

Archdiocese of St. Paul & Minneapolis Timeline

- May 25, 2013 The Minnesota Child Victims Act becomes law
- May 29, 2013 Doe 1 files case against the Archdiocese
- October 2013 The Catholic Community Foundation changes its dissolution clause which previously stated all assets would go to the Archdiocese upon dissolution
- September 2013 Several abuse survivors bring claims against the Archdiocese under the Child Victims Act
- December, 2013 Catholic Services Appeal Foundation forms to move Archdiocese revenue into separate foundation
- June 2014 Catholic Charities changes dissolution clause designating other non-profit organizations as recipients of its assets instead of the Archdiocese
- January 16, 2015 Archdiocese files Chapter 11 bankruptcy
- February 2015 Catholic Cemeteries changes its website to remove the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis from its title and also removed references to its board (which lists the Archbishop as its head)
- June 15, 2015 Archbishop John Nienstedt resigns
- July, 2015 Catholic Finance Corporation changes its articles of incorporation which previously said it was for the sole benefit of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis
