## Man sentenced to 55 years for rape of girl, 10

By JIM MORRISON

NORFOLK — Charles Ernest Ladison, who admitted having numerous sexual relationships with children, was sentenced Wednesday to 55 years in prison for raping a 10-year-old girl he met at church.

Circuit Judge W. Moultrie Guerry sentenced him to 80 years but suspended 25. He also placed Ladison, who the prosecutor said robbed the girl of her youth, on 20 years' probation after his release. He will be eligible for parole in about 12 years:

Police say the quiet, almost shy, 35-year-old Ladison (its the profile of a pedophile — someone whose primary sexual desire is for children.

Once, when Ladison was 23 and home on leave from the Army, he and another man fondled twin 13-year-old sisters who had been babysitting for the family, a probation officer testified. During the next 12 years, Ladison said, he was involved with at least six more girls, ages 13 to 16, and was never caught.

The relationship that is sending him to prison lasted nine months and included intercourse at least 30 times with a girl who attended services with him at Victory Tabernacle Baptist Church, police said. At the time, Ladison was on probation for a 1982 conviction for aggravated sexual battery of a 13-year-old girl.

Ladison, who lived in the 200 block of W. 27th St., pleaded guilty Jan. 23 to raping the 10-year-old.

Lenita Eilis, an assistant commonwealth's attorney, argued that he should be given a life term, the maximum sentence. The victim, she said, "is-going to have to live the rest of a her life with the guilt of his actions."

## Child molesting: It's a crime of trust

NORFOLK - People trusted Charles Er-

He attended religious services several times a week, drove a bus that took youngsters to worship and worked around the church building.

"He was the kind of guy a preacher would like to have around the church—if he wasn't a sex offender," said Jonathan Harnden, a probation officer.

Ladison, according to testimony in Circuit Court, had intercourse with a 10-year-old girl an estimated 30 times from September 1982 to July 1983. He met her white she was a passenger on a bus he drove for Victory Tabernacle Baptist Church in the 3800 block of East Princess Ame Road in Norfolk.

The 34-year-old laborer, who lived in the 200 block of West 27th Street, pleaded guilty vlast-Monday to rape. Lenita Ellis, an assistant Commonwealth's attorney, said she will seek a life term when Ladis in is sentenced in March.

When he was arrested in August, Ladison, was on probation in another sex case involving a child. In that case, he pleaded guitty in December 1982 to a charge of aggravated sexual battery of a 13-year-old grif earlier that year. He met her while serving as a volunteer bus driver for another church, Gateway Free-will Baptist Church in Virginia Beach. At that time, he was also an assistant scoutmaster of a Norfolk Boy Scout troop.

In the more recent case, police said Ladison befriended the 10-year-old after he started driving a bus in September 1982 for Victory Tabernacie Baptist Church. At the time, he was awaiting trial on the first sex charge. He continued to widrive the church's bus leven though he was forbidden to have contact with the children as a condition of his probation.

Parents at Victory Tabernacle Baptist were not told of Ladison's problems with the law. And Wayne McBride, an investigator for Norfolk's Family Sexual Trauma Unit, said Ladison had convinced the 10-year-old's mother that he should take care of the girl on weekends. The policeman said the girl spent weekends at the Ladison home.

Theirs became a secret relationship: weekends together, long walks and stolen moments of intimacy, said McBride. And,

McBride said, Ladison offered to pay the girl's way through the school at Victory Baptist. He bought her gifts and meals.

McBride testified that the child's goal was to attend the church's school. Ladison, he said, promised to make that possible:

Later, a bond grew. "I asked did she said like they were living like musband and wile, and she said yes, she felt they were," the policeman said in an interview. "Even now she's protective of him; she doesn't want him going to jail."

The first time he molested her, McBride said, "was at the church."

Ladison, a tail man, his black hair flecked with gray, has a puffy face, an ample midsection and a quiet courtroom denseanor. He has been held at the City Jail since his arrest in

August.
As part of the probation imposed by Circuit Court Judge W. Moultrie Guerry, Ladison was ordered to stay away from children and to undergo therapy for an alcohol problem.
Since the Rev. Richard Mears, pastor of Victory Tabernacie Baptist Church, said he had training as an alcohol abuse counselor, Ladison's probation officer, Jonathan Harnden, allowed Mears to conduct the therapy.
"He knew Ladison and his wife and felt he could best help him with his problem," said Harnden.

A psychiatrist's report said Ladison probably would not repeat the offense if he did not drink. It gave no indication that he might be a pedophile, authorities said. 24

The relationship between Ladison and the In-year-old continued undiscovered through his presentencing psychiatric evaluation in connection with the first child-molestation charge and after he was placed on probation in January, McBride testified Monday.

Harnden said he sent Mears a letter with the conditions of Ladison's probation, including the prohibition on his being with children. Mears "was supposed to ensure that he had no contact with children around the church," Harnden said. "If at any time Ladison did not cooperate, he was to let me know Immediately, Of course, he didn't do that."

Despite the conditions of his probation, Mears permitted Ladison to drive the church bus, McBride said in court. The minister also did not tell parents that Ladisonwas a convicted child molester, he added.



#### REPORT ON CHARLES E. LADISON

On Sunday afternoon, April 25, 1982, I was notified by a neighbor who lives near the Villard Scout House (our meeting hall) that he had seen Charles Ladison bring a car load of boys and girls to the meeting hall at about 8 P.M. on Saturday night, April 24, 1982. The neighbor said they were there about two hours and seemed to be having a party. No meeting had been scheduled, so I decided to check into the matter. Upon arrival at the meeting hall, I found a trash can with about 24 beer bottles in it. The room was messed up. There was beer spilled on the floor. There was no evidence of a break-in.

Since Charles Ladison was an Assistant Scoutmaster in Troop 15, and also the Troop Charlain, I still could not be positive he was responsible for the teer. I also wanted to be sure the neighbor was correct with his identification. I notified Assistant Scoutmaster Steve Perkins about my suspicions and he agreed we could confront Charles Ladison before jumping to conclusions. I was not able to locate Ladison that afternoon.

On Monday, April 26, at about 5:30 P.M., I received a phone call from Assistant Scoutmaster Gary Anderson. He was upset and angry. He told he had to talk to me about Ladison. I agreed to meet Gary at the meeting hall before the meeting. At about 6:30 P.M., Steve Perkins and I met with Gary and his son,

They told us that Ladison had thrown a beer party in the meeting hall for eight children, ranging in asse from 10 to 15. Two of the boys were from

for eight children, ranging in age from 10 to 15. Two of the boys were from Troop 15. They also said one of the girls had been molested by Ladison. They also said Ladison was supposed to be taking the group to a skating rink.

At this point I realized we were involved in a very serious matter and asked Steve Perkins to call the Norfolk Police and ask for assistance. They sent Detective Daphne White-Clifton, who took over. The other parents who could be reached were called in and four of the children signed statements. Charles Ladison was charged with numerous law violations, and later arrested. I also notified him that he was to make no attempts to contact members of the troop and that he was dismissed from our scouting program.

I also made two attempts on Tuesday to contact the District Scout Fxecutive without success. He was contacted later by Steve Perkins. The situation was explained to him. I don't think either of realized the local news media would take such an interest in the story.

# Boy Scout leader arrested

### Accused of staging beer party for 8 boys and girls

NORFOLK — A Vietnam veteran who served as a Boy Scout troop chaplain, assistant scout leader and volunteer bus driver for a Baptist Sunday school has been charged with six counts of contributing to the deliquency of a minor and one charge of fondling a teen-age girl.

les E. Ladison, 33, of Norfolk, is free on \$1,500 bond pending a preliminary hearing June 11 in Norfolk Juvenile Court, according to Detective Daphne White-Clifton.

The fondling charge is a felony, punishable by one to five years in prison.

Detective White-Clifton said Ladison lived in the 1800 block of St. Denis Ave. and moved to the 6300 block of Adair Ave. the day after his arrest.

f All seven charges stem from a beerdrinking party Ladison allegedly held last month at a Boy Scout meeting hall for eight boys and girls between the ages of 10 and 15. He reportedly gave the youngsters beer instead of taking them roller skating as had been promised.

Two of the boys, one 13 and one 14, were members of Ladison's Willard Boy Scotton in Lafayette Shores, according scoutmaster Hansel Price. The others at the party reportedly were members of Gateway Freewill Baptist Church in Virginia Beach where Ladison formerly drove a Sunday school bus.

A pastor at the church, who asked that his name not be used, said today that Ladison had been a bus driver there but was "released two weeks ago because of some rumors we had received." He said he was not familiar with the rumors and that Ladison was asked to leave by the church's pastor, the Rev. Dale Burden. Burden was unavailable for comment.

Price said he learned of the beer party on April 26 in a telephone call from the father of one of the boys who had been with Ladison at the party the previous Saturday night.

"He was very upset about it and wanted to meet with me," said Price. The mother of one of the girls also called and Price set up a meeting with some of the parents and the Norfolk detective.

According to Price, Ladison took the children and a case of beer to the meeting house. Ladison reportedly was drinking heavily, according to Price, and each child apparently had one or two beers.

The children later told police Ladison started a fire in the fireplace and the group sat in a circle and talked. At one point, according to the detective, Ladison asked one of the girls to sit on his lap while he allegedly fondled her.

"We were a little bit naive in accepting him at face value," said Price.

He said he has nine assistant scoutmasters. One of them had met Ladison at a church several months ago and Ladison expressed an interest in working with a Boy Scout troop. Ladison has been in the Norfolk area about five months after moving here from Watertown, N.Y.

"I accepted Chuck Ladison because he was involved very much in church work.

I assumed because a person was accepted by the church and involved as a volunteer that I'd have no cause not to accept him," Price said.

"As far as I was concerned, he was a respectable member of the community. He lived in the neighborhood. He was married."

Ladison was taking a four-week training course required by the Boy Scouts of America for troop leaders. He had been named the troop chaplain and had a key to the meeting house in Lafayette Shores.

Price said this was the first time in his 24 years in scouting that he has encountered problems with a volunteer leader.

"This can be a problem because the Boy Scouts of America have no cause to refuse an application unless we had some access to their (applicant's) records, which we don't."

Price said Ladison's application was sent to the national Boy Scout office in Texas for review. Ladison was sent a membership card by the Boy Scouts.

"I'm sure the Boy Scout office is receiving 1,000 applications a day, It would take a tremendous amount of time to check each case. You can't hire a detective to check each new applicant."

According to police in St. Lawrence County, N.Y., where Watertown is located, a Charles E. Ladison, whose date of birth matches that of the Ladison arrested in Norfolk, was convicted of petty larceny in August 1980 for charging purchases at five stores to his employer's account.

## Leader charged after beer session with Boy Scouts, girls

Charles E. Ladison, 33, who was the troop chapfain, was charged with six counts of contributing to the delinquency of a minor and one-felony charge of fondling and feeling, said a Detective Dahne White-Clifton. He was free on bond Monday.

The detective said Ladison had

told some Scouts he was a minister.
A secretary at the Gateway Freewill
Baptist Church confirmed that Lodison drove a Sunday school bus for
the congregation.

A New York native, Ladistin came to the Willard Scout Troop in Lafayette Shores as an assistant Scout leader about six months ago, said Hansel Price, the group's scoutmaster. Ladison was no longer connected with the Scouts, he said.

On the evening of April 24, Ms. White-Clifton said, Ladison picked up eight youths — four Boy Scouts and four girts from his church — at their homes, saying he was ta'ting them

roller skuting. But instead, she said, he took them to a Scout meeting house where he asked them if they wanted to get drunk. Their ages ranged from 10 to 15, police suid.

Although some of the children protested that they wanted to skate, she said, all of them drank. The group drank five six-packs of beer in less than two hours, Ms. White-Clifton said, but most of them said they had only one or two cans.

"The ones I talked with had never had beer before," she said.

The children later told police that Ladison started a fire in the house's

Ireplace, and the Scouts sat in a circle and talked. At one point, the detective said, Ladison asked a 13-year-old girl to sit in his lap, and she complied. White-Clifton said that; according to witnesses, Ladison rubbed the girl's breasts and pelvic area. She did not protest verbally but got off his lap, the witnesses and the victim told police.

Ladison had promised to bring the children home around 10 p.m., but some arrived as late as midnight. Price said. Price learned of the incident the next day after some of the girls told their parents what had happened.

Parents of some of the other children found out about the drinking when they were called by Price or police. Ms. White-Clifton said.

The parents were shocked, she said. "They had no idea what had taken place,"

Ladison had been an "excellent youth; leader" while supervised, Price said. "He was very good with kids, maybe a little too good."

Ladison had been screened by local and national Scott offices because he had come from out of state, Price said, adding that Ladison came with good references from his church.
