

The Justice Department acknowledged to INSLAW in pretrial discovery that Meese recalled talking to Garment about the case in the fall of 1986.

Ratiner was soon asked to leave the law firm of Dickstein. Shapiro & Morin. INSLAW says in court papers that Ratiner was told Garment was instrumental in the decision to ask him to leave.

Garment called the allegation "pure baloney" but acknowledged that he was questioned about it two months ago by public-integrity investigators. The current status of the Meese investigation could not immediately be determined.

Say: French government cares, but U.S. doesn't

BATAVIA (AP) — If the French government can get its Middle East hostages released, the U.S. government should be able to do the same, said Peugy Say, the sister of captive American journalist Terry Anderson.

"I hope they pursue whatever channels the French used, but I doubt they will," Say said Thursday, "It almost appears that the French government places a higher priority on the lives of their people."

Three French hostages, including one who said he was a ceilmate of Anderson, were released Wednesday by their pro-tranian captors. High-ranking officials of the French government apparently negotiated for their release.

For their release. U.S. Bankruptcy Judge George F. Bason Jr. found in INSLAW's favor and ordered the Justice Department to pay the company \$6.8 million after ruling that government officials engaged in "trickery, fraud and deceit" to steal the company's software. The department is appealing.

Conversion of the case from a Chapter 1t reorganization to a Chapter 7 liquidation would have put INSLAW out of business.

"What they are saying is that they know of no other solution to this situation than to let these men die." she said.

Anderson, chief Middle East correspondent for the Associated Press, has been held since March 16, 1985, the longest of any hostage.

One of the freed French hostages. Marcel Fontaine, said he was Anderson's cellmate and that he recently played chess and dominoes with him.

"It's good to know Terry is affect, but I'm arraid this doesn't necessarily mean anything will be forthcoming." Say said from her upstate New York home.


