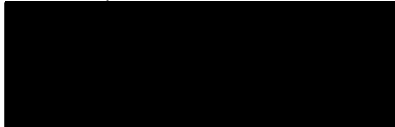

Dear Mr. Ridge:

It is the responsibility of the Division of Youth and Family Services to investigate all child abuse and neglect referrals as outlined in N.J.S.A. 9:6-8:11. This is therefore to notify you that on February 14, 1986 the Division's Southern Regional Office received an allegation of sexual abuse of [Redacted] a participant in the Hammonton Boy Scout Troop.

As you will note in the attached copy of the report on the results of the investigation on this referral, the allegation was substantiated.


While this investigation was completed some months ago, we have only now been able to officially inform you in writing of the results, due to the inordinate volume of abuse allegations being handled by this office.

Under the state confidentiality statute, N.J.S.A. 9:6--8:10A et seq., reports, records, and information in this letter concerning child abuse and neglect are confidential. In accordance with the statute, however we can release the report to you to help to ensure that proper care, treatment, or supervision is provided not only to the specific child or children involved here, but to all children under the care and supervision of this facility. In conjunction with the provisions of proper care, these reports may be used in any investigations or disciplinary actions you may find necessary.

The law requires any agency or person receiving these reports or information to preserve their confidentiality, and it provides for criminal penalties for anyone violating its provisions. Therefore, when conducting appropriate investigations and disciplinary actions, steps should be taken to limit access to this material to persons necessary to the investigation or disciplinary action. The materials and information contained therein may not be disclosed to the public or to the press either directly or as part of any otherwise public records or proceedings.

II. Allegation

On February 14, 1986 the Division's Atlantic District reported the following information to the investigating unit of the Southern Region: The Camden County Prosecutor's Office reported that on or about January 24, 1986, Vincent Glazewski a Boyscout Leader took six children on a camping trip in Elm, New Jersey. He gave them liquor in Pepsi Cola; showed them dirty magazines; and took a picture of them all lined up with their pants down. [REDACTED] Mother of [REDACTED] age 12 confronted Vincent and he admitted taking the picture. Vincent also allegedly told the children that he could get all kinds of weapons and threatened to hurt them if they told anyone. The children were on the frozen lake. He chopped the frozen ice, causing the children to fall in the lake. He took pictures of the children struggling in the lake.

Vincent Glazewski has previous convictions of sex crimes in Atlantic County.

II. Investigation

A. Statement or Reaction of Child

[REDACTED]

The investigating worker made sexual attempts to schedule an interview with [REDACTED] and his mother. His mother refused to allow the investigating worker to interview the child. Consequently, the child was interviewed by Reginald Beckett, Investigator for the Camden County Prosecutor's Office. [REDACTED] statement taken by Investigator Reginald Beckett on February 26, 1986 reveals: On January 17, 1986, he, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went on a camping trip with Vincent Glazewski. They met at his home on [REDACTED] in Elm, New Jersey after school about 3:30 PM. Vincent transported them to the camp site at a high speed of 100 miles an hour. When they arrived they unloaded their things, prepared the tent and got ready for bed. They ate pizza and looked at dirty magazines. Vincent put the rum in a 3 liter bottle of Pepsi and [REDACTED] may have been the only one to drink it.

The next day they took a hike down the railroad tracks. There was a large area of ice and as they crossed, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] fell through. Vincent was cutting the ice with an ax. They all fell through and Vincent was taking pictures.

When they returned to the Campsite, he (Vincent) passed the Pepsi around. They played little games like hide and go seek. Some of the children chased him and he went into the woods. [REDACTED] got into a fight and nailed [REDACTED] teeth around the rope of the tent. Vincent had to take [REDACTED] to his mother.

When they returned it was getting dark. They began to play a game with the flashlights. Each of the children and Vincent had partners. They found everyone but [REDACTED] and Vincent. Vincent came out of the woods when [REDACTED] poured kerosene over the fire and cursed at him. About 8:00 PM they went to bed. Vincent's sister, [REDACTED] and her fiancée came out of the woods with fire crackers.

About 9:00 PM they played a dare game. [REDACTED] asked him to pretend to jerk off. He pretended to jerk off with his clothes on using gestures in a jerking motion in his genital area. There were other dares such as run around the fire in their underwear and to kiss Vincent on the lips. Vincent also pulled down his pants and mooned them. [REDACTED] denied that he was touched in any manner that can be construed as sexual abuse.

[REDACTED]

On February 19, 1986, Detective Neil A. Cuomo of the Winslow Township Police Department, Investigator Reginald Beckett and the investigating worker interviewed [REDACTED] in the Winslow Township Police Department. [REDACTED] is 14 years old and is an 8th grade student at [REDACTED] Middle School in Hammonton, New Jersey. [REDACTED] provided the following information: The incidents occurred from January 17th to January 19th on [REDACTED] in Elm, New Jersey. Vincent took alcohol on the camping trip and provided dirty magazines with naked woman and man and women making love. Vincent treated him special. He left him in charge and allowed him to chop wood first. Vincent promised to take them to Malibu and the Poconos. While sitting around the fire, [REDACTED] sat on Vincent's knee. Vincent asked them were they all virgins. He slept next to Vincent and the first night of the trip Vincent had blood shot eyes and appeared to be on drugs. He has been a member of the Boy Scouts for five months. They met every Monday.

On April 1, 1986, [REDACTED] gave a statement to investigator Reginald Beckett in the Winslow Township Police Department. Detective Cuomo also was present during the statement. [REDACTED] confirmed that Vincent gave the children alcohol, mooned with his pants off, took them on the iced lake and took pictures. He denied being touched or asked to participate in any sexual activity.

On April 1, 1986 Investigator Reginald Beckett took a statement from [REDACTED] in the Office of Detective Neil Cuomo of the Winslow Township Police Department. [REDACTED] is 13 years old and also confirmed playing the dare game, the liquor, taking pictures on the iced lake and taking pictures with no clothes on. He denied being touched and did not witness any other sexual activity during the trip.

[REDACTED] is 15 years old and was interviewed by Detective Cuomo of the Winslow Township Police Department. He gave a statement to Detective Cuomo on April 7, 1986. [REDACTED] confirmed the previous information.

[REDACTED] is 12 years old and was interviewed by Detective Cuomo of the Winslow Township Police Department. He gave a statement to Detective Cuomo on April 7, 1986. [REDACTED] also confirmed the previous information.

B. Statement of Alleged Perpetrator

Vincent Glazewski

Vincent Glazewski is reported to be approximately 23 years old. He was not interviewed by the investigating worker at the request of Investigator Reginald Beckett of the Camden County Prosecutor's Office. He was charged with ten charges of endangering the welfare of minors.

D. Statement of Institutional Administrator or Other Staff

The investigating worker interviewed William Ridge, Scout Executive, Thomas E. Sweeney, Council Commissioner and Francis Kizer, Executive of the Nawakwa District of Boy Scouts of America on February 25, 1986. Vincent Glazewski was a volunteer selected by the Volunteer Committee Chairman. The troop was formed in December through the Presbyterian Church in Hammonton, New Jersey. The Commissioner is assigned to work with churches in selecting volunteers. The Commissioner knew of Vincent. They are not permitted to do a background check.

F. Child's Location

All the children reside with their parents.

IV. Evaluation

Though no touching or sexual contact was involved in the activities of the children, showing pornographic magazines, taking clothes off to explore genitals are considered forms of sexual abuse. Thus sexual abuse is substantiated.

- A. By the institution - suspended Vincent's activities with the troop.
- B. By the investigating unit - none.

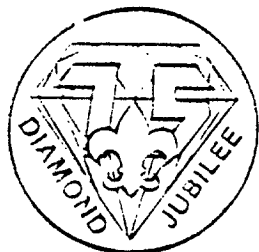

Dear Paul:

Follow up to the above case matter:

- 1) V. Glazewski pleaded guilty to a 4th degree charge of endangering the welfare of minor on 5 counts.
- 2) He will receive 18 months jail.
- 3) Because he had been on probation for similar charges he has violated probation and will be tried again on that violation and will receive up to 3 years jail.
- 4) I (Scout Executive) did not have to testify as per subpoena.
- 5) A public defendant lawyer (Joseph Moran) was assigned to Mr. Glazewski.
- 6) All above information from Camden County Assistant Prosecutor Ritza Blasini. Comments from Blasini to me (telephone): "I could not prove the case with these boys"... "they are older boys"... "no boys said he actually hurt them"... "they kind of liked him"... "they were willing participants" (9/24/86).

It is my opinion that a civil suit is still a real possibility. However, to date, there has been no verbal or written contact with the Council in this reference. Will keep you informed of any further development.

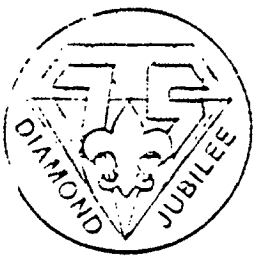

Dear Harold:

Following is the basic info regarding a potential child abuse case which may develop in the Council. This is merely an alert, no papers have been served, no verbal statements, however, it is my personal opinion that there is a better than good chance for this to occur. I certainly hope not, but prefer to be prepared. Enclosed is our complete Council file on this matter. Our Council President has been kept informed as matters unfold. Our Council Legal advisor has a complete file, is prepared, and, attempting to gather further information.

Following are the "highlights" of this potential case:

- 1) New Troop organized in December-1985 at Hammonton Presbyterian Church (Hammonton, N.J.).
- 2) Vincent W. Glazewski (CC) took Scouts on first camp out in January. Alleged "sexual oriented" activities took place, including photographs.
- 3) Glazewski removed as Scout leader by Council.
- 4) Meeting with [Redacted] (son: [Redacted] by Council Executive and Council Commissioner. Summation of meeting:
 - 1) She was very positive about need of Scouting for her son,
 - 2) son undergoing therapy, 3) arrangements made for son to attend summer camp with good church Troop.
- 5) Glazewski arrested by Winslow Township Police Department on 10 counts of child abuse. [Redacted] claims he has pleaded guilty (rumor) and is to be tried this week.
- 6) [Redacted] made statement to office secretary, that her lawyer said that Boy Scouts are liable for not checking out Glazewski's background. It is now known, he has had a record of previous criminal activity.

Our Council lawyer is Henry G. Broome, Jr. (card attached), a Vice President of the Council and most recent past Council President. He is presently securing additional legal information on the case.
