

Lawrence M. Atkins

Lawrence M. Atkins (a/k/a Lawrence Atkin, DOB 03/16/38), of Faribault, Minnesota, was an adult Boy Scout volunteer who received an “undesirable discharge” from the U.S. Army in a matter that involved a Boy Scout, according to Boy Scout records. As a result, Atkins was placed in the Boy Scouts’ [Confidential Files](#), making him an ineligible volunteer, in 1960.

Atkins was in the U.S. Army and based in Leghorn, Italy, in approximately the late 1950s-1960. He also volunteered with Troop 76 in Leghorn, Italy, during that period, and was registered as an assistant scoutmaster with Troop 76 in 1959. Atkins was approximately 21, and his listed address was in Faribault, Minnesota, when he was placed in the Confidential Files.

Despite his inclusion in the Confidential Files in 1960, Atkins applied for registration as a Boy Scout adult volunteer with Troop 301 in Faribault, Minnesota, around 1970, according to Boy Scout records. Boy Scouts of America declined the application. He was approximately 32, his listed address was in Faribault, Minnesota, and his listed occupation was elementary school custodian, at that time, according to Boy Scout records.

Atkins is believed to have died on May 18, 2013, and to have resided in the following locations between 1988 and 2013: Faribault (Rice County) Minnesota; Cottage Grove (Washington County) Minnesota; Hastings (Dakota County) Minnesota; Des Moines (Polk County) Iowa; Medford (Steele County) Minnesota; Minnetonka (Hennepin County) Minnesota; and Princeton (Benton County) Minnesota. Atkins reportedly coached youths in various sports.
