This letter is to inform you that the committee of Troop 739
Manhattan has asked for and received the resignation of its Scoutmaster, Edward A. Rodriquez. It was requested as a safeguard for
the boys in our troop, on the grounds of moral turpitude.

events leading up to our request and the following events he detailed
in the subsequent paragraph. The explanation may be sketchy in
spots as some actions were taken without my knowledge and learned
of them second hand.

It is difficult to ascertain as to where to begin with the logical point is to start when our Troop went to summer camp at TMR (July 6, 1964). The boys were to leave on July 6th but our Scoutmaster was to proceed to camp one day earlier (July 5th) with three boys in order to prepare the site and have other arrangements. On July 4th Ed Rodriquez was to meet Mr. a committee member and father of one of our Scouts, who was to drive them up there at 1:30 P.M. in order to load some equipment into his car for the stay at camp. dr Rodriquez did not show up. But at 3:00 P.M. another of our parents, Mr. dropped his son at Alpine. This was done due to the fact that Mr. was

spending the summer at Spring Valley and his son would then be able to spend the night with Ed Rodriquez at Alpine and meet Mr. for the trip early Sunday Morning. These Alpine arrangements were made without anyone knowing of it other then the Rodriquez. At 4:30 P.M. the same day, July 4th, Ed Rodriquez house and they then proceeded to load. appeared at Mr. had previously asked Ed Rodriduez the equipment. sleep overnight at his house Saturday night to facilitate early departure. Ed Rodriquez had previously claimed that he ha to work Saturday night and again repeated this on saturday The boys departed Sunday without any cocurrences remainder of the troop arrived at camp on Monday. early part of the following week Mr. and asked who had slept in his house over the weekend as the house did not have any answer was in a state of disorder. The situation rested until the return of the troop on July 19th. On July 19th Mr. proceeded to question as to who had slept in his house and the story evolved Rodriquez mad stayed overmight. also indicated that at this time Ed Rodriquez had engaged in sexual acts with him and had also done so previously on an to a Boy scout camp. He also indicated that two were also engaged ectivities with Ed Rodriquez. Mr. information he had gotten from his son and Mr.

began to question his son. His son, admitted to the episodes also. Both parents agreed then that Mr. would call Ed Rodriquez and ask for his resignation. I first became aware of wherein he admitted his this situation on Monday evening (July 20th) when I spoke to Mr. He also indicated that Ed Rodriquez had just called him and asked to see him personally on Wednesday, July 22nd. Mr. myself decrated to keep the situation known in as small as possible and as such invited the following people ourselves to the meeting with Ed Rodriquez.

- 3) Mr. Benjamin Munk Committee Treasurer
- also stated that his son was examined by a doctor and no evidence of disease was found at this time. We questioned Ed Rodriquez and he readily admitted his guilt. He also stated that the episodes were confined only to two scouts,

and that they occurred only 3-4 times with each. He didn't give any reason why he had chosen these by in particular but as a matter of fact these boys are small in Stature. boy had been questioned previously by his father and there weren't any indications that anything occurred. Ed Rodriquez also indicated La Rodriguez also indicated no involvement with that this is the first time that this had happened but those present were of the opinion that his activities definitely were repeated All through the questioning he indicated previously with others. remorse for what he had done and seemed quite penitent. We advised consequences of his acts and he appeared him of the possible legal does not wish to prosecute well aware of them. However, Mr. and Ed Rodriquez was informed of this with the proviso that he must seek psychiatric help artinform us of his efforts and progress. He was quite appreciative of our leniency and our efforts to help him help himself and as such our meeting came to an end. Before though he was requested not to divulge any information tie affair, nor was he to frequent our area. He

also was directed to send all records, merit badge applications to me. At this moment we feel that any connection we have had with Ed Rodriquez has been severed. The only future contacts with him will be to ascertain if he is following through on his promise to seek aid. We feel that we have been quite lucky in that this situation did not spread further and involve more of our troop members and we now must minimize the damage that has been done to the two scouts involved. One of our principal goals is no make the two boys aware of the fact that this matter has been treated confidentially and will not be revealed to anyone else. We have even gone so far as to concoct a reason why Ed Rodriguez has left the troop.

To my knowledge these are the events leading up to the resignation of our Scoutmaster. I hope I have clearly stated the facts and you concur in our course of action. If any other information is required feel free to contact me at my home of office. I hope that our experience will be of some benefit by insuring that Ed Rodriquez will not be allowed to hold any position any where in the Boy Scouts of America. In this way we can ease our consciences with respect to any other boy engaged in scouting coming into contact with him.
