



Scout leader pleads guilty

LYONS — A Boy Scouts official pleaded guilty in Wayne County Court yesterday to five counts of third-degree sodomy involving a 16-year-old member of his troop.

Francis E. Davis, 54, of Walworth will be sentenced by Judge Maurice Strobridge on July 23. Davis remained free on \$20,000 bond.

The charges accused Davis of engaging in sodomy with the boy at camping trips and other activities, state police said.

Davis waived his right to have the case presented to the grand jury, said Wayne County District Attorney Stephen Sirkin. Davis had been charged with 10 counts of third-degree sodomy and unlawfully dealing with a child. Sirkin said those charges are still pending.

BUFFALO — Alejandro Gomez, the Salvadoran seeking asylum in Rochester, yesterday testified about his political past and the reason he fled to the United States in 1983.

Gomez, who testified for about four hours before Immigration Judge Gordon Sacks, said he decided to flee after he was tortured by Salvadoran police for 15 days in June 1983 and then held in detention for another 5½ months.

"I was hit by pieces of wood, with pieces of tube," Gomez said. "I was hung by my hands. I was hit with their hands. I was hit with their feet quite a few times."

Gomez said he was also tortured with electric shock. "You feel like your whole body is stretched," Gomez said. "I have trouble hearing quite a bit. And my ears have a ringing sound — constantly."

Gomez, speaking about his political in-



Walworth man pleads guilty to sex charges

LYONS — A 54-year-old Boy Scout committee member pleaded guilty Wednesday to five counts of third-degree sodomy in connection with a series of incidents involving two teen-age scouts in his troop.

Francis E. Davis, a Walworth resident, waived a grand jury investigation. He could be sent to state prison for up to four years on each charge when he is sentenced July 23. Wayne County Court Judge Maurice Strobridge said that no promise regarding sentencing has been made.

Davis, who worked with Boy Scout Troop 113, was arrested by state police May 9 for incidents police said date back to 1983 and took place during camping trips and other scout activities in Wayne and Seneca counties.

In a statement to state police, one boy said that Davis made sure that he and the boy would share a bed on all camping trips. When another Wayne County scout leader pleaded guilty to sex charges last year, Davis told the boy that the same thing better not happen to him, the boy said

Davis was originally charged with 10 counts of sodomy and two counts of endangering the welfare of a child. However, he pleaded to only five sodomy counts yesterday.
