] - if that's what you want. I thought the letter would be a good way of getting said some of the things I have to try to explain - they're so very complicated. If it would be easier for you to call me with your schedule, I am usually in my room on and off all evening and almost always after 9:30 pm and I'm up til at least 11:30 each nite. Since my other duties prevent me from conducting this investigation personally, I hereby appoint **Ms. Leah McCluskey** to act as the investigator in this matter. In carrying out these duties, Ms. McCluskey will have all of the authority of an auditor, in accordance with cc. 1428 and 1717. She is to collect any additional proofs she deems necessary in accordance with the norm of law as they relate to the present allegation. She is delegated to take testimony from the accused and from any witnesses (cc. 1530 -- 1538 and 1547 -- 1573), to obtain any necessary documents (cc. 1540 -- 1546), to enlist the services of any experts deemed necessary (cc. 1574 -- 1581), and to have access to places or things which she deems necessary for her investigation.

In conducting her investigation, Ms. McCluskey is to take care that such an investigation does nothing to harm Mr. Job's name or to violate his right to protect his privacy.

After she has concluded her investigation, Ms. McCluskey is to make a written and oral report to the Professional Responsibility Review Board, no later than one hundred eighty days from the date of this appointment. This report is to address the facts, circumstances, and imputability concerning the alleged offense. This report is to be sent to me, along with the advice of the Review Board.

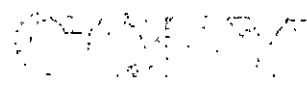



Victim ER was in elementary school at the time of the alleged abuse in the early 1970's.

PRA traveled to meet with [REDACTED] on February 9, 2007 at an agreed upon location so that he could review the final report of his allegation of sexual abuse against the former Rev. Thomas Job. [REDACTED] had informed PRA that he would prefer to meet in person to review and sign the final report as opposed to having the report sent to his home.

Upon [REDACTED] arrival, PRA provided him with a copy of the report written based upon the original December 21, 2006 meeting and his changes and additions. After reading through the report and writing in minor changes, [REDACTED] signed the final report of his allegation against Fr. Job.

[REDACTED] then asked PRA to explain to him what to expect from the process as it continues forward. PRA provided information and answered [REDACTED] questions regarding the Review Board process, including the Initial Review and Review for Cause. [REDACTED] informed PRA that he would prefer to meet in person to receive any letters from the Office of Professional Responsibility based upon Cardinal George's decisions made concerning this matter.

[REDACTED] He also informed PRA that he would like to know if Fr. Job denies the allegation. [REDACTED] PRA asked [REDACTED] to elaborate, and stated his assumption that if Fr. Job denies the allegation then the Review Board would automatically agree with the accused. PRA informed [REDACTED] of

the different backgrounds of the nine Review Board members as they are described in §1100 *Sexual Abuse of Minors: Policies for Education, Prevention, Assistance to Victims and Procedures for Determination of Fitness for Ministry*. PRA also informed [redacted] of the summary sheet of all accused that have matters before the Review Board.

[redacted] asked PRA what more information he could provide for the Review Board and added that he has given all of the information that knows [regarding his memories of the abuse by Fr. Job]. PRA responded by telling [redacted] that he can only be asked to provide the information that he remembers.

[redacted] thanked PRA for traveling to meet with him and for providing the explanations on the Review Board process. It was agreed that PRA would be in touch with [redacted] after his allegation is read to Fr. Job.

PRA did provide [redacted] with a copy of the report of his allegations against Fr. Job.




PRA received a return phone call from  on December 12, 2006 regarding his allegation of sexual misconduct against the former Rev. Thomas Job.

 began by expressing his surprise and appreciation for PRA's voice mail message to him regarding this matter. He stated that he was not expecting much from the Archdiocese of Chicago when he recently called St. John Vianney parish and spoke with the assigned Deacon.  stated that the deacon gave him the [incorrect] information that Fr. Job was deceased. PRA did inform  that Thomas Job is alive and that last year, one of the local newspapers [either the Chicago Sun-Times or the Chicago Tribune] printed the incorrect status of a handful of clerics who had substantiated allegations of sexual misconduct against them.  expressed his appreciation for the clarification and also stated that he was surprised to receive a phone call from Rev. Thomas Reformat, the current pastor of St. John Vianney, after he spoke with the deacon.

When asked,  agreed to PRA's request to verbally provide him with information concerning the Office of Professional Responsibility as well as the Office of Assistance Ministry. After listening to PRA's descriptions of the offices,  agreed to schedule a meeting so that he could formalize his allegation against Fr. Job.

 expressed to PRA that he has never told anyone of the abuse by Fr. Job, not even his family.

[REDACTED] He stated that he has recently begun to remember the CCD classes he participated in at St. John Vianney, where they took place at the parish, and the color of Fr. Job's car. [REDACTED] then stated, "[REDACTED] can remember exactly what happened in the [REDACTED] office [with Fr. Job]." He informed PRA that he wants to move on with his life.

During the December 12th phone conversation, [REDACTED] stated that he graduated from St. John Vianney in 1973 and is now 48 years old. [REDACTED] named other altar servers and friends of his from his time at St. John Vianney: [REDACTED]. When [REDACTED] informed PRA that he has never spoken to anyone about the abuse by Fr. Job, he identified [REDACTED] as his best friend at the time. [REDACTED]

It was agreed that [REDACTED] would meet with PRA and a representative from the Office of Assistance Ministry on Thursday, December 21, 2006 at [REDACTED] located in [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] lives in [REDACTED] but indicated that he would be in [REDACTED] that day for business. He mentioned to PRA that he presently works for [REDACTED] and is responsible for several stores, which causes him to travel.

This abstract replaces the summary prepared by Leah McCluskey, Professional Responsibility Administrator for the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Professional Responsibility, of Victim EU's statement, given to Ms. McCluskey on July 7, 2004, formalizing his allegation of abuse against Rev. Thomas Job. The alleged abuse consisted of Fr. Job providing Victim EU with alcohol, as well as incidents of hugging, kissing, fondling, and mutual oral sex. The alleged abuse took place at St. John Vianney parish. Fr. Job would also sleep in the same bed as and shower with Victim EU. The alleged abuse began when Victim EU was in third or fourth grade and continued until he was in seventh grade in approximately 1969-1973. Victim EU stated that he reported the abuse to the principal of St. John Vianney in 1972 or 1973, and that he recalls that another person raised questions about Fr. Job's conduct with children just prior to his transfer to St. Cletus in 1976.

I proceeded by reading the report of  allegation against Mr. Job in its entirety.



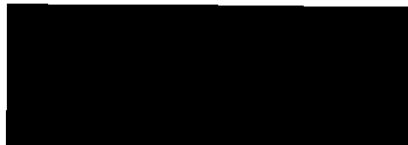

This memorandum identifies a potential public relations issue for the seminary in the up-coming Village of Mundelein Centennial celebrations. [redacted] has written a book with contains some narrations of sexual misconduct by former Chicago clergy, one such incident occurring on the USML campus. Let me narrate how the book came to me and what recommendations I have for addressing its content.

This morning the director of the Fort Hill Historical Society called to tell me that a local resident of Mundelein had written a book about his family which had a lot of material about the seminary in it. She said that he wanted to meet me present me with a copy of the book. I told her to have him stop by today. I met [redacted] in the Office of the Provost and he presented me with a copy of his book [redacted]. We spent some time talking and he related his great love for the seminary, his admiration of Cardinal Mundelein and how much this place played a role in his life growing up at Santa Maria del Popolo and [redacted] High School.

This is [redacted] first book. By profession he [redacted]. Previously he worked at [redacted]. It is very personal account, with lots of local people names and events related.

[redacted] gave me the book which had three sections highlighted. He told me that he wanted to bring them to my attention, as not everything he has to say about the Catholic Church is nice. He then mentioned that the Rev. Thomas Job had been assigned to Santa Maria as a deacon and that his family was very close friends of the Rev. [redacted]. I asked him if they or any other priest had hurt him or acted inappropriately. He said no, he never felt that way. He told me that he writes in the book that looking back; he could remember them hugging him a little too tight, but that no, he was not abused.

He went on to tell me again, how much he loves the seminary and that he is so pleased that his book came out right now, for the Village of Mundelein centennial. There will be a public book signing at the Fremont Library and later a private one at Park Street Inn. I thanked him and told him I would read the book.

I read the sections which he had marked in detail today, and found that there are some unfortunate stories regarding Deacon Job bringing students swimming in our gymnasium. Also, there is a fairly detailed narrative of inappropriate behavior by Thomas Job to him, which contradicts his claim to me that nothing inappropriate happened to him. (Page 238-239). Later in the final chapter, he notes that Cardinal Mundelein would have been "deeply saddened to learn that his institution became the center of a scandal that rocks the Archdiocese of Chicago and served as a breeding ground and safe-harbor for dozens of pedophile priests." (Page 285) He goes on in the conclusion to briefly rehearse his relations with Deacon Thomas Job and Fr [REDACTED]. [These pages are attached to this memorandum].

Since I have not read the whole book, I can only base my comments on the short visit of the author and the sections of the book which he pointed out to me. I did not pick up any ill will. On the contrary, he spoke only with esteem of the seminary. That said, the quotations, either in the context of his story or just as standalone quotes will be very negative for the seminary's public image.

I think we should bring this matter to the attention of Jimmy Lago and Colleen Dolan, and seek their advice concerning possible response scenarios.

On May 19, 2009, I received a phone call from [REDACTED] in response to my May 7, 2009 e-mail to him. This office was notified of [REDACTED] alleged sexual abuse by the former Rev. Thomas Job on April 3, 2009 when Rev. Thomas Baima forwarded a copy of [REDACTED] book, [REDACTED] where [REDACTED] wrote of the abuse.

During our phone conversation on May 19th, [REDACTED] said that he had received my May 7th e-mail and understood my reasons for contacting him. When asked, [REDACTED] agreed to me providing him with a verbal overview of this office, the Review Board process, and the Office of Assistance Ministry. [REDACTED] noted that he was on the Archdiocese of Chicago's website while on the phone with me and I was able to direct him to the information pertaining to this office and Assistance Ministry.

After providing [REDACTED] with the aforementioned information, he said that he "doesn't feel anything can come of this at this point," that it (the alleged abuse) "happened many years ago" and that he knows that Fr. Job is out of ministry now.

[REDACTED] shared that since publishing his book, he has been contacted by other individuals who had read his book and told him that they had "similar experiences" with Fr. Job. I suggested to [REDACTED] that if he is comfortable and feels it is appropriate, if he ever speaks with anyone again who says that they had such experiences with Fr. Job, to feel free to provide them with my name and contact information.

[REDACTED] expressed his appreciation for the e-mail and the information on this office and Assistance Ministry, but that he was not interested in meeting or taking advantage of any type of outreach through Assistance Ministry. I again thanked [REDACTED]

██████████ for the phone call and invited him to contact this office and/or Assistance Ministry at any time in the future if he wished.

As a result of my conversation with ██████████ I am making this matter inactive in this office.

Victim Statement Abstract

This abstract replaces the summary prepared by Leah McCluskey, Professional Responsibility Administrator for the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Professional Responsibility, of Victim EX's statement, given to Ms. McCluskey on April 24, 2008, formalizing his allegation of abuse against Rev. Thomas Job. The alleged abuse consisted of several incidents of Fr. Job hugging and fondling Victim EX. The alleged abuse occurred at the Santa Maria Del Popolo rectory and school, as well as in Fr. Job's car. Victim EX was approximately 11 or 12 at the time of the alleged abuse began in approximately 1970. Victim EX estimated that he was abused approximately 20 times by Fr. Job between 1970 and 1971, and the abuse continued until Fr. Job left Santa Maria Del Popolo parish.

Victim Statement Abstract

This abstract replaces the transcript of Victim EY's statement, given to Leah McCluskey, Director of the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review, on September 7, 2012, formalizing his allegation of abuse against Rev. Thomas Job. The alleged abuse consisted of hugging, fondling and discussions about masturbation. The alleged abuse occurred on multiple occasions and took place at the St. John Vianney parish school and church. Victim EY was between sixth and eighth grade and an altar boy at the time of the alleged abuse between approximately 1974 and 1977. Victim EY also stated that the abuse was reported to the pastor of St. John Vianney and to the Northlake Police sometime in either 7th or 8th grade.

Ex-Lake County employee gets jail, huge fine in theft case

A former "trusted employee" of the Lake County Health Department, who admitted creating a system in which he and another worker collected tens of thousands of dollars in pay they did not earn, was sentenced to a year in jail Wednesday.

Thomas Job, 67, of Spring Grove, was also ordered to pay \$39,875 in restitution and, in a rare occurrence in Lake County criminal cases, was ordered to pay the maximum \$25,000 fine

Job, who served as the rehabilitation coordinator for the department's addiction treatment program, pleaded guilty to felony theft Feb. 15

Officials said Job and Richard Morelli, the detoxification coordinator for the same program, manipulated a computerized time keeping system in order to collect pay for hours they did not work.

Morelli, who has pleaded not guilty to theft and official misconduct charges in the case, testified Wednesday he and Job had offices at opposite ends of a floor of the department's headquarters in Waukegan

Morelli said he and Job decided that either one of them could do the job of running the addictions program they were both paid to supervise

"A plan was implemented to take time off," Morelli said. "The first person in (at the office) would sign us both in."

Morelli said he would frequently show up first, then when Job would arrive at the office hours later, he would go home

Officials said the scheme was in play for close to two years when a health department internal investigation discovered the manipulations in late 2009 and police were called

Morelli said the computer that kept track of the swipe cards employees used to enter and leave the building was kept in Job's office, and Job was the architect of the scheme

A total of \$86,494 was taken, officials said, with Morelli collecting \$46,619 and Job getting \$39,875.

Morelli, 60, of Highland Park, is due in court Aug. 1 and said Wednesday he has not entered into any negotiation with prosecutors for benefit for his testimony against Job

However, under cross-examination by Job's attorney Michael Solock, Morelli admitted prosecutors have not moved to revoke his bond in the theft case based on his April 30 arrest for DUI and marijuana possession.

In most cases, when a person on bond in one felony charge is charged with another offense, prosecutors ask a judge to revoke or raise the original bond because of the new offense.

It was also revealed that Job was a Roman Catholic priest in the Archdiocese of Chicago from 1970 until 1992, when he resigned

Marc Hansen, an investigator for the Lake County state s attorney's office, said Job was one of 14 priests named in a 2005 settlement of a lawsuit filed by 24 adults who claimed they had been sexually molested as children

Solock said the allegations in the lawsuit were "hearsay and innuendo" and that his client had made no admissions regarding the lawsuit

Assistant State's Attorney Christen Bishop asked Associate Judge George Bridges to impose a sentence of five years in prison, while Solock asked for probation

Bridges said he was most interested in "making Lake County whole" from the theft and ordered the restitution and levied the fine

He said Job will be in jail when not working, receiving medical or psychological care or performing the 150 public service hours that are a part of his sentence

Bridges told Job he believed his training as a priest should have kicked in at some point during the theft

"It begs the question of how a priest or former priest could get involved in something like this and not have your teachings screaming at you," Bridges said "You should have heard your good conscience telling you it was wrong"

According to the Postal Service documentation that we received, on Wednesday, June 14, 2010, Thomas J. Job received the canonical notification of his return to the lay state, that is his laicization. The letter informing him of his laicization also asked that by July 6, 2010 he contact either me or Deacon Dan Welter to sign the decree of laicization; he never contacted us.

Pursuant to that:

1. Both original copies of the Decree will be signed by Cardinal George and notarized by Jimmy Lago.
2. One original will be returned to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and the other original will be filed in Thomas Job's Chancery file.
3. Access to the signed original of the Rescript in his Chancery file should be done through the Chancellor.
4. The effective date of the laicization is June 14, 2010, the date that he signed the receipt for the certified letter of notification.
5. In accord with Canons 535, §2 and 1054, a request has been sent to the parish of his baptism asking that the entry that records his baptism now also note his return to the lay state and his release from all the corresponding obligations, including that of celibacy. The parish has been instructed that whenever a certificate attesting to his baptism is issued, there is not to be any mention of his ordination as a Deacon and a Priest, not should there be any mention of the obligation of celibacy.
6. Any inquiries about his return to the lay state should be referred to the Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago. In the letter to his parish of Baptism, it was requested that this also should be noted in his baptismal entry.

Victim Statement Abstract

This abstract replaces Victim EZ's statement of his relationship with Rev. Thomas Job, as described by Victim EZ in a book he authored, published in 2009. Per Victim EZ, the abuse consisted of then-Deacon Job encouraging Victim EZ to go swim with Job, wearing only his underwear, and after swimming, Job pulling a naked Victim EZ onto his knee. Victim EZ also stated that he and other altar servers would accompany Fr. Job to the seminary to use the gym and pool facilities. At these times, Fr. Job would tell the boys that swimsuits were optional, and supervised the minors changing in the locker room.

I have spoken with many of you about this already and will circulate a complete memorandum on Monday morning.

I received a call this afternoon from Frs. Lyle and Baima regarding an author local to the Mundelein area whom Fr. Baima met with. Frs. Lyle and Baima informed me that they had initially spoken with Fr. Canary about this matter, who then suggested that they call me [thank you Fr. Canary].

A man by the name of [REDACTED] wrote a book entitled, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was an altar server at Santa Maria del Popolo during the time Thomas Job served as a deacon there.

[REDACTED] requested to meet with Fr. Baima and present him with a copy of the book--both of which he did. [REDACTED] told Fr. Baima of being an altar server while Job was at Santa Maria and also that Fr. [REDACTED] was a close friend of the [REDACTED] family. Hearing this, Fr. Baima asked [REDACTED] if either of these men hurt him. [REDACTED] said that they did not--only hugging him "a little too tight" on occasion, but that neither Job nor [REDACTED] abused him.

After meeting with [REDACTED] Fr. Baima turned to the pages of the book which [REDACTED] had marked. These pages included two narratives about Tom Job--one of Tom Job taking [REDACTED] and others to swim in Mundelein Seminary's pool naked and another where Job took [REDACTED] alone to a home where the two swam in their underwear [and after swimming in the pool, Job sat [REDACTED] on his lap and talked to him about it being okay to be naked].

Fr. Baima has written up and faxed to me already a memorandum of his meeting with [REDACTED] which included attachments of the pages that [REDACTED] had marked for him. I have also asked Fr. Baima to send me the book so that I could read the rest.

I will open a Job/[REDACTED] file on Monday and circulate a memo with Fr. Baima's memo attached. I will also write a letter to [REDACTED]

Our investigation revealed credible corroboration or supporting facts to support the allegations of [REDACTED]. Questions remain regarding clarification of specific facts as presented by [REDACTED]. However, independent witnesses support many of the factual aspects surrounding these allegations.

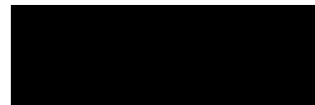
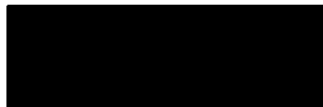

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On July 14, 2008, Hillard Heintze received a request from the Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review for investigative assistance in the matter of Thomas Job, a resigned priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago. Specifically, we were asked to assist in learning more about the background of the accuser [REDACTED] a 50-year old male subject, who alleged he was sexually assaulted repeatedly by Job over a year period. Also, we were asked to locate and conduct interviews of persons familiar with various aspects of these allegations. According to the formal allegation presented by [REDACTED] he was assaulted by Job on approximately twenty different occasions during 1970 while Job served at Santa Maria Del Popolo Parish (SMDP).

Hillard Heintze conducted the requested background investigation of [REDACTED]. This investigation found no federal, state or local records pertaining to criminal history, civil litigation, bankruptcy, liens or judgments. There was no derogatory information revealed about [REDACTED] from the proprietary databases searched.

Several interviews of former SMDP teachers, school officials and priests who served at SMDP during the time period in question were interviewed. Fr. Thomas Franzman, a close friend of Thomas Job, was also interviewed. Fr. Franzman provided insight and corroborated certain portions of the statements made by the accuser.

The interviews conducted by Investigator Everett revealed significant agreement with the formal statements of [REDACTED]. However, each of the interviewees expressed positive remarks about Job, indicating they had never observed Job act inappropriately around children. Although one person interviewed, Fr. John Tapper, stated he had doubts about Job due to the amount of time he spent around minor children, but also stated he had never seen Job act inappropriately.

In addition to the actions requested, Hillard Heintze conducted an on-site visit of Santa Maria Del Popolo School located at 126 N. Lake St., Mundelein, IL 60060 to view an area described by [REDACTED] as a supply room in his allegation of April 24, 2008. Several supply rooms were located and documented throughout the school buildings, but all were reported to be locked during the time period of these allegations and only teachers had keys to access them.

Due to the corroboration established through interviews and the physical inspection of areas described in the allegations, the occurrence of these allegations is highly probably with some degree of fact enhancement by the accuser.



CASE REFERRAL TO HILLARD HEINTZE

On July 14, 2008, Director Leah McCluskey, Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review, referred the matter of resigned priest Thomas Job to Hillard Heintze for further investigation. Specifically, we were requested to:

- Conduct a background check on the accuser, [REDACTED]
- Speak with Rev. John Tapper, one of possibly two individuals still alive who were assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo during the time period of the alleged abuse; also specifically ask Fr. Tapper if he recalled who from the seminary may have provided supply work to Santa Maria Del Popolo during the time of the alleged abuse
- Determine if Rev. [REDACTED] is alive and speak with him [according to Rev. Daniel Smilanic, [REDACTED] is either resigned from the priesthood or is deceased]
- Determine if any teachers, religious, etc. could be located who may have been assigned to or working at Santa Maria Del Popolo at the time of the alleged abuse

On July 15, 2008, Harvey Radney, Hillard Heintze Senior Vice President, contacted Ms. McCluskey to discuss additional investigative procedures related to the investigation of this matter.

On July 17, 2008, Radney assigned Investigator Daniel Everett the primary responsibility of conducting the follow up investigation.

DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION

Case Review

Beginning on July 14, 2008, Arnette Heintze, Harvey Radney and Investigative Associate Jim Molloy initiated a comprehensive case review of resigned priest Thomas Job's investigative file provided by the Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review. This file included [REDACTED] allegations and documents of prior allegations of abuse against Job.

Specifically, the allegations of [REDACTED] stated he was inappropriately touched by Fr. Job during the early 1970s over a period of one year while [REDACTED] was a student at Santa Maria Del Popolo School in Mundelein, IL. [REDACTED] alleged there were approximately 20 instances of abuse which occurred in the rectory, in a supply closet at the school and in Job's vehicle.

Interviews

Starting on August 4, 2008, Hillard Heintze Investigator Daniel Everett conducted the following interviews:



August 4, 2008 – Interview of Sr. [REDACTED]

Sr. [REDACTED], who formerly taught at SMDP, was interviewed but could not recall knowing a priest or deacon with a name of Job. Sr. [REDACTED] stated she could not be of further assistance in this investigation. **Attachment #1**

August 4, 2008 – Interview of Fr. John Tapper

Fr. Tapper stated Job was already assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo when he arrived in June of 1970 and had very little contact with him. He recalled Job as a pompous person who thought very highly of himself. Fr. Tapper stated he recalled Job escorting three altar boys on a vacation to [REDACTED] but could only recall the name of one, [REDACTED]. Fr. Tapper stated he had never seen Job act inappropriately around children but felt something was not right about his relationship with the three altar boys. **Attachment #2**

August 6, 2008 – Interview of Sr. [REDACTED]

Sr. Grace was assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo from 1966 through 1990 serving as a teacher and principal. Sr. Grace recalled Job as a tall, good-looking man but could not recall much else about him. She could not recall what Job's duties and responsibilities were in the parish and did not recall him having much interaction with the school. Sister [REDACTED] recalled the physical layout of the school buildings to the best of her memory. Further, she did not recall any seminarians performing duties at the school. **Attachment #3**

August 6, 2008 – Interview of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], a resigned archdiocesan priest who served as an associate pastor at Santa Maria Del Popolo from 1962 through 1970, stated he remembers Job rather well as he served as a deacon during [REDACTED]'s last year at SMDP. [REDACTED] recalled Job resisting assignment to another parish when he was ordained. [REDACTED] stated he did not recall Job spending any time with children of the parish and never heard of Job acting inappropriately around children. [REDACTED] stated he sold Job his old Chrysler vehicle but could not recall the color of the vehicle. [REDACTED] remembered the school building but could not recall if there were supply rooms in the building. **Attachment #4**

August 8, 2008 – Interview of Fr. Thomas Franzman

Fr. Franzman stated he has known Job for many years having first met Job when they graduated from high school together. Fr. Franzman stated Job was assigned as a deacon at SMDP for six months before becoming ordained. His duties included teaching religion, conducting baptisms and working with the altar servers. Fr. Franzman did not witness any appropriate behavior by Job with children and never knew him to be alone with one or two children. Fr. Franzman felt Job's relationship with children was normal. Fr. Franzman stated he and Job bought a cottage together in the [REDACTED] area which they still own. Fr. Franzman stated Job would bring groups of children to the cottage. Fr. Franzman recalled a conversation with Job a short time ago where Job apologized if he caused Fr. Franzman any embarrassment from the allegations of inappropriate conduct being raised against him. **Attachment #5**





August 13, 2008 – Interview of Sister [REDACTED]

Sister [REDACTED] taught at Santa Maria Del Popolo School from 1969 through 1986. She recalled Job being assigned to the parish as a deacon and believed his duties consisted of working with the altar servers and teaching religion classes. She remembered parishioners and children in the parish being fond of Job and never witnessed Job act inappropriately with children. Sister [REDACTED] could not recall the physical layout of the rectory, nor the type of vehicle Job may have driven during this period. Sister [REDACTED] did recall supply rooms located in the school building but stated they remained locked at all times with teachers having keys. She did not recall priests having keys to these supply rooms.

Attachment #6

August 13, 2008 – Interview of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], a retired teacher from Santa Maria Del Popolo School, taught at the school from 1963 through 1981. She is currently a substitute teacher at the school. [REDACTED] recalled Job being assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo Parish and believed his duties included working with the altar servers and teaching religion to the students. She also remembered Job presiding over Sunday masses and giving excellent sermons. [REDACTED] described Job as very friendly man to everyone he came across and recalled children always flocking to him. [REDACTED] could not describe the rectory living quarters stating she had never been on the second floor of the rectory. She did however remember a large supply room in the school building that was always locked. [REDACTED] stated all teachers had keys for this room but she did not know who else might have had keys. [REDACTED] never heard of Job acting inappropriately around children. **Attachment #7**

August 19, 2008 – Interview of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was employed as a teacher and principal at Santa Maria Del Popolo during the period of these allegations. Mr. [REDACTED], when contacted, stated he had recently suffered a loss in his family and would not be willing or available to be interviewed regarding this matter. **Attachment #8**

August 19, 2008 – Attempted Contact of Sister [REDACTED]

Contact was attempted with another former teacher, Sister [REDACTED]. The phone number provided and listed for Sister [REDACTED] was discovered to be a non-working number. **Attachment #8**

Surveillance

None conducted in this investigation.





Research and Site Visits

On August 12, 2008, at 12:00 p.m., Investigator Everett conducted an on-site inspection of Santa Maria Del Popolo School in Mundelein, IL. Upon arriving at the school, the investigator was met by the school secretary who identified herself as Cathy Petrocelly. The investigator had previously contacted Ms. Petrocelly and scheduled the school visit to visually inspect any storage rooms located within the school property. Ms. Petrocelly informed the investigator that Santa Maria School had used two different buildings for their classrooms for many years. She stated as of September 2008, all school classrooms were located in the building at 126 N. Lake Street which is the main school building.

Ms. Petrocelly escorted the investigator to the school building located at 40 N. Seymour Ave. This building is located directly across the street from the main school building and is in the lower level of Santa Maria Del Popolo Church. Ms. Petrocelly conferred with other teachers present at the school and the general consensus was that in the late 1960's and early 1970's the upper classes, grades 7 and 8, would have been located in the church building.

While touring the church/school building, the investigator observed a storage room next to the school kitchen. This room was approximately 20'x20' in size. This room contained miscellaneous school and church supplies. The investigator was then shown a closet/storage room next to the school office. This room was also found to be approximately 20'x20' in size and also contained miscellaneous school and church items. The investigator was then shown a third supply room which was located near the entrance of the building. This room also appeared to be approximately 20'x20' and is currently used as a janitor's closet containing several janitorial items. The investigator then observed a larger storage room located near the boy's and girl's bathrooms. This room was larger, approximately 40'x40'.

The investigator learned that nine classrooms are located on this garden level floor. None of the above-mentioned storage rooms are accessible from the classrooms. The investigator observed that all of the storage rooms were locked and required a key to be opened.

Ms. Petrocelly escorted the investigator back to the main school building located at 126 N. Lake Street. The investigator was shown a small room on the first floor used as a Religious Education room in the school. This room was located across from the chapel and appeared to be approximately 15'x40' in size. Ms. Petrocelly believed this room was a storage room at one time. The investigator was next shown a much larger storage room located on the second floor of the school building. This room was approximately 60'x60' in size, and had several school items stored inside. The investigator was next shown a small janitor's closet located on the second floor. This room was approximately 10'x6' in size. Miscellaneous janitorial items were stored in this room.

The investigator was then shown two additional storage rooms on the second floor. The first was approximately 80'x8' in size. The second was a very large attic-type room which was used to store larger items. Again, none of these storage rooms were accessible from the classrooms. The investigator also observed much of the land surrounding the Santa Maria





Del Popolo School and Church is a parking lot and very possibly could have been used as a play lot area for the school children. |

Ms. Petrocelli informed the investigator there is a woman, [REDACTED], who periodically fills in as a substitute teacher. [REDACTED] taught at Santa Maria Del Popolo School full-time for many years in the 1960's and 1970's. Ms. Petrocelli felt [REDACTED] could be much more specific regarding the layout of the two school buildings as they existed in the 1960's and 1970's.



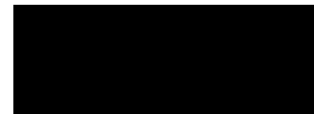

KEY FINDINGS

FINDING #1

Allegation Statement: [REDACTED] stated in his allegation his first recollection of “weirdness” by Fr. Job was when he was 11 or 12 years old. He spoke of Fr. Job taking him upstairs in the rectory into an office-type room where Fr. Job would hug him from behind and put his hands down and under his pants. [REDACTED] stated he felt petrified. Later in his statement, [REDACTED] estimated the abuse began in about 1970 when he was in the 7th grade.

Supporting Fact: Although [REDACTED] provides conflicting statements regarding Job’s first contact with him, Job was assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo between December 1969 and May 1970, when [REDACTED] was in 7th grade and 12 years old. Job was ordained and transferred to St. John (Baptist) Vianney following his ordination. The approximate time frame presented by [REDACTED] is supported by the narrow period Job was present at SMDP.

FINDING #2

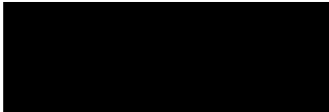
Allegation Statement: [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] He further stated the abuse occurred while he was in the seventh grade, when Job would come to his class and tell the teacher he would need his help. Job would then take [REDACTED] to the closet where the supplies were kept.

Conflicting Statement: According to [REDACTED] date of birth, he would have been a first grade student in approximately 1963. Further, the 1st grade and 7th grade classrooms are housed in separate buildings. [REDACTED] stated in his allegation the first instance of abuse occurred when he was 11-12 years old (1968-69). [REDACTED] stated there were approximately twenty instances of abuse over a period of one year which is in conflict with the length of time Job was actually assigned to SMDP.

FINDING #3

Allegation Statement: [REDACTED] made the following statements which were supported by interviews or other independent means:

- **Job would take [REDACTED] and other altar boys bowling at Mundelein lanes.**
Fr. Thomas Franzman, a close personal friend of Thomas Job, stated Job would bring young people to the seminary in Mundelein to bowl and use other facilities such as the basketball and baseball facilities.
- **[REDACTED] stated the abuse by Job took place in the rectory (on the second floor in an office-type room), the supply closet and in Job’s car.**
Sister [REDACTED] stated she did not recall an office on the second floor of the rectory but did remember a copying machine being located in one of the





rooms. This fact was also stated by [REDACTED]. This creates the possibility that a 12-13 year old might describe as an "office-type" room, one in which a copying machine was located. [REDACTED] also stated Job stayed in the rectory with Monsignor Meegan when he was not at the seminary in Mundelein, while other priests, including [REDACTED], lived in another building which was owned by the church and located a short distance from the main rectory. Investigator Everett, during a site visit to SMDP, noted several supply rooms and janitor's closets located throughout the school buildings which supported [REDACTED] recall. [REDACTED] stated he sold Job his Chrysler automobile, but could not recall the color of the vehicle. [REDACTED] described Job's vehicle as maroon in color. While the fact was established Job did own a vehicle, none of the persons interviewed could recall the color.

FINDING #4

Two attempts, through two separate sources, to locate the SMDP school records for [REDACTED] [REDACTED] have been made. At this time, we have been unable to verify his attendance at Santa Maria Del Popolo.

CONCLUSIONS

In his allegation statement of April 24, 2008, [REDACTED] presents statements as fact which are either confirmed or partially corroborated by witnesses interviewed by the investigator in this case. The timeframe of when the incidents occurred are supported by the narrow window of Job's presence at SMDP. Descriptions of the rectory, the school and activities of Job's interaction with children of the parish provided by [REDACTED] in conjunction with the allegation timeframe, are also consistent. There remain areas which appear to be a lack of recall or outright enhancement of facts by the accuser. This does not impugn the possibility that the inappropriate activity did occur.

After several attempts to contact Sister [REDACTED] via telephone, on August 4, 2008, Investigator Everett received a return telephone call from Sister [REDACTED]. The investigator identified himself and explained the reason for his previous phone calls. Investigator Everett explained to Sister [REDACTED] he was hoping to speak with her regarding allegations of inappropriate behavior by a deacon at Santa Maria Del Popolo School sometime around 1970. Sister [REDACTED] was informed these allegations involved a resigned priest, Thomas Job. Sister [REDACTED] appeared to be very reluctant and hesitant to cooperate with the investigator.

Sister [REDACTED] informed the investigator she had been assigned to SMDP for a very short period of time and did not recall any priest by the name of Thomas Job. Sister [REDACTED] informed the investigator she would not be of any assistance regarding this matter. Sister [REDACTED] informed the investigator she was leaving for vacation and would not be available for any further questioning for the next few weeks.

The investigator thanked Sister [REDACTED] for her time and concluded the interview.



ATTACHMENT #2: INTERVIEW OF FR. JOHN TAPPER

On August 3, 2008, at 3:00 p.m., Investigator Everett conducted a face-to-face interview with Fr. John Tapper. Fr. John Tapper is a retired Diocesan priest living at the [REDACTED], [REDACTED]. Fr. Tapper was informed the purpose of the interview was to obtain information regarding a confidential investigation of inappropriate behavior by a deacon involving minor children at Santa Maria Del Popolo.

Investigator Everett informed Fr. John Tapper the focus of this investigation was Thomas Job who was assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo as a Deacon in the early 1970's. Fr. Tapper stated he was ordained as a priest in 1961. He was assigned as an associate pastor from June 1970 until sometime in 1974. Fr. Tapper stated Job had already been working at SMDP as a Deacon when he arrived. Fr. Tapper recalled Job had been ordained as a priest some time in 1970. Fr. Tapper recalled Job being assigned to St. John Baptist Vianney in Northlake, IL after being ordained but was very reluctant to leave SMDP.

Fr. Tapper stated he did not live in the rectory at SMDP. He lived in another residence a short distance away. Fr. Tapper stated he had very little contact with Job during his stay there. Fr. Tapper recalled Thomas Franzman being a very good friend of Job and believes Thomas Franzman is currently an active priest with the Chicago Archdiocese. Fr. Tapper recalled Job as a "pompous" person who thought highly of himself. Job's primary responsibility was running the altar servers program. Fr. Tapper recalled Job taking three altar boys to [REDACTED] on a summer vacation. Fr. Tapper could not recall the names of two of the boys, but did recall one of the boys was [REDACTED]. Fr. Tapper could not recall when this travel took place. When questioned further, Fr. Tapper stated this was not a religious retreat but instead just a vacation to [REDACTED]. Fr. Tapper also recalled Job spent a good deal of time with the three boys, and always remembered [REDACTED] being very nervous when Fr. Tapper gave him instructions on various chores he had to do around the rectory. Fr. Tapper stated he felt something was not right about this situation. Fr. Tapper recalled seeing the three boys consistently being called to serve as altar boys for the more important masses, such as funerals and weddings. According to Fr. Tapper, many of the altar boys had various jobs in the parish. Fr. Tapper at this time, made it



perfectly clear he had never seen Job acting inappropriately around any minor children, but always had his doubts about Job since he spent so much time around these three altar boys. Fr. Tapper stated he never observed Job showing any excessive affection toward any minor children.

The investigator then questioned Fr. Tapper about his recollection of the church rectory at SMDP. Again, Fr. Tapper stated he did not live in the rectory, but was able to recall the rectory had been demolished some time ago. Fr. Tapper remembered the rectory had an office on the first floor. He recalled a bathroom and two or three bedrooms on the second floor. Fr. Tapper stated it was very common for children of the parish to spend time in the rectory. Fr. Tapper stated Monsignor Meegan had recruited many of the students to work in the rectory. The majority of these students were male according to Fr. Tapper.

Fr. Tapper recalled one family by the name of [REDACTED]. A few of the boys in the family, along with their sister [REDACTED], worked in the rectory. [REDACTED] owned and operated a [REDACTED] in the area. Fr. Tapper thought the [REDACTED] family was close friends with Job.

The investigator then questioned Fr. Tapper regarding the physical description of Santa Maria Del Popolo School. He stated although he had been in the school on many occasions while working at SMDP, he could not describe the school building. Fr. Tapper was not able to recall any information on a supply room at the school.

Fr. Tapper stated Fr. Thomas Franzman and Fr. [REDACTED] knew Job rather well, and thought they may have additional information to assist the investigator.

Fr. Tapper recalled a friend by the name of [REDACTED] told him several years ago that Job had acted in an unofficial capacity as an administrator at St. Peter Damian Parish in Bartlett, IL. Job's parents lived in the parish. Job had volunteered his services at St. Peter's while he was still enrolled in the seminary. According to [REDACTED] Job had propositioned [REDACTED] son for some type of sexual act. [REDACTED] informed Fr. Tapper his son rejected Job's proposition and that was the end of it. This incident allegedly occurred sometime in the late 1960's.

When asked, Fr. Tapper stated he did not recall what type or color vehicle Job drove while assigned to SMDP.

The investigator then asked Fr. Tapper if he had any additional information to share. Fr. Tapper stated he did not and the interview was concluded.

On August 6, 2008, at 11:00 a.m., Investigator Everett conducted a face-to-face interview with Sister [REDACTED], a Dominican sister currently assigned as the Administrator of Finance at St. Paul the Apostle Parish, [REDACTED]. Sister [REDACTED] was informed the purpose of the interview was to obtain information regarding a confidential investigation of inappropriate behavior by a deacon at Santa Maria Del Popolo. This interview took place in the business office at St. Paul the Apostle.

Investigator Everett informed Sister [REDACTED] the person named in these allegations was Thomas Job who was assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo as a deacon in the early 1970's. Sister [REDACTED] told the investigator she had spent a great deal of time at SMDP. She was assigned there from 1966 until 1990 serving as principal from 1969 through 1990. Sister [REDACTED] recalled meeting Thomas Job sometime in the summer of 1969. She recalls him being a deacon at the parish when they met. Sister [REDACTED] remembered Job as a tall, good-looking man, but she did not remember much else about him. Sister [REDACTED] could not recall what his duties and responsibilities were in the parish. Sister [REDACTED] did not think he had much interaction with the school. Sister [REDACTED] stated Monsignor Meegan was in charge of the parish at that time, and he was the person with whom she had close contact. Sister [REDACTED] did not recall any negative comments ever being made about Job and stated she had no reason to believe his reputation at the parish was anything but good. Sister [REDACTED] was never aware of Job doing anything wrong. When questioned, Sister [REDACTED] stated she had never heard of Job taking any boys on any types of trips. Sister [REDACTED] recalled Fr. John Tapper was the priest more involved with the altar boys.

Investigator Everett questioned Sister [REDACTED] as to whether she was familiar with the parish rectory. She stated Monsignor Meegan resided in the main rectory. The main rectory had all of the offices located on the first floor. Monsignor Meegan's living quarters were on the second floor. Sister [REDACTED] does not recall an office being on the second floor, but did remember the copying machine was located there. Sister [REDACTED] stated there was a second residence where some of the priests lived, but she was not sure if it was ever considered to be a rectory. Sister [REDACTED] did not know in which building Job





resided but added both buildings had since been demolished. Sister [REDACTED] did not recall seeing children in the rectory unless they were accompanied by their parents.

When asked about the layout of SMDP, Sister [REDACTED] stated there are two school buildings. The main building was located at 126 Lake Street. She stated there was a book room located on the second floor which was called the "attic section." When asked about a supply room, Sister [REDACTED] stated all of the supplies were maintained in the school office which was located on the first floor. Sister [REDACTED] stated the 8th grade class was located on the first floor, and the 7th grade class was located on the garden level floor, where there was no supply room. Sister [REDACTED] then described the secondary school building which was located beneath a small chapel. This building consisted of ten classrooms for the 4th, 5th and 6th grades. On the first floor there was a supply room, near the 6th grade classrooms. Sister [REDACTED] did not recall any seminarians coming to SMDP to perform any functions, although she could not state whether or not they might have gone to the church to perform various functions.

Sister [REDACTED] informed the investigator of two former teachers who may be of assistance in this investigation - [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

The investigator asked Sister [REDACTED] if she had any additional information she would like to add. She did not. The investigator thanked her for her assistance. The interview was then concluded.





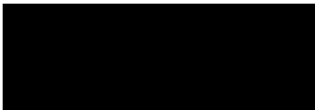

On August 6, 2008, at 8:00 p.m., Investigator Everett conducted a face-to-face interview with Mr. [REDACTED], a resigned priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago. [REDACTED] is currently living at [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] was informed the purpose of the interview was to obtain information regarding a confidential investigation of inappropriate behavior involving a deacon at Santa Maria Del Popolo. This interview took place at the residence of [REDACTED].

Investigator Everett informed [REDACTED] the person named in these allegations was Thomas Job who was assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo as a deacon in the early 1970's. [REDACTED] informed the investigator he remembered Job rather well. [REDACTED] served as an associate pastor at SMDP Parish from June 1962 through June 1970. He stated Job served as a deacon at the church during [REDACTED]'s last year at SMDP. Mr. [REDACTED] recalled Job was ordained sometime in 1970 and then transferred to St. John Baptist in Northlake, IL. Wilken remembered Job was reluctant to leave SMDP and made several efforts to stay there after being ordained.

When questioned about Job's duties and responsibilities as a deacon in the parish, [REDACTED] appeared to be vague as to what Job's duties were. [REDACTED] stated he had Job help him with several menial tasks such as printing the church bulletins and basically helping the priests with whatever they needed him to do. [REDACTED] was not specific as to what any of these tasks were. When questioned about Job's affiliation with the altar boys, [REDACTED] stated the sisters in the school were always in charge of the altar boys. [REDACTED] stated he thought Job was a likeable man, who got along well with everyone. When questioned about Job's contact with minor children in the parish, [REDACTED] stated he never knew Job to spend any time whatsoever with any of the children in the parish. [REDACTED] stated he never heard of Job taking any of the altar boys bowling, or on vacation anywhere, especially to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not recall Job spending time with children on the playground. [REDACTED] stated he and Job would show children movies every Saturday afternoon in the school hall. [REDACTED] stated he and Job enjoyed doing this because they got such a good turnout. [REDACTED] stated he never witnessed or heard of Job acting inappropriately around any children or showing any signs of affection with the children in the parish.





When asked, ██████ stated some children in the parish had odd jobs to do around the rectory, but did not remember children hanging out in the rectory. While describing the rectory, ██████ stated the main rectory housed Monsignor Meegan. The first floor of the rectory consisted of a living room and offices. The second floor consisted of bedrooms and a room where the copy machine was located. According to ██████, he lived in another building which was owned by the church and located a short distance away. ██████ recalled Job staying in the rectory where Monsignor Meegan stayed when he was not at the Seminary in Mundelein.

When asked, ██████ stated he sold his Chrysler to Job, but did not remember what type of Chrysler, or what color it was. ██████ did not recall Job owning a maroon vehicle. The only other priests ██████ remembered at SMDP were Monsignor Meegan and Fr. David Cortesi, both of whom are deceased.

When asked, ██████ stated he remembers the school building very well, but did not recall a supply room. He stated there were classrooms located under a new church that had been built and the 4th, 5th and 6th grade classrooms were located in this building. He was not sure if there was a supply room located in this building. ██████ stated the upper grade classes were located in the older school building, but did not recall a supply room in that building.

████████ was asked if he recalled any other seminarians who arrived at SMDP to provide supply work. He recalled some seminarians arriving at SMDP to provide adult education classes in the parish. ██████ stated Job had something to do with arranging the classes. The only seminarian ██████ recalled was Wilton Gregory, who ██████ believes is currently a Bishop at an unknown location.

████████ informed the investigator he did not have any additional information to offer and stated he has a difficult time remembering details because he is now an older man and this occurred many years ago. The investigator thanked Mr. ██████ for his cooperation and concluded the interview.

On August 8, 2008, at 10:15 a.m., Investigator Everett conducted a face-to-face interview with Fr. Thomas Franzman. Fr. Franzman is currently assigned as the Director of the Sheil Center in Evanston, IL which is associated with the Newman Center at Northwestern University. Fr. Franzman was informed the purpose of the interview was to obtain information regarding a confidential investigation of inappropriate behavior involving a deacon at Santa Maria Del Popolo. This interview took place at the Archdiocese Office located at 155 E. Superior St.

Investigator Everett informed Fr. Franzman the person named in these allegations was Thomas Job who was assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo as a deacon in the early 1970's. Fr. Franzman stated he has known Thomas Job for many years. They first met at Quigley High School in 1961 or 1962. Fr. Franzman and Job were classmates and became good friends when they attended Niles College together. Both Fr. Franzman and Job were ordained in 1970. Fr. Franzman was then assigned to St. Bede's in Ingleside, IL and Job was assigned to St. John Baptist in Northlake, IL. Fr. Franzman believes Job was a working Deacon at SMDP for 6 months prior to being assigned to St. John's. Fr. Franzman and Job had stayed in touch with one another throughout the years.

Fr. Franzman had little firsthand knowledge or contact with Job when he was at SMDP as a deacon. He stated, however, he believed Job's duties while at SMDP were general duties such as teaching religion, doing baptisms and working with the altar boys. He does recall Job bringing younger people to the seminary in Mundelein, IL to bowl and use other facilities such as the basketball and baseball facilities.

Fr. Franzman stated he remembered Job was always around young people and believed he always worked well with them. Franzman always considered Job to be a good teacher. He never witnessed any inappropriate behavior by Job and stated he felt very sorry to hear of these allegations against Job. Franzman stated when Job worked with younger people they were always in a group and he never knew Job to be alone with one or two children. Fr. Franzman always felt Thomas Job's relationship with children was normal.



Fr. Franzman stated children never said anything bad about Thomas Job and he was usually strict with the children.

Fr. Franzman stated years ago he and Job bought a summer cottage together in the [REDACTED] area which they still own. Fr. Franzman recalled Job bringing children to the cottage, but it was always a group of them. When asked, Fr. Franzman stated he does remember Job taking children on vacation to [REDACTED] but never thought anything of it because he felt Job, as many priests had done, tried to recruit young male subjects to consider joining the priesthood some day. Fr. Franzman recalled Job taking two or three boys with him to [REDACTED] and believed they may have gone to [REDACTED] or [REDACTED]. When asked, Fr. Franzman stated he did not recall what type of vehicle Job had driven during that period.

Fr. Franzman is still in touch with Job and during a conversation some time ago Job asked Fr. Franzman if he had heard of any allegations of inappropriate behavior by him involving minors. Job told Fr. Franzman he was sorry if he caused him any embarrassment, but did not elaborate.

Fr. Franzman was asked if he had any additional information he wanted to share and the interview was concluded.

On August 13, 2008 at 10:00 a.m., Investigator Everett conducted a face-to-face interview with Sister [REDACTED] at St. Rita High School. Sister [REDACTED], a member of the Adrian Dominican Sisters, is currently assigned as the College Counselor at St. Rita High School, located at [REDACTED]. Sister [REDACTED] resides at [REDACTED]. Sister [REDACTED] was told the purpose of the interview was to obtain information regarding a confidential investigation of inappropriate behavior involving a deacon at Santa Maria Del Popolo.

Investigator Everett informed Sister [REDACTED] the person named in the allegation was Thomas Job while he was assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo as a deacon in early 1970. Sister [REDACTED] informed the investigator she taught at SMDP School from 1969 till 1986. Sister [REDACTED] taught the 6th grade for 24 years and 4th grade the rest of the time. Sister [REDACTED] stated she does remember Job, however does not remember actually being introduced to him. Sister [REDACTED] stated she remembered Job being a tall man and a deacon at the church. Sister [REDACTED] does not recall Job coming to SMDP, nor does she recall when he was ordained. When questioned about Job's duties around the parish, Sister [REDACTED] stated she could not be sure, but thought he worked very closely with the altar boys and possibly taught religion classes to the students.

Sister [REDACTED] recalled Monsignor Meegan thinking very highly of Job and also remembered people in the parish liking him very much. When asked if she remembered any habits or past-time activities of Job, Sister [REDACTED] stated she did not, but remembered the school children liking him very much. Sister [REDACTED] stated she had never seen Job showing extraordinary amounts of affection toward children. When asked, Sister [REDACTED] stated she had no knowledge of Job taking any of the minor children on vacation with him, or spending a lot of time with them on the playground. When asked, Sister [REDACTED] stated she never witnessed Job act inappropriately around any minor children.



When questioned about the church rectory, Sister [REDACTED] stated she had been in the rectory, but could not remember the physical makeup of the building. She did not recall seeing children in the rectory any more than usual.

Sister [REDACTED] could not recall what type of vehicle Job might have driven in 1970.

When asked about the physical layout of the Santa Maria Del Popolo School buildings, Sister [REDACTED] stated in 1969 and 1970 the 4th, 5th and 6th grade classrooms were located below the church building at 40 Seymour Street, which is directly across the street from the main school building. All remaining classes were located in the main school building at 126 N. Lake Street. In 1971 or 1972, the 4th, 5th and 6th grade classrooms were moved across the street to the main building. The kindergarten, 1st, 2nd and 3rd grade classes were moved to the lower level of the church on Seymour Street. Sister [REDACTED] stated several supply rooms were located throughout the school along with a few janitorial closets. Sister [REDACTED] stated none of the classrooms were directly accessible to these supply rooms. She also stated all the supply rooms and the janitorial rooms were always locked. All teachers had keys to these rooms, but it was not known whether or not any of the priests had keys to these rooms.

When asked if she had any additional information she would like to share, Sister [REDACTED] stated she did not. Investigator Everett thanked Sister [REDACTED] and concluded the interview.

On August 13, 2008 at 2:00 p.m., the undersigned conducted an interview via telephone with [REDACTED], a retired teacher from Santa Maria Del Popolo School. [REDACTED] is currently substitute teaching at the school. [REDACTED] resides at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated she taught the 1st through 4th grades at SMDP from 1963 till 1981. [REDACTED] was informed the purpose of the interview was to obtain information regarding a confidential investigation of inappropriate behavior involving a deacon at Santa Maria Del Popolo.

Investigator Everett informed [REDACTED] the person named in these allegations was Thomas Job while he was assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo as a deacon in early 1970. [REDACTED] stated she remembered Thomas Job, but did not know exactly when she met him. [REDACTED] recalled Job presiding at Sunday masses and giving excellent sermons. When questioned about Job's duties at the parish, [REDACTED] remembered him as involved with the altar boys and teaching religion to the students. When questioned about Job's reputation at SMDP, [REDACTED] did not feel comfortable answering, because she felt like she did not know him well enough to comment. [REDACTED] stated she knew nothing of Job's past time activities or hobbies. She had never witnessed Job showing unusual affection toward minor children. [REDACTED] recalled Job as a very friendly man.

When asked about the rectory, [REDACTED] recalled a large kitchen and a living room with some offices on the first floor. She stated she did not think she had ever been on the second floor of the rectory. [REDACTED] stated on occasion several children were seen in the rectory helping out with odd jobs. She said it was always a friendly atmosphere and no one ever thought anything inappropriate about it.

[REDACTED] stated in the main school building there were five classrooms on the first floor, and six classrooms on the second floor. She recalled a large supply room on the second floor that was an attic-type supply room. [REDACTED] stated that most of the school supplies were maintained in this room which was always locked. [REDACTED] knew the teachers had keys to the



room, but did not know who else might have had keys. [REDACTED] believed the 6th, 7th and 8th grade classes were located in the main school building, but did not recall where exactly the 7th grade classroom was located. She believes it might have been on the second floor.

[REDACTED] did not know what type of vehicle Thomas Job drove at that time.

[REDACTED] remembered Job spending lots of time with children, and the children always flocked around him. She had never known Job to act inappropriately around any children. [REDACTED] knew nothing of Job taking any children on vacation at any time.

[REDACTED] was asked if she had any additional information to offer and she stated she did not. The interview was then concluded.

Sister [REDACTED] supplied the investigator with a contact phone number for Mr. [REDACTED] and several messages were left on Mr. [REDACTED]'s voice mail explaining the reason for the phone calls.

On August 18, 2008, contact was made with Mr. [REDACTED] and the reason for the calls was again explained. Investigator Everett identified him and explained to Mr. [REDACTED] he was investigating allegations of inappropriate behavior involving a deacon assigned to Santa Maria Del Popolo in early 1970.

The investigator attempted to schedule a time when he might be able to interview Mr. [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] informed the investigator he had recently suffered a loss in his family and would not be willing or available to be interviewed regarding this matter. Mr. [REDACTED] informed the investigator these allegations are from such a long time ago he would not be of any assistance. Investigator Everett thanked Mr. [REDACTED] for his time and concluded the telephone conversation.

Investigator Everett also attempted to contact and interview Sister [REDACTED] who taught at SMDP during the time frame of this allegation. Sister [REDACTED] is believed to be residing at [REDACTED]. The investigator called the phone number and learned it is a non-working number. The investigator was unable to contact and interview Sister [REDACTED].



Summary of Allegation

The Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review [CAIR] was first made known of ██████████ via ██████████ who identified ██████████ as one of the minors who spent time with the former Rev. Thomas Job while at St. John Vianney. A file was opened on this matter upon receipt of a letter dated January 22, 2008 from civil attorney ██████████. As per Mr. ██████████, there was difficulty scheduling a time to meet with his client, as ██████████ was a ██████████ and spent a significant amount of time away from home.

As per ██████████ he first encountered Fr. Job through CCD classes at St. John Vianney. ██████████ only attended St. John Vianney through first grade and was then transferred to a local public school. However, ██████████ involvement with St. John Vianney continued through CCD classes at the parish as well as through the youth group when he was in his teens. ██████████ and his family also attended Sunday mass at St. John Vianney together.

The alleged abuse included: inappropriate discussions initiated by Fr. Job about girlfriends or "██████████ arousal;" Fr. Job masturbated ██████████ in a hotel room in ██████████; in a room in school, Fr. Job exposed himself to ██████████ and talked about testicles, Fr. Job also had ██████████ touch his [Fr. Job's] testicles; Fr. Job gave ██████████ alcohol in the rectory on more than one occasion; Fr. Job masturbated in front of ██████████ in his quarters. The locations of the alleged incidents included: St. John Vianney school; a hotel room in ██████████; and Fr. Job's quarters in the rectory.

Summary of Response

The allegation was read to Mr. Job via phone on Friday, October 3, 2008. Mr. Job chose not to provide a response to the allegation and stated that he would appreciate it if I would not send him a copy of the report of ██████████ allegation against him.

Summary of Investigation


The initial suggestions/recommendations/requests for information made by the Review Board at the Initial Review will determine the need to request additional investigative services from Hillard Heintze on this matter.

Additional Information

The August 7, 2008 meeting with ██████████ and Mr. ██████████ was cut short due to a conflict with Mr. ██████████'s flights to and from ██████████. When asked, ██████████

chose not to continue the meeting with only me present when Mr. [REDACTED] indicated that he needed to leave in order to make his returning flight to Chicago. As a result, I was not able to ask [REDACTED] some clarification questions. In my cover letter to [REDACTED] in care of Mr. [REDACTED] with the draft report of the August 7th meeting enclosed, I asked [REDACTED] if he would provide answers to questions of his marital status, whether or not he has any children, the name of his employer, and what he did on the weekends when he was younger [as a follow up to a comment that he had made during the meeting].

In response, I received a September 23, 2008 letter from Mr. [REDACTED] with the information: “[REDACTED] has advised me that he is not married, does not have any children, and is not presently working. His previous employer was [REDACTED] where he worked from approximately from [sic] January, 2008-September, 2008. Following high school, [REDACTED] would look forward to the weekends where he would hang out with his friends and drink.”

I called St. Mary of the Lake Seminary today and spoke with [REDACTED] Rev. Denis Lyle's secretary, to ask for information on Thomas Job. Fr. Lyle is the rector of the seminary.

[REDACTED] called me back and said that all information in Thomas Job's seminary file indicates that his diaconate assignment was Santa Maria Del Popolo. The information in the file includes the following reports of deacons:

1. 12/20/69 - Final Report of the Pastor, Msgr. Meegan
2. 12/20/69 - Final Report of the Supervisor, Rev. Peter Wilkin
3. 12/30/69 - Final Report of the Associate, Rev. David Cortese

[REDACTED] said that it looks like Thomas Job was at Santa Maria Del Popolo the summer prior [1968] working, maybe not as a deacon. She explained that there now is a letter in priest files where they served their diaconate assignment prior to being ordained. [REDACTED] did not see such a letter in Thomas Job's file.

I have also attached a copy of the 2006 review that Patty Zacharias did of Thomas Job's seminary file. As you can see, no specific dates and/or letter concerning Job serving as a deacon at Santa Maria Del Popolo, but certainly references and evaluations.

Per Professional Responsibility Administrator's [PRA] request, PRAA reviewed the former Rev. Thomas Job's Seminary file on November 20, 2006. The following is a summary of information in the aforementioned file:

- In a document titled Philosophy I, Semester I 1965 under the Application section, it is written in part, "Wished to withdraw after one day here. Was not dissatisfied with seminary but felt that he should not be a priest. On the whole seems very sensible to me. Impulsive first act has thus far been quite out of character with what I see of him now".
- In a document titled Summer Letter for 1965, Thomas Job describes his taking care of the servers and taking an occasional camping trip where he takes groups of boys from the parish. The name of the parish is not on the document. He references having worked there for the past five years.
- A letter dated 9/3/65 signed by Barry Horner and addressed to Monsignor Foley states in part, "He (referencing Thomas Job) spent every day here at the church and rectory helping me in many ways and getting other boys of the parish to work with him on these projects".
- Fr. Dougherty wrote in a document dated 1966-67 under Dean's evaluation, "Tom is a serious young man who is generous with his time. He is very courteous and intelligent, mature in his appearance. He seems too apologetic and obsequious at

times. He seems to have many veiled or unspoken feelings. I am not sure how much he is making his own life here, his own little seminary. He seems very self-righteous when challenged. Vocation: The impression he makes is a bit spooky, somber and sad. I'm not sure I know him well at all. He does seem serious about his desire to be a priest.

- Thomas Job wrote the following in a letter titled Summer Letter 1967: "I took a trip during the summer – the last two weeks of July. I had my work pretty well in hand, so I took a week and a half off to do some camping, a pastime which I particularly enjoy. I took four boys from the parish along, and went down to the Smoky Mountains in North Carolina. The boys worked for me at the rectory doing maintenance work and putting what they earned toward the trip. The parish more or less sponsored the trip, but the boys earn it on their own."
- Fr. Thomas Horne from St. Peter Damian Parish in Bartlett, IL wrote in part in a letter dated 9/5/67 and addressed to Monsignor Gorman: "Tom has no serious faults and very few minor ones. But he is heavily freighted with good qualities and abilities. In him the prime mover is a real enthusiasm about his vocation and priestly work. This motivates him to undertake and carry through almost anything. While he is not pietistic he never fails at daily mass and communion. He is constantly in the church and rectory and works with me most faithfully. He does not work alone but has a group of boys who work with him".
- Fr. Robert Dougherty wrote in a document dated 1967-1968 on letterhead from St. Mary of the Lake Seminary, "I feel more positively towards him because I have seen more of him. I feel more trust in him. I feel there is some hidden tension in my relationship with him. I find it hard to determine how open he is. There is a certain uneasiness there. I like to see him as steady and dependable, more as a person and less of a functionary. I feel that he has not yet really matured or is confident in himself. He seems somewhat insecure".
- A positive evaluation was written by Fr. Peter Wilkin from Santa Maria del Popolo Parish-dated 9/9/69. The evaluation states in part, "There have been no problems to speak of in his relationship with members of the house. The people have responded enthusiastically to him as a person and as a Deacon".
- Fr. Job wrote to Monsignor Gorman or George Kane on September 15, 1969. The letter states in part, "In closing, I cannot begin to thank you for allowing me to come to Mundelein (the letter appears to be referencing the Santa Maria del Popolo Parish) – even with all of your misgivings. I would venture to say that things have worked out so well because I had shopped around and decided on this parish and they wanted me. In the future, perhaps we should let men choose their own parish if they have enough initiative to go out and find one."
- On his Personal Data sheet, Fr. Job describes an interest in continuing to work with "special religious education" and writes he had found "working in the

retarded programs very helpful to me personally as well as very fulfilling ministerially”.

Tapper if he can recall who from the seminary may have provided supply work to Santa Maria del Popolo during the time of the alleged abuse
- Attempt to determine if Rev. Peter Wilkin is alive and speak with him [as per Rev. Daniel Smilanic, Peter Wilkin is either resigned from the priesthood or deceased]
- Talk with Rev. John Canary to ask if he can remember who from the seminary provided supply work to Santa Maria del Popolo during the time of the alleged abuse
- Attempt to obtain the school records of [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] to determine if there is any mention of [REDACTED]

- Attempt to determine if any teachers, religious, etc. may be located who would have been assigned to/working at Santa Maria del Popolo at the time of the alleged abuse

I have followed up on the following information:

- I spoke with Fr. Canary today and asked if he could recall who from the seminary would have done supply work at Santa Maria del Popolo; Fr. Canary suggested that contact be made with Fr. Tapper to ask him the question
- A request was made today to Santa Maria del Popolo for [REDACTED] school records


I did confirm that Thomas Job's deaconate assignment was at Santa Maria del Popolo.

PRA reviewed the former Rev. Thomas Job's file in the Chancellor's office on September 13, 2006. The following is a summary of information in the aforementioned file:

- **5/30/70:** letter from Fr. Job to Cardinal Cody regarding his first assignment; Fr. Job did not want to work with the deaf, as he felt that it would be difficult; Fr. Job requested to be assigned to his deacon assignment at Santa Maria with Msgr. Meegan
- **1/23/74:** granted faculties in Joliet by the Chancellor
- **9/11/75:** letter from a parishioner and his wife at St. John Vianney asking that Fr. Job not be reassigned from their parish
- **5/22/87:** letter from Cardinal Bernardin to Fr. Job granting a six month leave of absence "...for [REDACTED] ..." effective 6/14/87; Fr. Job also asked to keep in contact with the Vicar for Priests during his leave
- **9/26/86:** memo from Vicar for Priests [VP] to Cardinal Bernardin; VP told Fr. Job of his meetings with [REDACTED], Sr. Oursler, and Sr. Ivers; Fr. PRA received a phone call on May 17, 2006 from [REDACTED] regarding her concerns about the list of withdrawn clerics available on the Archdiocesan website.

[REDACTED] was talking quickly and seemed somewhat excited throughout the phone call. As a result, it was difficult for PRA to keep up with [REDACTED] at different times during the conversation. She quickly mentioned that “[REDACTED]” suggested that she give PRA a call. [REDACTED] immediately began by informing PRA that she had never made such a phone call and that she was “upset when the names were published.” She continued by talking about a priest in particular who she and her family know who apparently was on the list. [REDACTED] stated that her son and his friend became friends with this priest when they were school age [now adults].

[REDACTED] mentioned that at one point in time she had this priest sit down in her home and she asked him if he had ever touched her son [he said that he did not]. She stated that she has also asked her son and his friend if this priest ever touched them and they told her no. [REDACTED] also spoke of “guilty feelings” that she has and feelings of “not protecting her son” if something did happen with this priest. As an adult [REDACTED]’s son has told her that nothing happened with this priest. [REDACTED] informed PRA that her son and his friend had slept over “...at the priest’s home...” when they were school age [minors] as well.

[REDACTED] talked about her son still being friends with this priest today. She informed PRA that her son is married with two children and that he and his wife have the priest over at their home often.

At this point during the phone call, [REDACTED] then asked PRA “...is he a pedophile?!” PRA informed [REDACTED] that there was certain general information about a cleric that would be able to be provided to her, but that she had not yet identified the priest. [REDACTED]

██████████ then identified the priest as “Fr. Tom Job.” PRA informed ██████████ that the former Rev. Thomas Job is resigned from the priesthood and therefore, no longer a priest. ██████████ was also informed that Mr. Job [and the other clerics whose names are on the aforementioned “list”] each have at least one substantiated allegation of sexual misconduct with a minor against them. PRA provided ██████████ with a basic explanation of what a substantiated allegation is, as well as the role of the Review Board and an Administrative Review [prior to the Board’s existence].

██████████ stated that Mr. Job told her and her family that his name was on “the list” because he knew of another priest at St. John Vianney who had been with a 16 or 17 year old girl and he [Mr. Job] “...didn’t report it.” Mr. Job informed ██████████ and her family that as a result of his failure to report this situation involving another priest, his name was put on “the list” as well.

When asked, ██████████ clarified that ██████████ is Mr. Job’s ██████████

██████████ then spoke about her feelings about Mr. Job currently. She informed PRA that she was a ██████████ and that she “...usually is a good judge of character...” ██████████ expressed her anger with Mr. Job and then asked PRA if she should tell her son not to allow Mr. Job to be alone with his children. It was suggested to ██████████ that she share the information with her son that PRA had provided her.

██████████ again informed PRA that as far as she knows, her son [██████████] and his friend were not abused by Mr. Job. She talked about her son and his friend’s school years and that the former Fr. Job had taken both “...under his wing.” ██████████ informed PRA that her son and his friend were both on the ██████████ in high school and that the former Fr. Job was extremely supportive of them.

██████████ expressed her appreciation for the information provided. When asked, ██████████ provided her phone number of ██████████



PRA contacted Francis Cardinal George via phone on November 2, 2005 regarding the former Rev. Thomas Job and the phone call received from his current employer [see November 3, 2005 Memorandum in file].

Cardinal George expressed his grave concern with all of the information provided by Mr. Job's 
 PRA informed Cardinal George that the information shared by  regarding Mr. Job was communicated to Rev. Vincent Costello, Mr. Job's Vicar for Priests. When asked by Cardinal George, PRA informed him that Mr. Job is resigned, but not laicized.

Cardinal George directed PRA to contact Bishop Raymond Goedert and share with him this information regarding Mr. Job. He stated that he wanted the process to begin to have Mr. Job laicized. Cardinal George supported PRA's suggestion to have a letter written regarding Mr. Job's status and standing as a resigned priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago shared with the "...nuns...and Catholic girls' home [see November 3rd Memorandum in file]..." Cardinal George also stated that Mr. Job is not to be administering communion. He requested that all of this information be communicated to Bishop Goedert.

PRA spoke with Bishop Goedert via phone on November 3, 2005 regarding the aforementioned matter. It was agreed that Bishop Goedert would fax to PRA a copy of a decree stating that Mr. Job is not in good standing as a cleric of this diocese. Bishop Goedert stated that he would contact Fr. Costello about this matter as well.

PRA received a voice mail message on October 31, 2005 from [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED] Ms. Cerk requested a return call at [REDACTED]

PRA received a phone call from Dianne Dunagan of the Office of Communications on November 1, 2005. Ms. Dunagan had called to forward a message to PRA that she had received from [REDACTED]. As per Ms. Dunagan, [REDACTED] had informed her that the nature of her call was regarding Thomas Job, whom she has employed for the past 15 years. Ms. Dunagan and PRA agreed that PRA would return [REDACTED]'s phone call.

When PRA and [REDACTED] first spoke, [REDACTED] did not reveal the identity of her employee, but did state that he was one of the men listed in a recent newspaper article [October 28, 2005] where her employee was listed as an Archdiocesan priest who had a [substantiated] allegation of sexual abuse against him. PRA acknowledged her familiarity with the recent article to [REDACTED] and clarified that civil attorney Jeff Anderson arranged and conducted the press conference on behalf of his clients [all individuals who have reported allegations of minor sexual abuse against clerics]. PRA then informed [REDACTED] that the Archdiocese of Chicago did not release the information as it was reported in the media on Thursday, October 20th and Friday, October 21st.

[REDACTED] began by asking PRA specific questions in regards to one reporting an allegation of sexual misconduct against a cleric and the related Review Board process. While on the phone, PRA directed [REDACTED] to the main website for the Archdiocese of Chicago and identified where she would find the *§1100 Sexual Abuse of Minors: Policies for Education, Prevention, Assistance to Victims and Procedures for Determination of Fitness for Ministry*. PRA then answered basic questions for [REDACTED] regarding the Review Board process and the Archbishop's final decision in regards to an allegation.

██████████ then asked PRA general questions concerning the status of a cleric. PRA again directed ██████████ to the Archdiocesan website to the “Priest Information Service” and briefly explained the service to her. When asked, PRA also provided ██████████ with a brief explanation concerning a cleric’s status and related faculties [including a priest in good standing, withdrawn, resigned, or laicized].

When asked by PRA, ██████████ stated that she was specifically calling as a result of seeing Thomas Job’s name in the paper the week prior. PRA then provided ██████████ with the public information concerning the former Rev. Thomas Job’s priesthood. She informed ██████████ of Mr. Job’s history of assignments, that he resigned from the priesthood in December 1992, and that he has at least one substantiated allegation of sexual misconduct [of a minor] against him. Once provided this information, ██████████ began to cry. ██████████ apologized to PRA and then tearfully stated, “...we are supposed to be protecting people here...” PRA assured ██████████ that she has done nothing wrong and that she is acting responsibly.

When asked by PRA, ██████████ stated that she has supervised Mr. Job for the past 15 years. Also when asked, ██████████ stated that Mr. Job currently supervises three counselors at the ██████████ and runs the out-patient continuing care drug treatment program at the facility. When asked by PRA if Mr. Job is licensed by the State of Illinois, ██████████ stated that Mr. Job is not licensed, but is certified as a CADC [Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor].

██████████ then spoke about Mr. Job’s history with the ██████████. She stated that he was wearing his collar during his interview with her 15 years ago. As per ██████████, Mr. Job also volunteered and worked at other treatment facilities prior to working at the ██████████. ██████████ also spoke of always feeling that something was not right with Mr. Job. She stated that oftentimes at the ██████████ there were children who often asked to see him, even though his work at the agency is with adults. ██████████ stated that over the years, she and her husband have been to Mr. Job’s home for social gatherings, where he has had boys/young men working for him to “help out.” She also informed PRA that her husband’s brother was either a parishioner/friends with parishioners at one of Mr. Job’s former assignments. ██████████’s brother-in-law shared with her a story about Mr. Job where he had bought a young man a home. At one point during the phone call, ██████████ informed PRA, “[Mr. Job] has more attorneys than Carter has liver pills...” and that he is financially well off.

Once PRA had provided ██████████ with information about the status of a cleric and related ministerial faculties, she asked if Mr. Job could administer “communion.” PRA informed her that any resigned cleric could not administer communion. However, PRA provided ██████████ with a brief explanation of a layperson who could administer communion as a Eucharistic Minister. ██████████ was then informed that PRA would contact Mr. Job’s Vicar for Priests, Rev. Vincent Costello to address this possibility of Mr. Job administering communion in either Lake or Cook Counties. PRA then informed ██████████ that Cardinal George would not allow Mr. Job to administer communion within this diocese. ██████████ then mentioned that as recent as the past year, she is fairly certain

that Mr. Job has been conducting retreats for "...nuns...[and residents of a] Catholic girls' home..." PRA informed [REDACTED] that this information would be shared with Fr. Costello as well so that he could follow-up with this extremely concerning matter.

[REDACTED] expressed her appreciation to PRA for all of the information provided to her. PRA thanked [REDACTED] for her call and urged her to call in the future with any additional questions or concerns. [REDACTED] may be reached at [REDACTED]

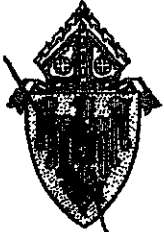

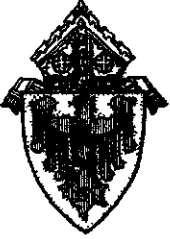

Dear Bill-

Thanks for the "grace period" in getting my request sheet in to you. At a time when I must meet many deadlines legally and financially, it was a welcomed respite.

My choice sheet only has three names listed. In all honesty, I could put nothing else down. With my mother's illness and subsequent death, all of the necessary items that go with such an event, the demands made on me because I am the only family member left in handling the estate and the time spent in traveling have made it almost impossible to get around and interview at more parishes. I consider the upcoming appointment as perhaps the most crucial one in my priesthood and I regret that I could not give more time to it.


The situation in which I am now living has not helped. The tensions and pressure of an extremely unhappy house have placed a burden on me personally at this time in my life which has affected all that I'm doing. It has affected me physically as well as emotionally. [REDACTED]

My priesthood has suffered this past year and a half and I need a complete change in location and style of ministering - that's why I have put the Cathedral first on my list. But far more than being a change in location and style, it offers me the chance to be with a good group of priests in a happy rectory with a ministering, supportive pastor - who has indicated now as well as in the past that he would like me to come to the Cathedral.

I would ask that the unique circumstances surrounding my life at present be taken into consideration in making this appointment. I thank you personally, Bill, for all the time you've given to me. Your listening and caring have helped make things a bit easier.

John,

First, I would like to thank you and Mike for all your efforts in helping me - they're very much appreciated.

My main reason for writing this letter though, is to give you my reactions to being in Bartlett at St. Peter Damian.

Jerry Klug has done a tremendous job of establishing an excellent Christian community - and even though this is so often an overused cliché, it is true of this parish. He is a tremendous man to live with and I have found a great deal of support from him in my daily ministry.

I had placed Bartlett on my preference sheet as a place where I felt I could really grow in my priesthood and where I could offer my talents to a parish that could really benefit from my being assigned there.

My short stay has already confirmed this for me. I am writing to ask you to give particular thought to making this my regular assignment. I fully realize that at present this is only temporary. By working with Jerry I feel I could offer tremendous help to the parish. I cannot emphasize enough the importance to me of working in a rectory situation where there is shared work and responsibilities - as well as an atmosphere of friendship where through mutual concern each of the men grows in his priesthood. I have found such a rectory here.

I hope that this letter does not come too late to enter into your considerations. If not, I would appreciate greatly your taking this into account. I feel very strongly that this would be one of the best places for me to live.

By the way, my one concern about being close to my family at this time because of my Father's health has also worked out fine. It has proved no hindrance to my work in the parish and I also have been able to give them the support needed at this critical time.
