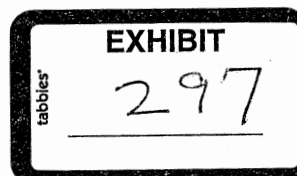

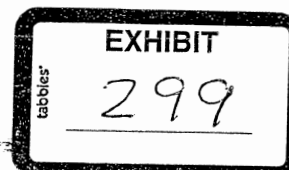

Complaint: On April 14, 1972, I interviewed \_\_\_\_\_, a student at the Minnesota Learning Center and a member of my Explorer Scout Post. He related the following story to me regarding an incident that took place between him and Father Longley of Nisswa:

Father Longley tried to convince both the boy and the father that the boy should stay their for awhile. Father Longley then took the boy into the bed room on the pretense that he was showing the boy where he would be staying. Again he ran his hands all over the boys body, including his private parts. He asked the boy again if he would like to stay there. \_\_\_\_\_ states he was so scared by this time all he could say was yes. But after they left he immediately told his father what had transpired. On the say so of \_\_\_\_\_ the father, the boy never did stay with Father Longley, but on several occassions, Father Longley phoned the father in St Paul trying to get him to change his mind about letting the boy stay with him. Father Longley also signed up as a volunteer worker for the MLC and requested he be allowed to work on a person to person basis with the boy. This would have allowed him to take the boy to his home at any time. Father Longleys' request was turned down but the MLC still has a copy of this request in writing.

Normally a students files are kept confidential but due to the allegations made by \_\_\_\_\_ a case worker of his revealed some of the facts that brought \_\_\_\_\_ to the MLC. Among the reasons were sexual misbehavior, including homosexuallity and indecent expoare. Despite the fact mentioned above in the confidential report and due to the fact I've worked with this boy for over three months as an advisor of an Explorer Scout post, it is my belief that almost all of what the boy said is true. 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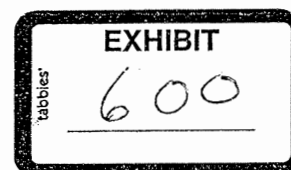

In writing to you regarding Father Longley,  
who operates a camp in Wisconsin, fifteen miles  
east of Beaver Dam, Wisconsin.

My son, [redacted] and I,  
went to visit him at his camp last spring.  
When we arrived, it was obvious by his  
unsteady gait, that he had been drinking.  
While Mrs. [redacted] and I were visiting,  
Father took [redacted] to another cabin. After  
being gone about fifteen or twenty minutes,  
[redacted] returned, requesting that we leave.  
I asked him why and he answered that he'd  
explain when we got into the car. The conversation



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which followed revealed that the priest had attacked [redacted] sexually.

Previous efforts to contact you through the St. Paul Archdiocese Chancery Office have been fruitless, so I am contacting you directly, hoping that you can remedy the situation without the law having to become involved.

After the above mentioned unfortunate incident, I made it clear to Father, and to the Counselor at the Minnesota Learning Center, where [redacted] is enrolled, that I wanted no further contacts made. In spite of my requests, Father on several occasions has inquired for [redacted] and [redacted].

In talking with [redacted] and with the sheriff from that area, I learned that many young people frequent these grounds, that they are aware of liquor and drugs being used on the premises, and that [redacted]

activities here are definitely under suspicion.  
Monday of this week, the Police Department  
from Brainerd contacted me asking that I  
present in order to bring about termination  
of the above mentioned activities, and make  
it possible for Father Longley to receive the  
professional help he most certainly needs.  
Convinced of the seriousness of this situation,  
and that Father definitely is not acting re-  
sponsibly or according to his priestly role,  
I appeal to you, as his superior, to take the  
matter in hand without the law having  
to move in. As a Catholic layman, I would  
prefer that the matter be handled quietly  
without unreasonable publicity.

I have asked the Police Department  
to grant two weeks time before taking action  
in order that the church may give the necessary  
help and make the required adjustments.

I write you in hopeful anticipation and with sincere gratitude for your prompt attention to this matter.
