This arrangement began on Monday, August 1, 1983. It is our understanding that it will be monitored, and in order to establish some immediate time frame it will last for three months.

Father Ericksen plans to seek employment somewhere in the Twin Cities. As of this writing he has no leads or immediate plans. However, he has been accepted and has already begun outpatient consultation with Dr. Dolore Rockers from the Consultation Services Center in St. Paul.

The Diocese of Superior will, in a modest way, assist Father Ericksen with his immediate expenses as well as his rather heavy indebtedness. However, he does not enjoy the faculties of the diocese and he has been directed to refrain from ministering in any priestly role whatsoever. All specific and very personal requests that he has made for this period have been denied.

Dr. Rockers has promised to establish a three way arrangement of communication among herself, Father Ericksen and the undersigned. I hope to stay in touch with you were any changes made in this existing arrangement. Many thanks for your help in our recent telephone conversation.

This morning, February 22, 1984, Father Tom Comber called from St. Lawrence Parish.

A Father Tom Erickson is living within the parish, he has been there for about a year. According to Father Comber, Father Erickson is a priest who is not practicing because of a crime that had been committed. The crime involved young males.

This priest seems to desire to become more active within St. Lawrence Parish by joining the music ministry and other things that have to do with liturgical worship. Father Comber is disturbed about this, and he has decided that it will be best if he curtails the activity of this individual, particularly those that would put him in the public eye. Rather than ministering at Eucharistic celebrations he is going to suggest that Father Erickson restrict himself to taking care of the poor and helping to feed those who are hungry.

Approval was given for this mode of action and he was asked to keep us informed of future developments.
