

Former hospital official charged

A former St. Cloud Hospital official was charged Monday in Henneous County District Court with five counts of using minors in a sexual performance.

Robert Messersmith, 46, director of numan resources at the hospital until Nov. 18, allegedly took photos of at least nine teen-age boys posed in sexual positions. Brooklyn Center Police detective Cathy Hennessy said.

Police seized four large albums of the pictures when they arrested Messersmith at his Brooklyn Center home in September, she said.

Most of the boys, who ranged in age from 12 to 15, were from Messersmith's neighborhood.

He mer the coys through neighborhood youth groups, the Explorer Scouts, youth hockey and a variety of other sports. Hennessy said.

Messersmith also has three sons who introduced him to some of the boys, she said. His sons apparently were not aware of the photo sessions, however.

Dozens of boys may have posed for Messersmith over several years. Hennessy said.

"I couldn't guess at how many boys were involved. We know of at least nine, and there probably were a lot more than that," she said.

The boys were shown masturbating, or in sexual positions alone and with other boys. Usually, five or six boys were present. Hennessy said.

Many of the incidents took place during boating and camping trips around the state, are said.

The performances allegedly occurred in 1987 and 1988, but Hennessy said there was evidence they had been going on for as long as eight years.

In 1976. Messersmith was placed on two years' probation for sexually assaulting teen-age boys in New Hampshire, according to records in Salem (N.H.) District Court.

He was director of the Salem Boys Club at the time.

He was hired by St. Cloud Hospital in March 1987, said Mary Downs, public relations director.

Downs said the hospital conducted a background check, out failed to turn up information about his criminal record.

A hospital press release stated Messersmith also had been evaluated by an industrial psychologist and had good references from two previous employers.

He was given a paid medical leave of absence on Oct. 17, after hospital officials learned of his arrest. His employment ended on Nov. 18.

The maximum penalty for using minors in a sexual performance, a felony, is five years in prison and \$10,000. If it's a second offense, the fine could double to \$20,000.

Messersmith was released on his promise to appear in court again on April 17. He also must refrain from contact with any children except his own.

We note that you did not indicate anything for race on the Confidential Record Sheet. We assume he is caucasian, but would like to have this confirmed.



If you wish to have this decision reviewed, please write to me, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA leader should be reinstated.
