

I have asked our Welfars Service to send you papers on Patricia Poley.


Thanks for the newspapers. We have placed these articles in our fils and we appropriate your calling our attention to the story on the Eagle Scouts. This was a good story.

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TOMS RIVER — William R. Pratt, 30, of 26 Sutton Pl., Silver Ridge Estates, has been held for Grand Jury action by Magistrate Benjamin Novins. He was released under \$10,000 bail, police said.

Four charges were filed against him, Detective John Hayes, investigating officer, said. Also assisting in the case were Police Capt. Richard C. Clement and Patrolman Peter Chafatelli.

Charges include contributing to the delinquency of minors; po-session of pornographic litera-ture; and unnatural sex acts with 14 and 15-year-old hovs. Pratt was under surveilance or

Dear Basil:

Another bit of unpleasantness on October 11th, William R. Pratt, Scoutmaster of Troop No. 50 sponsored by the Toms River Elks Club was picked up by the Dover Township Police, Toms River,

on a homosexual charge. He spent the night in the county jail.

On the morning of October 12th I was alerted and contacted the Police Department. I learned that the charges have been substantiated by affidavits. Later the same day I was advised that additional charges, including sodomy, were preferred. Bail reached \$14,500 on the three charges and Mr. Pratt being unable to raise same was recommitted to jail.

I contacted Pratt and the Police Department and I am afraid that the charges will stick. Mr. Pratt was formerly registered in Troop No. 20 at Asbury Park and came to us early this year. At the time I questioned Monmouth officials but nothing tangible could be pinned on this man. At the time of registration I voiced by opinion to the Exalted Ruler who is now chairman of the committee and, obviously, this man must be "red flagged" regardless of the outcome.
