Patrick Melbourne was born in 1945. Melbourne was involved with the Boy Scouts of America, as a den leader for Pack 278 in Hastings, Minnesota. Prior to joining the Boy Scouts, Melbourne had demonstrated unfitness to work with children.

In 1980, he was convicted of child abuse and sentenced to 90 days in jail. Later, in 1983, he was convicted for criminal sexual assault in the second-degree stemming from his sexual abuse of a minor girl. While still on probation for his sexual abuse of a child, Melbourne served as Den Leader of Pack 278.

He was suspended as a Boy Scout Volunteer in 1987 and added to the Boy Scouts' [Confidential Files](#) in January 1988.
