Board Pays Teacher to Quit, Cites Alleged Misconduct

By CAROL L. CLEAVELAND

The Syracuse Board of Education voted Monday to accept the resignation of a teacher who has worked for the district 18 years, following what school officials say were serious charges of misconduct against the teacher.

Superintendent Lionel R. Meno said the district wanted to dismiss special education teacher Frank G. Diminuco on charges of misconduct and conduct unbecoming a teacher.

"We didn't want him teaching in our schools or anywhere in the state," Meno said.

Meno and board members would not say Monday what type of incidents Di-

minuco is alleged to have been involved in.

District officials learned of the misconduct charges in October, at which time Diminuco was transferred from his classroom position at Nottingham High School to a clerical job in the district's main offices.

Under an agreement reached with Diminuco, the district will pay him for 74 days of work, at a cost of \$14,334, and will pay him for 46 sick days he accrued, said Robert DiFlorio, executive assistant to the superintendent. DiFlorio said the sick pay will come to slightly less than \$10,000.

The board agreed to pay the teacher

for 120 days in order to avoid initiating dismissal proceedings against him, district officials said.

"These things (proceedings) go on and on," DiFlorio said.

If the district had initiated proceedings against Diminuco, DiFlorio said, the school system would have been required by law to continue paying him until the matter was decided.

"The cost would have been greater," he said, adding that it typically costs a school district about \$45,000 in legal fees to try to fire a teacher.

Diminuco could not be reached for comment Monday. His attorney, Michael Cogswell, declined comment.

Meno said he asked the Onondaga County District Attorney's Office to investigate the matter in October.

"We've been waiting for some determination (from the district attorney) since then," he said.

Board President Ruth Federman said the school board discussed the situation several times in closed meetings in order to determine how to handle the situation. The board called a special meeting Monday to accept Diminuco's resignation.

"This is something we've been looking into since last fall," said board member Mary Salibrici. "I'm just glad it's be resolved the way it has been. He's out the

Sex probe tuns out

A nine-month investigation into allegations a teacher and Boy Scout leader sexually abused teen-agers over 15 years in New York, Pennsylvania and Canada has been stymied by the statute of limitations and by the man's demands for money from the Syracuse City School District.

The teacher was reassigned to clerical duties in the school district offices last September as a result of the investigation. He resigned as a scout leader after the troop's sponsor, a Syracuse church, asked him to step down, sources said.

"At the time we became aware there was an investigation, we and the troop's ponsor asked him to step down until this natter is resolved," said Donald F. Blacker, executive director of the Hlawatha Council of the Boy Scouts.

Blacker declined further comment.

Syracuse Board of Education president Ruth Federman was familiar with the case, too. By John Doherty Stail Writer

The school district is working on this, and he is no longer in the classroom," Federman said.

She would not comment further. Sources have told the Herald American the man has been under investigation in Pennsylvania and Canada for abuse of Boy Scouts during trips. The sources say the Pennsylvania and Canadian authorities have agreed they would not prosecute the man if he pleads guilty to sex charges in Onondaga County.

Prosecution by the Onondaga County District Attorney's office has been stymed because local police investigators cannot find evidence of victims being molested here within the past two years, the statute of limitations for such cases.

But the man is refusing to plead guilty until he reaches a cash settlement with the school district in exchange for his resignation and any admissions, sources said. A school source said the matter has been discussed in an executive session of the school board.

"The school district wants him out of there." said a source. "They're not letting him anywhere in near kids."

The teacher cannot be fired because he has yet to be convicted of any charges, sources said. He also cannot be fired without a formal school district hearing.

He stepped down from his position with the Boy Scouts last teaced.

"The pastor was mad," a source id. "He wanted him out of there

right away."

Although Syracuse police have been unable to find anyone who was victimized here by the teacher within the past two years, he has agreed to admit to sexual abuse charges locally and resign from the school district if a deal can be

After allegations against the teacher surfaced, a number of teachers, union officials and school administrators came to their colleague's defense, vouching for his character and testifying that he was an outstanding member of the community, sources said.

The teacher also was a friend of police officers investigating the allegations, sources said.

According to the same sources, the student, who is now 18, then became the target of intense and other students and he later withdrew his complaint.

A short time later, the student quit school because of continuing in the current probe, sources said investigators are looking into claims that the same teacher school officials and police officers. Without commenting on the specifics of this case, Delores Card, director of the Rape Crisis Center in Syracuse, said it is not uncommon lessed.

"Primarily they are afraid." Card said. "Very often they have been threatened. They also feel embar-is rassed and they feel it was their fault, they feel guilty. In order for a child to tell someone they have been molested, they have to get e over their fear and guilt."
