11 Bruce R. Douglas, one of the Judges of the above-named Court,  
12 commencing on the 16th day of October, 1986, commencing at  
13 approximately 10:00 o'clock a.m., at the Courthouse, City of  
14 Buffalo, County of Wright, and State of Minnesota.

21 Charles E. Paschke, Esq., appeared as counsel for

23 Kenneth John Bobrowske, the Defendant.

1 THE COURT: Call the matter of State versus  
2 Kenneth John Bobrowske.

3 We are here this morning for a joint hearing,  
4 sentencing hearing on Files 1248, 1344 and 1249.

5 You are Mr. Bobrowske?

6 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, your Honor.

7 THE COURT: You are appearing here with  
8 Mr. Paschke, is that correct?

9 THE DEFENDANT: That's correct, your Honor.

10 THE COURT: And, Ms. Stesniak, you are appearing  
11 on behalf of the State?

12 MS. STESNIAK: That's correct, your Honor.

13 THE COURT: The files reflect that on I believe  
14 it was September 19th Mr. Bobrowske appeared before  
15 Judge Swenson and I believe entered pleas of guilty. The  
16 obvious intent of everyone was that pleas of guilty be  
17 entered in three files to three separate charges of  
18 criminal sexual conduct in the second degree, in violation  
19 of Minnesota Statute 609.345, Subd.1(A). Is that the  
20 understanding of Counsel as to the intent and effect of  
21 that charge?

22 MR. PASCHKE: Yes, it is, your Honor.

23 MS. STESNIAK: Yes, it is, your Honor.

24 THE COURT: It appears Judge Swenson is  
25 unavailable, and so I'm here today to proceed with

1 sentencing.

2 Ms. Stesniak, does the State have any objection if I  
3 handle the sentencing?

4 MS. STESNIAK: No, your Honor.

5 THE COURT: Mr. Paschke, do you?

6 MR. PASCHKE: No, your Honor.

7 THE COURT: Mr. Bobrowske, do you?

8 THE DEFENDANT: No, your Honor.

9 THE COURT: I have reviewed the transcript of  
10 the hearing that was held on September 19th, and it appears  
11 very clear to me that you did enter a factual basis for the  
12 pleas to the three charges in each of these three files,  
13 but the transcript does not reflect you expressly entered  
14 a plea to each of the three charges, so just to make sure  
15 that it's very clear to you and very clear to me, what we  
16 have done here, and so that the record accurately reflects  
17 what's being done, I would like to have you enter pleas  
18 again before me.

19 Is that agreeable with Counsel?

20 MR. PASCHKE: It is, your Honor.

21 MS. STESNIAK: Yes, your Honor.

22 THE COURT: And with you, Mr. Bobrowske?

23 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, your Honor.

24 THE COURT: Mr. Bobrowske, would you approach the  
25 Bench, please, with Mr. Paschke?

1           The first thing in File 1249, in that file you've  
2           been charged with criminal sexual conduct in the second  
3           degree, in violation of Minnesota Statute 609.343, Subd.1(A),  
4           therein defining the maximum penalty as five years in prison,  
5           a \$30,000 fine, or both prison and fine. That offense is  
6           alleged to have occurred in August 1983 in Howard Lake, in  
7           the City of, Wright County, and involves a juvenile with  
8           the initials of [REDACTED], alleged to be age 12 at that time, to  
9           that charge, Mr. Bobrowske, how do you plead, guilty or not  
10          guilty?

11                   THE DEFENDANT: Guilty, your Honor.

12                   THE COURT: All right. And then in File 1344,  
13          which contains a Complaint issued by the Wright County  
14          Attorney charging you with criminal sexual conduct in the  
15          second degree, in violation of Minnesota Statute 609.343,  
16          Subd.1(A), likewise therein defining the penalty as 15  
17          years in prison or a \$30,000 fine or both, which is alleged  
18          to have occurred on or about the summer of 1983 in the  
19          City of Howard Lake in Wright County, and which involves  
20          a juvenile with initials [REDACTED] to that charge, Mr. Bobrowske,  
21          how do you plead?

22                   THE DEFENDANT: Guilty, your Honor.

23                   THE COURT: And then in File 1249, which contains  
24          a Complaint issued by the Wright County Attorney charging  
25          you originally with the offense of criminal sexual conduct in

1 the first degree, in violation of Minnesota Statute 609.342,  
2 Subd.1(A), which was amended by the Wright County Attorney's  
3 office on September 19th to the lesser charge of criminal  
4 sexual conduct in the second degree, in violation of  
5 Minnesota Statute 609.343, Subd.1(A), and which amended  
6 charge bears a maximum punishment of 15 years in prison or  
7 a \$30,000 fine or both, so that you are then charged with  
8 that amended charge and which charges is alleged to have  
9 occurred on or about the summer of 1985 in the City of  
10 Howard Lake, in Wright County, and which involves a  
11 juvenile with initials [REDACTED] to that amended charge of  
12 criminal sexual conduct in the second degree, how do you  
13 plead, guilty or not guilty?

14 THE DEFENDANT: Guilty, your Honor.

15 THE COURT: All right. Now, Mr. Bobrowske, was  
16 it clear to you on September 19th that you were then  
17 intending to plead guilty to all three of these charges?

18 THE DEFENDANT: That is correct, your Honor.

19 THE COURT: And I assume you remember at that  
20 time you had gone over what we call a Petition to Enter a  
21 Plea of Guilty, is that correct?

22 THE DEFENDANT: That is correct.

23 THE COURT: And you had prepared and discussed  
24 with your attorney a Petition to Plead Guilty in each of  
25 these files with regard to each of these charges of criminal

1 sexual conduct in the second degree, do you remember that?

2 THE DEFENDANT: That's correct.

3 THE COURT: Each of these three files contains  
4 a separate Petition for each of those three charges, and  
5 do you understand that those three Petitions are pertaining  
6 to those three charges as we've discussed them this  
7 morning?

8 THE DEFENDANT: That is correct.

9 THE COURT: Then do you remember that at the  
10 hearing on September 19th you were asked about those  
11 Petitions, and that you agreed that those were your  
12 signatures on those three separate Petitions?

13 THE DEFENDANT: That is correct, your Honor.

14 THE COURT: And then Ms. Stesniak I believe asked  
15 you a series of questions regarding the rights you have and  
16 the procedures that we follow in these cases, do you  
17 remember that?

18 THE DEFENDANT: That's correct.

19 THE COURT: She asked you about your right to  
20 an attorney, your right to remain silent, your right to a  
21 trial, your right to have the witnesses appear and testify,  
22 your right to remain silent, and the fact that if you plead  
23 guilty you were waiving all of those rights that she  
24 discussed with you at that time, do you remember that?

25 THE DEFENDANT: That is correct, your Honor.

1 THE COURT: And now that you have entered these  
2 pleas again before me, do you understand that you have all  
3 those rights, and that when you did plead guilty both  
4 September 19th and again this morning that in effect you are  
5 waiving all those rights?

6 THE DEFENDANT: That is correct, your Honor.

7 THE COURT: Okay. Now one further thing, on  
8 September 19th Ms. Stesniak asked you a series of questions  
9 relating to these three charges, and on September 19th you  
10 answered her questions and basically admitted that what it  
11 says in each of these Complaints, including the amended  
12 Complaint, what it says about you and about your conduct is  
13 true, do you remember that?

14 THE DEFENDANT: That is correct, your Honor.

15 THE COURT: And are you confirming here today  
16 the answers that you gave under oath on September 19th with  
17 regard to your activities and the conduct that you engaged  
18 in that led to these three charges?

19 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, your Honor.

20 THE COURT: So are you basically telling me here  
21 again as you did Judge Swenson that you believe you are  
22 guilty of those three charges?

23 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, your Honor.

24 THE COURT: Okay. Is there anything you would like  
25 to say regarding the facts that you disclosed to Judge



1 Swenson on September 19th, anything you would like to say  
2 in addition to the answers that you gave on that day?

3 THE DEFENDANT: No, your Honor.

4 THE COURT: Is there anything that you would like  
5 to say regarding the rights that you have or that you waived  
6 on September 19th or that again you waived today?

7 THE DEFENDANT: No, your Honor.

8 THE COURT: Have any questions about the  
9 procedures we follow or the fact that I've asked you all of  
10 this here again today?

11 THE DEFENDANT: No, your Honor.

12 THE COURT: Okay. Counsel, do either of you wish  
13 to inquire further of Mr. Bobrowske before we proceed?

14 MS. STESNIAK: No, your Honor.

15 MR. PASCHKE: I do not, your Honor.

16 MS. STESNIAK: Your Honor, at this time I would  
17 move for imposition of sentence.

18 THE COURT: Before granting that, I would like the  
19 record to reflect that I have reviewed the transcripts and  
20 heard Mr. Bobrowske's responses here today. With regard  
21 to File 1248, it appears to the Court that you committed  
22 acts which constitute the offense of criminal sexual conduct  
23 in the second degree as described in that file, further  
24 appears to the Court you have knowingly, willingly and  
25 voluntarily waived your rights and entered your plea in that

1 regard, your plea is accepted, received and recorded and you  
2 are judged duly convicted of that offense.

3 With regard to File 1344 it appears to the Court that  
4 you have committed acts which constitute that offense, and  
5 that you have knowingly and willingly waived your rights  
6 and voluntarily entered the plea in that file, and your  
7 plea is accepted, received and recorded and you are judged  
8 duly convicted of the offense of criminal sexual conduct in  
9 the second degree as described in the Complaint in that  
10 file.

11 With regard to File 1249, it appears that you have  
12 committed acts which constitute the offense of criminal  
13 sexual conduct in the second degree, the amended charge in  
14 that file, and further appears to the Court that your plea  
15 was knowingly, voluntarily and intelligently entered, your  
16 plea is accepted, received and recorded and you are judged  
17 duly convicted of the amended charge of criminal sexual  
18 conduct in the second degree in that file.

19 A Presentence Investigation was ordered and returned,  
20 and I assume, Ms. Stesniak, you have had a chance to review  
21 that investigation?

22 MS. STESNIAK: Yes, your Honor. I would concur  
23 with the recommendations to the Court in keeping with the  
24 plea agreement.

25 THE COURT: Mr. Paschke, have you had a chance to

1 review that Presentence Investigation, also?

2 MR. PASCHKE: Yes, I have.

3 THE COURT: Do you or Mr. Bobrowske have any  
4 factual information that you would like to add to what is  
5 contained in that report?

6 MR. PASCHKE: No, we do not.

7 THE COURT: Do you have any objection to  
8 proceeding at this time with sentencing?

9 MR. PASCHKE: No, your Honor, except I would move  
10 the Court on behalf of Mr. Bobrowske that the Court execute  
11 the first two charges concurrent with the third charge,  
12 Court File No. 1249, because probation would be more onerous  
13 than execution of those sentences.

14 THE COURT: You and Mr. Bobrowske recognize the  
15 negotiation made in this case provides for an executed  
16 sentence of 30 months?

17 MR. PASCHKE: That's correct.

18 THE COURT: And what you are requesting then is  
19 that the sentence on all three charges be executed, is that  
20 correct?

21 MR. PASCHKE: Yes.

22 THE COURT: Ms. Stesniak?

23 MS. STESNIAK: I have no objection to that, your  
24 Honor.

25 THE COURT: Mr. Bobrowske, is there anything that

1           you would like to say or anything you would like to advise  
2           the Court of before I proceed?

3           THE DEFENDANT: No, your Honor.

4           THE COURT: Okay. In File No. 1248, wherein you  
5           standing convicted of criminal sexual conduct in the second  
6           degree for the offenses alleged to have occurred during the  
7           summer of 1983, it is the sentence of the Court and the  
8           judgment of the law that as punishment therefor you be  
9           committed to the Commissioner of Corrections of the State of  
10          Minnesota for a period of 21 months, that execution of this  
11          sentence issue forthwith.

12          With regard to File 1344, it is the sentence of the  
13          law and the judgment of the Court that as punishment there-  
14          for you be committed to and confined in the custody of the  
15          Commissioner of Corrections for the State of Minnesota for  
16          a period of 26 months, said sentence to run concurrent to  
17          the sentence just imposed in this File 1248. Let execution  
18          of that sentence issue forthwith.

19          With regard to File 1249, it is the sentence of the  
20          law and judgment of the Court that as punishment therefor  
21          you be committed to the Commissioner of Corrections for the  
22          State of Minnesota for a period of 30 months, which sentence  
23          shall run concurrent to the sentences just imposed in File  
24          1248 and 1344. Let execution of that sentence issue forth-  
25          with.

1           You are remanded to the custody of the Wright County  
2 Sheriff for delivery to the Commissioner of Corrections at  
3 the Minnesota Correctional Facility in Bayport, Minnesota,  
4 commonly known as Stillwater Prison.

5           The record should reflect I recognize this is a  
6 dispositional departure from the sentence, presumed sentence  
7 under the Minnesota Sentencing Guidelines, that is the  
8 Minnesota Sentencing Guidelines would provide in your case  
9 that each of these sentences be imposed but that you not  
10 be sentenced to prison. However, the dispositional departure  
11 that I've made, that is actually sentencing you to prison,  
12 appears appropriate at this time to the Court first in view  
13 of your plea agreement and the charge concession that was  
14 made here. Secondly, in view of the number of incidents and  
15 the age of the victims. Finally, in view of the fact that  
16 were sentencing to occur in any other manner you would in  
17 all probability be spending a substantial period of time in  
18 County jail and possibly in a treatment facility which  
19 in duration would probably last longer than the sentence  
20 which I have imposed upon you.

21           I assume, Ms. Stesniak, that you can assist the Court  
22 in preparing an appropriate report pursuant to the Minnesota  
23 Sentencing Guidelines?

24           MS. STESNIAK: Yes, your Honor.

25           THE COURT: Mr. Bobrowske, I know that while you are

1 in prison there will be available to you certain courses  
2 of treatment, counseling and other rehabilitative type  
3 resources, and I urge that you consider participating in  
4 them and volunteering for such counseling and in such  
5 programs that you can spend that time advantageously to  
6 you and advantageously to your family. As we all sit here  
7 we know you are going to return to the community in a period  
8 of time, and it would be my hope and expectation that you  
9 would return having had some counseling so that these kinds  
10 of offenses would not reoccur.

11 THE DEFENDANT: I shall with all intent, your  
12 Honor, to get as much help and so forth as I can.

13 THE COURT: Anything further, Counsel?

14 MS. STESNIAK: Your Honor, I believe the Defendant  
15 spent three days in jail; would the Court's intention be to  
16 give credit for time served?

17 THE COURT: I assume that was at the time of his  
18 arrest?

19 MS. STESNIAK: Yes, your Honor.

20 THE COURT: The record should reflect he serve  
21 those three days in the Wright County Jail at the time of  
22 the arrest, and the law provides that he automatically  
23 receives credit for that, so that information will be  
24 transmitted to the Commissioner of Corrections.

25 Okay, that will be all.

1 MR. PASCHKE: Thank you, your Honor.

2 THE DEFENDANT: Thank you, your Honor.



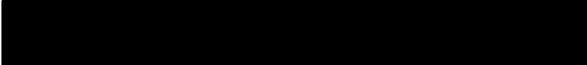

The council office has received information concerning Ken Bobrowski, registered as Troop Committee Chairman. This information is sensitive and should be handled in a confidential manner.

Mr. Bobrowski has been arrested for criminal sexual conduct. The court case is pending. This conduct is an act of unacceptable nature and would appear that he is unfit to give leadership to youth in the Boy Scouts of America.

The unit and the chartered organization must take steps to remove the above named individual from leadership in the troop, until final disposition has been made by the courts.

We would also appreciate your assistance in obtaining hard evidence about the situation, such as police reports, court records and signed statements by principals filing complaint against Ken Bobrowski; also, any newspaper clippings which might appear.
