



REPORT OF JULY 29 INCIDENT IN CROW CAMPSITE, CAMP KEN-ETIWA-PED

West Orange, N.J. (age 13) and Provisional Scoutmaster Faul Stokes,
347 Amherst Street, East Orange, N. J.

About 9:30 PM the Senior Patrol Leader, two Assistant Senior Patrol Leaders, and the Patrol Leaders were told to convene for a Green Bar meeting which lasted about ten minutes. Prior to the announcement of the meeting Assistant Senior Patrol Leader had been told by the Scoutmaster to stay after the meeting was over. No specific reason was given at the time.

At the conclusion of the Green Bar meeting, the Scout sat on the Scoutmaster's bunk. The Scoutmaster properties arm around him and talked to the Scout about how the Scout's conduct should be improved - table manners, laughing at meals, etc. He started to tickle the Scout on the legs. The Scout protested that he was tired and wanted to leave so got up. The Scoutmaster told him to come back as he had not finished talking to him. Both then sat down again on the Scoutmaster's bunk. The Scoutmaster told the Scout to move closer when this was done the Scoutmaster started to tickle the Scout's legs again and go up inside the Scout's shorts. He played with the Scout until there was an emission. When this was over he asked the Scout if he were mad at him. The boy, afraid something else might happen, said, "No".

The Assistant Provisional Scoutmaster was on his day off.

At no time during the incident were the trousers opened or removed.

The Scout left the tent and rather than move back to his own tent where his tent mate, Stuart Weiss, was a heavy sleeper, moved into the tent of David Stern and Michael Korba. The Scout was

afraid he might he approached again before the night was over.

Scout Stuart Weiss along with Scouts Michael Korba and David Stern were told of the experience by

The matter was brought to the attention of Program Director Brian Archimbaud and Director Arthur Koeppel immediately after breakfast.

Provisional Scoutmaster Paul Stokes, when faced with the story at first said it was not really that way but when pressed for details, pauded and indicated that that was about it.

Paul's statement was made in the presence of Archimbaud and Koeppel.

Scout has read the above and agrees with the statements as noted above, the only exception being the last paragraph. He was not present when Paul Stokes Date: July 30, 1968 was meeting with Archimbaud and Koeppel.
