**OPPOSITION OF OFFICIAL COMMITTEE OF UNSECURED CREDITORS TO
MOTION OF DEBTOR FOR ORDER ESTABLISHING DEADLINES FOR FILING
PROOFS OF CLAIM AND APPROVING FORM AND MANNER OF NOTICE
THEREOF**

The Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors (the “Committee”) objects to the Motion of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee (the “Archdiocese” or the “Debtor”) for Order Establishing Deadlines for Filing Proofs of Claim and Approving Form and Manner of Notice Thereof (the “Motion”).¹ In support of this Opposition, the Committee respectfully represents the following:

I.

INTRODUCTION

The overwhelming majority of the general unsecured claims that will be filed in this case are expected to be held by the survivors of alleged sexual abuse perpetrated by priests (and others) employed by the Archdiocese or for whom the Archdiocese is otherwise responsible (the “Abuse Survivors”). While only seventeen Abuse Survivors filed lawsuits pre-petition, the Committee believes there are hundreds of Abuse Survivors with claims against the Debtor. One priest alone, Father Lawrence Murphy, molested as many as two hundred boys while he worked

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at one school in the Archdiocese, St. John's School for the Deaf.² Two hundred possible casualties of one priest in one school. There are presently forty-four diocesan priests and former priests with substantiated claims of sexual abuse and one hundred and twenty-five Catholic schools in the Archdiocese.³ The math is staggering.

Not all Abuse Survivors reported their abuse. Many may still be reluctant to come forward. This reticence is a part of the pathology of sexual abuse, which was exponentially exacerbated by the failure of the Catholic Church and this Archdiocese to respond to sexual abuse reports and protect its young charges from pedophile priests. Father Murphy's victims, for example, began reporting their abuse as early as the 1950s. They told priests. They told nuns. They told the police. They told the district attorney. They reported the abuse to three archbishops, and yet, Father Murphy continued to work with deaf students and young people for another twenty-four years, and when he died, he died a priest.⁴

The Abuse Survivors who reported Father Murphy were both remarkable and rare. They were not telling on the creepy-looking pervert who hangs out at the liquor store across from the park. They were reporting on God's representative on Earth. Imagine how devastating it was when nothing was done to stop him. Perhaps more commonly, Abuse Survivors cope with the trauma by pushing away the memory of it. This denial, combined with the fact that many Abuse Survivors were abused as very young children, often leads to delayed reporting. Other Abuse Survivors do not come forward because of the stigma attached to sexual abuse, especially in the case of boys who are sexually molested by a man which brings with it the fear of homosexuality, a sin in the very church in which the Abuse Survivors were raised. Survivors also fail to come forward out of fear of disappointing family members who are still loyal Catholics, and still others may not have connected their suffering to the abuse. A grown man who was orally copulated as a child may not realize that his alcoholism or depression or inability to keep a job is a result of

that abuse. Finally, it will often take an Abuse Survivor a long time to actually decide to pursue his or her claim even after he realizes that he has one.

Identifying and notifying individuals holding potential abuse claims is no small task where, as here, there has been a concerted, well-orchestrated, decades-long cover-up, there may be living Abuse Survivors who were abused in the Archdiocese as long ago as 1940, Abuse Survivors may not have connected their suffering to the abuse or may be reluctant to come forward for other reasons, and the abuse may have occurred not just in one church or one parish but in one of the hundreds of Catholic Entities (as defined below) affiliated with the Archdiocese. At the very least, it is going to require much more extensive efforts by the Debtor than those proposed in the Motion to locate and serve Abuse Survivors, a longer notice period and more detailed descriptions of the Alleged Perpetrators (as defined below) in the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice. It will also necessitate that Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms are submitted to and handled by a neutral third party Claims Agent, not counsel to the Debtor. For these reasons (and others) which are detailed below, the Committee opposes the Motion.⁵

II

DISCUSSION

I. Terminology

There are a few terms which should be discussed as they appear in many of the documents and their definitions are important. First, throughout the Debtor's Motion, the Bar Date Order, the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim and the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice, the Debtor refers to the Abuse Survivors as "Victim/Survivors." The Abuse Survivors prefer not to be called "victims," and the Committee would request that all references to "Victim/Survivors" be changed to "Abuse Survivors."

Second, the Debtor proposes to include a List of Abusers in the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice Packages , but limits that list to diocesan priests who have substantiated claims of abuse.⁶ The Debtor refers to such individuals as “Abusers.” There are quite possibly additional abusers other than diocesan priests with substantiated claims for whose abuse the Archdiocese would be liable. For example, the Debtor might bear responsibility for acts of abuse committed by a priest or a nun from a religious order or a lay teacher that taught in a diocesan school or for a diocesan priest for whom there are not yet any substantiated claims of abuse. For those reasons, the Committee uses the broader term “Alleged Perpetrator,” which is:

Any person who committed or is alleged to have committed an act of abuse upon an Abuse Survivor, including but not limited to any member of the clergy, employee, worker, volunteer, teacher or administrator.

Finally, the Committee contends that the Archdiocese may be liable not only for acts of the Alleged Perpetrators that took place in parish churches, but also for abuse that occurred in other Catholic-affiliated organizations, such as Catholic schools, day care centers and hospitals. The Committee uses the term “Catholic Entities” to describe such places, which term includes:

(i) All organizations listed in the Official Catholic Directory for the Archdiocese; (ii) all Catholic or Catholic-affiliated entities or organizations including all parishes, missions, churches, cemeteries, schools, hospitals, orphanages, charities, foundations, seminaries, juridic persons, and service organizations existing at any time that either: (a) are or were located within the territorial limits of the Archdiocese; or (b) are or were directly or indirectly under or subject to the supervision or control of the Archbishop or the Archdiocese, and (iii) all Catholic religious orders that are legally responsible for the actions of an Alleged Perpetrator who, pursuant to a grant of faculties was located or working within the territorial limits of the Archdiocese when the Abuse occurred.⁷

As is set forth more fully below, because the Committee contends that the Debtor may be liable for acts of abuse related to Catholic Entities, the Committee requests that certain noticing efforts be directed to those Catholic Entities.

II. The notice period for the Abuse Survivor Bar Date is inadequate.

The Debtor proposes September 15, 2011 as the Abuse Survivor Bar Date. Assuming the Court enters the Bar Date Order and the Debtor is able to print and serve the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages by June 1, 2011 (a doubtful proposition), this is only three and a half months notice, which is terribly inadequate under the circumstances. Where, as here, it will take time to identify and locate known Abuse Survivors and even after receiving notice Abuse Survivors may need some period of time to decide to come forward and file a claim, a notice period of three-hundred and sixty-five days from the date of service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages is warranted. The Committee is prepared to submit expert testimony on this issue at an evidentiary hearing on the Motion. In the absence of a bar date that provides constitutionally mandated due process, the Court should decline to set one.⁸

III. The Abuse Survivor Proof of Claims

A. A court-appointed Claims Agent, not Debtor's counsel should act as the repository for the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms.

In the interests of confidentiality, the Debtor suggests that Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms be sent to and maintained by counsel to the Debtor instead of being filed with the Court. The Committee agrees that Abuse Survivors should be able to elect to keep their proofs of claim private; however, it strenuously opposes the Debtor or Debtor's counsel as keeper of those claims. After years of abuse and cover-ups, Abuse Survivors understandably have a profound mistrust of the Debtor. Requiring them to submit their proofs of claim, which will contain detailed information regarding their abuse and their abusers, to the very organization (or its counsel) they consider to be responsible for that abuse will have a chilling effect on filings. In addition, it puts Committee counsel in the position of having to ask the Debtor for copies of the Abuse Survivor Proofs of Claim and of having to depend on them to produce those claims in a

timely manner. For these reasons, a neutral, third-party claims agent should be appointed to maintain the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms.⁹

B. Access to Abuse Survivor Proof of Claims Forms

The Debtor proposes a list of Permitted Parties that should have access to the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms upon executing the Confidentiality Agreement attached as Exhibit G to the Motion. While the Committee agrees in principle, the Confidentiality Agreement itself is objectionable on numerous grounds. The Debtor asserts, “The Confidentiality Protocol is for the benefit of the Victims/Survivors.”¹⁰ Yet, there are numerous provisions that are clearly intended for the benefit of the Archdiocese, not the Abuse Survivors, which should be struck.

First, the Confidentiality Agreement provides that in the event of a breach, the Archdiocese (not the Abuse Survivors for whose benefit the agreement is allegedly created) is entitled to injunctive relief, specific performance and attorneys fees.¹¹ If the Confidentiality Agreement is for the benefit of the Abuse Survivors, any damages or remedies should run in their favor, not the Debtors. The Confidentiality Agreement also places restrictions on the internal use of the data in the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms. Specifically, it states:

I shall use or cause the Confidential Information only to assist me in performing my functions in the Bankruptcy Case and in a manner consistent with the terms and conditions of this Confidentiality Agreement. At no time shall I use the Confidential Information for the benefit of myself or any other third person. Nor shall I use the Confidential Information for any other purpose or proceeding, including but not limited to, any other legal proceedings of any nature, for purposes of evaluation or compiling demographic or statistical information about victim abuse claims against the Archdiocese or any other organization, or for purposes of evaluating or compiling demographic or statistical information about victim abuse claim settlements paid by the Archdiocese or any other organization.¹²

Again, if the Confidentiality Protocol is for the benefit of the Abuse Survivors (as it should be), there is no need for such restrictions. To protect the Abuse Survivors, the Permitted Party need only agree to keep the information contained in the proof of claim confidential.

The Confidentiality Agreement also requires the Permitted Party to immediately notify the Debtor in the event it is subpoenaed or “otherwise required to give testimony regarding any Confidential Information,” and to “assist the Archdiocese and its counsel in preventing the disclosure of any Confidential Information.” This Confidential Information belongs to the Abuse Survivors. No Permitted Party should have to undertake the obligation to assist the Debtor in preventing disclosure. They are simply agreeing not to disclose the information themselves. Therefore, the Committee has deleted paragraphs 3, 4 and 6.¹³ Finally, the Confidentiality Agreement makes no provision for unsealing the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms should they need to be used in any proceeding with the consent of the person who filed the claim or upon entry of a court order authorizing disclosure. Therefore, the Committee has added a provision addressing this issue.¹⁴

C. *The Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form should be more user-friendly*

The Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form proposed by the Debtor uses technical, legal language that may not be accessible to Abuse Survivors. Therefore, the Committee has proposed an alternate Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form that is less intimidating and easier to understand. The alternate Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form also makes clear that Abuse Survivors should not file their claims with the Court and adds contact information for counsel to the Committee.¹⁵

D. Settling Abuse Survivors and Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms

Pre-petition, the Debtor conducted a voluntary Mediation Program pursuant to which 192 individuals agreed to settle their abuse claims (the "Settling Abuse Survivors"). One hundred and seventy of those settlements have apparently already been paid by the Debtor and payments remain outstanding on twenty-two, which the Debtor collectively scheduled as a lump sum of \$702,000.00. The Debtor refers to these populations as the "Settled Victims/Survivors" and the "In Settlement Victims/Survivors" respectively. The Committee refers to all such parties as the Settling Abuse Survivors.

The Committee believes that Settling Abuse Survivors may have the right to rescind their settlement agreements or affirm their settlement agreements and seek damages against the Debtor if they were fraudulently induced to enter into the settlement (the "Fraudulent Inducement Claims"). If, for example, the Debtor induced a Settling Abuse Survivor to settle by telling him that he was the only individual who was abused or by misrepresenting the assets that were available to pay abuse claims, a Settling Abuse Survivor might have a Fraudulent Inducement Claim. For that reason, the Settling Abuse Survivors should not be listed among the parties who need not file an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form and the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice should include the following language:

Even if you participated in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee Clergy Sexual Abuse Mediation System and executed a settlement agreement releasing the Debtor you may still be entitled to file a Proof of Claim if you believe that you were misled by the Debtor or its representatives in connection with the mediation. For example, if you entered into a mediated settlement with the Debtor based on representations that were made to you concerning the limited resources that the Debtor had to settle your claims or that you were the only individual who was abused, which assertions you believe were untrue, you should file a claim setting forth the reasons you believe the settlement and release of the Debtor is not enforceable and/or why you believe you are entitled to additional payments. If you believe you were misled by the Debtor in connection with the mediation, you may also wish to contact an attorney.¹⁶

E. Miscellaneous Issues related to Abuse Survivor Proof of Claims Forms

The Committee believes that it is inappropriate to require Abuse Survivors to quantify their claims by including a dollar amount on the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form and/or require them to attach the writings upon which their claims are based, and accordingly have deleted those requirements. At this stage of the proceedings, how is one to assign a value to the pain and suffering an Abuse Survivor experienced from being sodomized or a lifetime of alcoholism that followed? In addition, Abuse Survivors should not be required to attach “writings upon which their claims are based.” These are not claims based on a contract that the Debtor has breached. These are tort claims and any writings, such as doctors bills and medical records, are simply evidence of the amount of the claim. They are not the basis for the claim itself, which was the Debtor’s role in the abuse. Nothing in either Bankruptcy Code section 502 or Federal Rule of Bankruptcy Procedure 3003, both of which address the filing and allowance of claims, require tort claimants to attach writings to their claims or prevent them from filing unliquidated ones and the Bar Date Order should not impose these additional requirements.

IV. Actual notice of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date to Currently Known Abuse Survivors is Inadequate.

A. There are more known Abuse Survivors than the Debtor is proposing to serve with actual notice of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date.

The most serious defect in the Motion is that it basically seeks to limit actual notice to Abuse Survivors that are “currently known to the Chancellor of the Archdiocese or the Archdiocese Victim’s Assistance Coordinator.” The Debtor proposes the following:

The Debtor shall provide notice of the Victims/Survivors Bar Date by serving the Victim/Survivor Notice Package on Settled Victims/Survivors, In-Settlement Victims/Survivors, Represented Claimants, and Unrepresented Claimants (as such terms are defined in the Debtor's Motion for Special Confidentiality Procedures to Protect Victims/Survivors [Docket No. 165]) in the fashion approved by any Special Confidentiality Procedures Order approved by this Court. The Debtor will also serve the Victim/Survivor Notice Package on all individuals currently known to the Chancellor of the Archdiocese or the Archdiocese's Victim Assistance Coordinator as having: (i) filed or threatened to file lawsuits against the

Archdiocese that allege they were abused; (ii) contacted the Archdiocese to report that they were victims of abuse, whether or not that individual's claim was considered to be substantiated and whether or not the report was written or verbal; (iii) received payment from the Debtor as a result of an allegation of abuse; (iv) participated in the Mediation Program but not entered into a settlement agreement; and (v) been provided counseling, spiritual direction, or therapy support related to abuse or been referred for same by the Debtor.¹⁷

The Committee submits, however, that this narrow definition will exclude individuals whose identities are known to the Debtor or who could be easily identified through reasonable efforts on the Debtor's part through outreach to the parishes, schools and other Catholic Entities in the Archdiocese.¹⁸ Suppose, for example, that a priest who taught at one of the one hundred twenty-five Catholic schools in the Archdiocese and oversaw an afterschool program at a Catholic day care center molested four children. Child One reports the abuse to a teacher who puts a note in the child's school file. When the principal talks to Child One, he says that he saw the priest take Child Two into the coat closet alone, which is what he had done with Child One. The principal decides the child is making it up and does not report the allegations to the Archdiocese. Child Three's parents report the abuse to the Archdiocese and threaten to sue. Child Four, abused at the day care center, never reports the abuse. Under the Debtor's proposal only Child Three would receive actual notice of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date, even though the Catholic school and the Catholic daycare center where Children 1, 2 and 4 were abused likely have records of the names and addresses of the students who attended.

Nor does the Debtor's proposal, provide actual notice to Abuse Survivors who might have been identified during the course of an investigation of an Alleged Perpetrator but who did not directly report the abuse themselves. Nor does the Debtor propose to provide actual notice to individuals where "concern" was expressed, but direct abuse may not have been reported. For example, in 1993, the Debtor noted a report from a mother that Father Franklin Beckar "apparently took a liking to [her son], a teenager, and even though he only knew him for two days, he has been seen driving by his home. The mother is concerned."¹⁹ This is a possible Abuse Survivor and yet, the Debtor does not provide actual notice.

For this reason, the Committee submits that the following parties (the "Abuse Survivor Notice Parties") should receive the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages:

(i) All individuals who have filed or ever threatened to file lawsuits against the Archdiocese that allege Abuse by any Alleged Perpetrator.

(ii) All individuals known to the Archdiocese who contacted the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity to report that they were Abused by an Alleged Perpetrator, whether or not that individual's claim was considered to be substantiated or unsubstantiated and whether or not the report was written or verbal.

(iii) All individuals known to the Archdiocese to whom payment has ever been made by or on behalf of the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity as a result of an allegation of Abuse, including but not limited to the Settling Abuse Survivors (whether they received any or all payments owing as a part of the settlement) as well as all individuals who participated in any mediation or settlement process with the Archdiocese but did not enter into a settlement agreement.

(iv) All individuals known to the Archdiocese whose names were given to the Archdiocese or to representatives of the Archdiocese or to any Catholic Entity or any representatives of a Catholic Entity by an Alleged Perpetrator or any third party during interviews, counseling sessions, or as a part of an investigation of Abuse.

(v) All individuals who attended any daycare, preschool, kindergarten, elementary school, middle school or high school, or any seminary, college, or other educational institution (if the individual was under the age of 18 when he or she attended such college, seminary or other educational institution) in the Archdiocese (a "School") during the years in which an Alleged Perpetrator was

present at the School.

(vi) All individuals identified on the latest alumni mailing list for each School.

(vii) All registered Catholics in every parish in the Archdiocese during the years in which an Alleged Perpetrator was present in that parish.

(viii) All individuals known to the Archdiocese who attended or participated in any other Catholic Entity during the years in which an Alleged Perpetrator was present at that Catholic Entity.

(ix) All individuals who contacted the Archdiocese about their children being in close contact with an Alleged Perpetrator or about some problem with the Alleged Perpetrator and their child.

(x) All individuals whom the Debtor has ever provided or referred to for counseling, spiritual direction, or therapy support related to Abuse.

(xi) Where any of the Abuse Survivor Notice Parties listed above have an attorney of record, notice shall also be sent to the attorney of record.²⁰

The Committee is aware that this will require the Debtor to ask the schools, parishes and other Catholic Entities in the Archdiocese to provide the requested information in some instances. Therefore, the Bar Date Order should provide for a due diligence period of 45 days and the following due diligence procedure:

To obtain the information requested above, the Debtor will review the files it has within its possession, custody or control related to all Alleged Perpetrators as well as the records of the following: sexual abuse review boards, the Sexual Abuse Prevention & Response Office, the Victims Assistance Counselor, the Safe Environment Coordinator, Eisenberg Commission, Project Benjamin and the Community Advisory Board. Within five (5) days of the entry of the Bar Date Order, the Debtor will contact each Parish, School and other Catholic Entity and request that they provide the names and addresses of the individuals identified in paragraphs 25(i)-(xi) above and will also ask each School for its latest alumni mailing list (the "Information Request"). The Information Request will be mailed to each Parish, School and other Catholic Entity on the stationery of the Archbishop as a personal request from him. The Debtor will use reasonable efforts to find current addresses for each individual identified by paragraph 25 and will promptly serve each such individual with the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice Package. The Debtor will file a declaration attesting to the efforts it made to comply with these procedures (which will include copies of each Information

Request sent by the Debtor) with the Court and serve it on counsel to the Committee within thirty days of service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages. At the same time, the Debtor will provide the counsel to the Committee the names and addresses of all Abuse Survivor Notice Parties and all Alleged Perpetrators. If additional Abuse Survivors or Alleged Perpetrators are identified to the Debtor after the initial service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages, the Debtors shall, within 10 days of their identification, serve a copy of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Package on the additional Abuse Survivors with an amended Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice that includes the name of any subsequently identified Alleged Perpetrator. The information regarding any subsequently identified Alleged Perpetrator shall also be added to the Publication Notice described below. The Debtor will provide counsel to the Committee the names and addresses of all subsequently identified Abuse Survivor Notice Parties and Alleged Perpetrators.²¹

The Committee is also aware that the parishes are separately incorporated, but this is no bar to obtaining information from them (or the schools or other Catholic Entities) or from the priests or pastors who would be required to review parish files for the names of known claimants. The parishes, while separately incorporated, are under the authority of the Archbishop. The Archbishop both appoints and removes the pastor and approves the assignments for each priest.²² Indeed, each priest declares an oath of obedience to his bishop.²³

Furthermore, the Archdiocese exerts an extraordinary amount of control over the parishes and provides a great deal of assistance to them. For example, the Archbishop, as the only trustee of each Roman Catholic church in the Archdiocese, has the power to cause the incorporation of

each parish.²⁴ He is one of the trustees of each parish corporation. Of the other four trustees, the vicar-general and the pastor of each congregation are appointed to the jobs that entitle them to serve as trustees by the Archbishop.²⁵ The remaining two trustees are elected by parishioners, but the Archbishop, as president of the parish corporation, has the right to approve or disprove any trustee elected by the parish or appointed by the pastor to fill a vacancy.²⁶

The Archbishop is also the president of every parish corporation and his appointee (the pastor) is vice-president. The Archbishop is on the board of directors of each parish corporation, along with the vicar-general, the pastor, the treasurer and the secretary.²⁷ Through the Archbishop's power to appoint the vicar-general of the Archdiocese and the pastor of each congregation, he effectively determines who holds three of five votes on the board of directors.

One of the ways in which the Archdiocese exercises its control over the parishes is by limiting what they can or can not do without the unanimous consent of the board of directors (which, of course, requires the consent of the Archbishop and his two appointees, the pastor and the vicar-general). For example, trustees can not initiate or respond to lawsuits in the name of the parish without the written permission of the Archbishop.²⁸ They can not sell or encumber parish property, incur debts beyond \$300.00, make extraordinary expenditures of funds already "in hand" which is not a regular operation expenditure for any amount of money that exceeds 4%

of the last years' parish revenue, establish an endowment, or enter into any building or renovation process without the Archbishop's consent as a member of the board.²⁹

Given the Archbishop's authority over the parishes, the priests and the Christian faithful in the Archdiocese, it is clear that he can ask the parishes, the schools and the Catholic Entities to respond to the Information Request as a part of the Debtor's efforts to identify and notify all known Abuse Survivors.

B. The method of service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages is ambiguous.

The Debtor proposes to serve the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages using "the same confidentiality procedures as those approved by the Court for Unrepresented Claimants, unless such individuals have counsel known to the Debtor, in which case service will be effectuated through such counsel, in the same fashion as approved by the Court for service on the Represented Claimants." However, court has not yet approved the Debtor's requested confidentiality procedures. For Abuse Survivors who are represented, the Debtor should serve the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages on their attorneys of record. All other Abuse Survivors should be served, first class mail, at their last known home address, after the Debtor has used reasonable efforts to locate a current address for each Abuse Survivor. The names and addresses of all parties served (including any updated addresses which were discovered when mail was returned or otherwise) should be included on the proof of service, and the proof of service should be filed under seal, with a copy provided to counsel to the Committee, which the Committee will not disclose.

V. The Publication Protocol must be expanded.

A. The Publication Protocol is inadequate.

The Debtor intends to notify unknown Abuse Survivors through a Publication Protocol. The Committee requests that the Publication Protocol be expanded in the following ways: (a)

Publication in the specified publications be made once in the 30 days after the entry of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice and once 30 days before the Abuse Survivor Bar Date; (b) the following additional publications be added: America Magazine, Hand to Hand, National Catholic Reporter, Saint Anthony Messenger, and (c) and that the Publication Protocol be supplemented as follows:

(a) The Debtor will provide the Publication Notice to all parishes and schools located in the Region and each parish and school will post the Publication Notice in a prominent location. The Publication Notice shall be no smaller than 8" X 10" with font no smaller than 10 point. The Publication Notice shall state that it is posted at the request of the Archbishop and is to remain posted within thirty (30) days of entry of the Bar Date Order through the Abuse Survivor Bar Date (the "Publication Period"). The Debtor or someone at the parish or school at the request of the Debtor shall verify that the Publication Notice remains posted until the end of the Publication Period.

(b) Archbishop Jerome ListECKI will prepare and sign a letter notifying Catholics in the Region of the Bar Dates and will request that each parish include said letter in its parish bulletin once a week for every week of the Publication Period. The letter will also be mailed or emailed to registered parishioners.

(c) The Debtor will post the Publication Notice on the homepage of the following websites: www.archmil.org, www.kccllc.net/archmil; each parish website, each School website, as well as on the homepage of each Publication's web-version. The Publication Notice will remain posted on the websites for the duration of the Publication Period.

(d) Where Publication Notice is required by these provisions to be published on any website or internet portal, the Debtor shall also provide a videotape upload which provides the Publication Notice for Abuse Survivors in American Sign Language.

(e) The Debtor and the Committee will maintain toll free numbers which may be used by potential claimants to ask questions or obtain copies of Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms and General Creditor Proof of Claim Form.

(f) The Debtor will distribute a press release announcing the Abuse Survivor Bar Date to, at a minimum, the programs, schools, ministries, organizations, individuals and media outlets to which it issued press releases, information and fliers in connection with the announcement of the Mediation Program in January 2004 as is further detailed in paragraph 31 of the Motion.

(g) A priest in each church in each parish will announce the Abuse Survivor Bar Date and the procedure for filing an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim from the

pulpit one time during each Sunday mass conducted during the Publication Period.

(h) The Debtors will also mail a copy of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice to each of the following individuals or entities within the Region: all police departments, the offices of all District Attorneys, the office of the Wisconsin attorney general, all licensed therapists who work with survivors of sexual abuse, the regional headquarters of Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous, all drug treatment centers, hospitals and public libraries.

28. The Debtor will file a certificate of notice by publication attesting to the efforts it made to comply with these procedures with the Court and serve it on counsel to the Committee within thirty days of service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages. The Debtor will also file with the Court a declaration attesting to the compliance of the parishes, schools and other Catholic Entities with the Publication Protocol.³⁰

This expanded publication is necessary to insure that unknown claimants are reached. In today's world, many people get their news from internet versions of newspapers, so placing the Publication Notice in the print version is not enough. In addition, as mentioned above, many of the Abuse Survivors in this case were students at St. John's School for the Deaf. Hearing impaired people frequently have difficulty reading, and thus, it is terribly important to use videotape uploads with the text of the Abuse Survivor's Bar Date Notice or some other agreed upon script in American Sign Language on the publications' websites. In addition, requiring the Publication Notice to be delivered to registered Catholics and placed, multiple times in parish bulletins and even having the priests announce it from the pulpit is not unprecedented. In fact, very similar efforts were made at the parish level on behalf of the Archdiocese in connection with the its 2011 Catholic Stewardship Appeal to raise money for the Archdiocese, where, for example, the Archdiocese provided to the parishes (through its website) articles, bulletin announcements and cover art, assistance with campaign administration, intercessions for each week of the campaign, pulpit announcements, talking points, testimonials and training

webinars.³¹ If the Archdiocese can reach out to the parishioners through the websites, bulletins and priests to raise money, it can do so to publicize the Abuse Survivor Bar Date.

B. *The Publication Notice itself needs to be bigger and include language that is likely to speak to Abuse Survivors.*

The content of the Publication Notice is inadequate for many reasons. It needs to be larger and needs to specifically notify the reader that, among other things, a list of the names, dates, locations and years of service of the substantiated Abusers is available and a statement regarding the Fraudulent Inducement Claims. It should also include specific descriptions of acts of abuse. Abuse Survivors may not respond when asked generally if they have an “abuse claim.” The Debtor is prepared to present expert testimony that a noticing program will be much more effective if, for example, the Publication Notice were to ask concrete questions, such as: “Were you fondled? Were you shown pornography? Were you touched on your genitals, either over or under your pants?”

VI. The Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice and Package should be amended.

The Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice and the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Package should be amended in a number of ways.

A. *The List of Abuser should be supplemented and should include pictures, if available.*

The List of Abusers that the Debtor proposes to send with the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice should include the name of the each Abuser, as well as the name of the church, parish, school, or other Catholic Entity for which the Abuser worked or served, the Abuser’s position within said church, parish, School or other Catholic Entity and the Abuser’s dates of service or employment with such church, parish, school or other Catholic Entity. It should also include a picture (if available), at least 3” by 5” in dimension, of each Abuser at or close to the time of the

abuse. This is necessary because Abuse Survivors often need a connection to their memory of an event that took place many years ago, often to recall the name of their abuser. It should also include the names and information requested above for any religious order priests with substantiated claims of abuse. It should also include the following disclaimer:

This list is not exhaustive in that there may be additional priests who may have committed acts of abuse but on whom the Archdiocese does not have a report or for whom the Archdiocese determined that an allegation of abuse was not substantiated. In addition, the list does not include other potential offenders who are not members of the clergy, such as teachers, nuns, or religious order priests). The fact that this list may not include the name of the Alleged Perpetrator who abused you does not mean that you should not file an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form.³²

VII. Additional Comments.

The Committee also opposes the following language in the proposed Bar Date Order that purports to foreclose the filing of proofs of claim after the Abuse Survivor Bar Date:

Pursuant to Fed. R. Bankr. P. 3003(c)(2), any holder of a claim whether a General Creditor Claim, Victim/Survivor Claim, Rejection Damages Claim, or Amended Schedules Claim that is not subject to one of the exceptions enumerated above who fails to timely file a proof of claim in the appropriate form be forever barred from (a) asserting such claim against the Debtor or its estate; (b) voting on any plan of reorganization filed in the Reorganization Case, and (c) participating in any distribution in the Reorganization Case on account of such claim, and that the Debtor need not provide further notices regarding such claim.³³

As the Debtor is aware, a claimant who has not filed a claim prior to the applicable bar date may move the Court to permit the late filing, and a plan of reorganization may provide treatment for late filed claims. Through the above quoted language, the Debtor is, in effect, inappropriately writing discharge terms into a Bar Date Order. In addition, the Motion does not address the impact of a future claims representative who may be appointed under a plan of reorganization and who would oversee the filing of claims that had not accrued as of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date.

III

For Years, Deaf Boys Tried to Tell of Priest's Abuse

They were deaf, but they were not silent. For decades, a group of men who were sexually abused as children by the Rev. Lawrence C. Murphy at a school for the deaf in Wisconsin reported to every type of official they could think of that he was a danger, according to the victims and church documents.

They told other priests. They told three archbishops of Milwaukee. They told two police departments and the district attorney. They used sign language, written affidavits and graphic gestures to show what exactly Father Murphy had done to them. But their reports fell on the deaf ears of hearing people.

This week, they learned that Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, now Pope Benedict XVI, received letters about Father Murphy in 1996 from Archbishop Rembert G. Weakland of Milwaukee, who said that the deaf community needed "a healing response from the Church." The Vatican sat on the case, then equivocated, and when Father Murphy died in 1998, he died a priest.

"That man should have been in prison for a very long time, but he was lucky," Steven Geier, one of Father Murphy's victims, said Thursday. "What about me? I wasn't supposed to touch girls. What gave him the right to be able to do that? Father Murphy constantly thought about sex with children, and he got away with it."

Young victims of sexual abuse are often so confused, ashamed or traumatized that they wait years to report the violations. Some never say a word. One of the remarkable aspects of the Father Murphy case is that young victims began alerting the authorities in the mid-1950s, when sexual abuse was hardly even a part of the public vocabulary.

In his ranch house in Madison, where he lives with his wife, Ann, and two dachshunds, Mr. Geier said through an interpreter that he entered St. John's School for the Deaf in St. Francis, Wis., when he was 9. His father had helped build a Catholic church in rural Dane County, and his aunt was a nun. His family wanted him to get a good education in a Catholic school.

Mr. Geier, now 59, said that between the ages of 14 and 15, starting around 1965, Father Murphy molested him four times in a closet at the school. The priest, a hearing man fluent in sign language, said that God wanted him to teach the boy about sex but that he had to keep it quiet because it was under the sacrament of confession. Mr. Geier said he felt sick.

"First thing in the morning," Mr. Geier said, "we took communion, and as he passed out the communion wafers, I thought about how many boys did he touch with those hands and all of the germs, all of the filth of his hands."

Father Murphy may have molested as many as 200 boys while he worked at the school from 1950 to 1974, according to the accounts of victims and a social worker hired by the Archdiocese of Milwaukee to interview him.

Mr. Geier said he first tried to tell the priest at his home parish in Madison, where he served as an altar boy, in 1966 when he was just 16. But the priest, he said, told him he did not want to hear about it, and to just forget about it. He told another priest while he was still a teenager, and yet a third priest years later, after he married.

That priest, the Rev. Tom Schroeder, 72, who led Masses for the deaf in Madison from 1970 to 1992, said in an interview Friday that he remembered Mr. Geier's telling him about Father Murphy. Father Schroeder said that he told a nun, who told another nun who was a dormitory supervisor at St. John's, but that the supervisor did not believe it and nothing ever came of it.

"I assumed that if enough people told her, she would finally believe it," Father Schroeder said.

Internal church correspondence unearthed in a lawsuit against the Archdiocese of Milwaukee and given to The New York Times, which made it public it this week, included a letter from the Rev. David Walsh, who served as a chaplain for the deaf in Chicago, saying that teenage students at St. John's had told him in the late 1950s about Father Murphy's abuse.

Father Walsh said he told Archbishop Albert Gregory Meyer of Milwaukee, who sent Father Murphy on a retreat and then put him back in the school to undo "the harm he had done."

In the 1970s, a group of former students who were in a vocational rehabilitation program in Milwaukee began telling their hearing supervisors about Father Murphy, a sequence of events reported in two articles in The Milwaukee Journal Sentinel in 2006.

Among the supervisors was John Conway, now the deputy administrator of workers' compensation for the State of Wisconsin. Mr. Conway, the students and others collected affidavits from 15 to 20 former students about Father Murphy's violations. They were granted a meeting with Archbishop William E. Cousins.

"In my extreme naïveté," said Mr. Conway in an interview on Friday, "I told them the archbishop would take care of this."

He said they were surprised to find the room packed with people, including several nuns and teachers from the school, two priests who said they were representing the apostolic delegate in Chicago, and Father Murphy himself.

Arthur Budzinski and Gary Smith, two more victims of Father Murphy, said in an interview last week that they remember seeing Archbishop Cousins yell, and Father Murphy staring at the floor. The deaf men and their advocates were told that Father Murphy, the school's director and top fundraiser, was too valuable to be let go, so he would be given only administrative duties.

They were outraged. They distributed "Wanted" posters with Father Murphy's face outside the cathedral in Milwaukee. They went to the police departments in Milwaukee, where they were told it was not the correct jurisdiction, and in St. Francis, where the school was located, Mr. Conway said. They also went to the office of E. Michael McCann, the district attorney of Milwaukee County, and spoke with his assistant, William Gardner.

"A criminal priest was an oxymoron to them," Mr. Conway said. "They said they'll refer it to the archdiocese."

Calls to Mr. McCann and Mr. Gardner this week were not returned.

Mr. Conway said it was only when they filed a lawsuit that the archdiocese removed Father Murphy from St. John's and sent him to northern Wisconsin to live at his family's summer house. The lawsuit was withdrawn. Mr. Smith, one of two of the plaintiffs whose cases were still within the statute of limitations, received a settlement of \$2,000, he and Mr. Conway said.

Father Murphy continued working in parishes and schools, with deaf people, and leading youth retreats in the Diocese of Superior for the next 24 years.

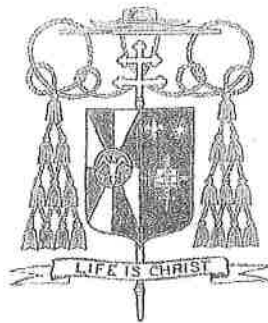

**ORDER APPROVING DEBTOR'S MOTION FOR ORDER ESTABLISHING
DEADLINES FOR FILING PROOFS OF CLAIM AND APPROVING FORM
AND MANNER OF NOTICE THEREOF**

Upon the Motion of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, as debtor and debtor-in-possession (the "Debtor"), for entry of an order (i) fixing the time within which proofs of claim against the Debtor's estate may be filed (the "Bar Dates"); (ii) approving the proposed proof of claim forms; (iii) approving procedures for maintaining the confidentiality of proofs of claim filed by survivors of sexual abuse; (iv) approving the form and manner of the proposed notices of the Bar Dates as providing fair, reasonable and adequate notice of the Bar Dates; and (v) granting related relief (the "Motion");¹ and the opposition (the "Opposition") to the Motion of the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors (the "Committee"); and it appearing that the Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334; and it appearing that this proceeding is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2); and it appearing that venue of this proceeding and the Motion in this District is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409; and notice of the Motion and the opportunity for a hearing on the Motion was appropriate under

the particular circumstances and that no other or further notice need be given; and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing therefore;

The Court hereby finds:

The Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form is necessary and appropriate under the circumstances of this case.

Notice by mail to unknown Abuse Survivors is impracticable and for that reason, as well as to supplement notice by mail, the Court finds the Publication Protocol as set forth in this Order, and Form of Publication Notice (the Publication Notice is attached hereto as Exhibit F) as outlined in this Order, is proper.

The Bar Date Notices and Publication Notice in the forms and manners provided in this Order are fair and reasonable and will provide good, sufficient, and due notice to all creditors, including creditors with foreign addresses, of their rights and obligations in connection with claims they may assert against the Debtor's estate in this Reorganization Case.

It is hereby ordered:

1. The Motion is GRANTED, except as provided herein.

THE BAR DATES

2. August 1, 2011 at 4:00 p.m. prevailing Central Time is the last day for all entities² including governmental units,³ holding pre-petition claims, including pre-petition claims entitled to administrative expense status under § 503(b)(9) of the Bankruptcy Code, but excluding Abuse Survivors Claims, to file proofs of claim (the "General Bar Date").

² As used herein, the term "entity" has the meaning given to it in § 101(15) of the Bankruptcy Code.

³ As used herein, the term "governmental unit" has the meaning given to it in § 101(27) of the Bankruptcy Code.

3. [_____] at 4:00 p.m. prevailing Central Time is the last day for all Claims of Abuse Survivors to file proofs of claim (the “Abuse Survivors Bar Date”). Any Abuse Survivors who filed and had pending as of the Petition Date, a lawsuit against the Debtor (as well as the individuals identified in paragraph 6 of this Order) must submit an Abuse Survivors Proof of Claim Form by the Abuse Survivors Bar Date.

4. The deadline for filing a proof of claim in connection with the Debtor’s rejection of executory contracts and/or unexpired leases is the *later of*: (i) the General Bar Date, or (ii) the date that is twenty-eight (28) days after entry of an order approving the rejection of an executory contract or unexpired lease pursuant to which the entity asserting the Rejection Damages Claim is a party (the “Rejection Damages Bar Date”). The Rejection Bar Date shall not apply to the claims of Abuse Survivors.

5. If the Debtor amends its Schedules of Assets and Liabilities and/or Statements of Financial Affairs (collectively, the “Schedules”) so as to add an entity not currently listed therein or to alter the amount, priority, classification, or other status of a listed claim, the holders of such claims (the “Amended Schedules Claims”) may file amended or original proofs of claim to take into account the amendment(s) to the Schedules. The deadline for filing Amended Schedules Claims shall be the *later of* (a) the General Bar Date, or (b) twenty-eight (28) days after the holder of a claim is served with notice that the Debtor amended its Schedules to reduce, delete, or change the amount, priority, classification, or other status of such a claim (the “Amended Schedules Bar Date”).

WHO MUST FILE PROOFS OF CLAIM

6. Except as set forth in paragraph 7 below, the General Bar Date and the Abuse Survivors Bar Date apply to all persons and entities holding prepetition claims, including, without limitation, the following entities:

(i) Any person or entity whose prepetition claim against the Debtor is not listed in the Debtor's Schedules or whose prepetition claim is listed in the Schedules but is listed as disputed, contingent or unliquidated and that desires to participate in this Reorganization Case or share in any distribution in this Reorganization Case;

(ii) Any person or entity that believes that its prepetition claim is improperly classified in the Schedules or is listed in an incorrect amount and that desires to have its claim allowed in a classification or amount other than that identified in the Schedules; and

(iii) Any Abuse Survivor who believes that he or she has a claim against the Debtor, including but not limited to Abuse Survivors who have previously filed lawsuits against the Debtor, Abuse Survivors who settled their abuse claims against the Debtor (the "Settling Abuse Survivors") who believe they have the right to rescind their settlement agreements or affirm their settlement agreements and seek damages against the Debtor if they were fraudulently induced to enter into the settlement (the "Fraudulent Inducement Claims"), and Abuse Survivors who have never filed a lawsuit, entered into a settlement or reported their Abuse.⁴

⁴ As used herein, "Abuse" means any and all acts or omissions that in any way arise out of, are based upon, or involve actual or alleged sexual conduct or misconduct, sexual abuse or molestation, indecent assault and/or battery, rape, lascivious behavior, undue familiarity, pedophilia, ephebophilia, or sexually related physical, psychological or emotional harm, or contacts or interactions of a sexual nature between a child and an adult, or a non-consenting adult and another adult, by a person for whom the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity is or was legally responsible, or who the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity failed to control, direct, train or supervise or about whose acts and propensities the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity failed to warn, disclose or provide information. A child or a non-consenting adult is Abused whether or not this activity involves explicit force, whether or not it involves genital

7. The following persons or entities are **not** required to file a proof of claim on or before the applicable Bar Date:

(i) Any person or entity: (i) whose claim is listed in the Schedules or any amendments thereto, and (ii) whose claim is not described therein as “disputed,” “contingent,” or “unliquidated,” and (iii) who does not dispute the amount or classification of its claim as set forth in the Schedules;

(ii) Professionals retained by the Debtor or the Committee pursuant to orders of this Court, including Kurtzman Carson Consultants (“KCC”), who assert administrative claims for payment of fees and expenses subject to the Court’s approval pursuant to §§ 330, 331(a) and 503(b) of the Bankruptcy Code;

(iii) Any person or entity that asserts an administrative expense claim against the Debtor pursuant to §§ 503(b)(1) through (8) of the Bankruptcy Code;

(iv) Any person or entity whose claim against the Debtor has been allowed by an order of the Court entered on or before the applicable Bar Date; and

or other physical contact and whether or not there is physical, psychological or emotional harm to the child or non-consenting adult. “Abuse Survivor” includes any person, whether living or dead (in which case the term includes the estate of the decedent), who was Abused by any Alleged Perpetrator. “Alleged Perpetrator” is any person who committed or is alleged to have committed an act of Abuse upon an Abuse Survivor. The term “Alleged Perpetrator” also includes any member of the clergy, employee, worker, volunteer, teacher or administrator. “Catholic Entity” includes (i) all organizations listed in the Official Catholic Directory for the Archdiocese; (ii) all Catholic or Catholic-affiliated entities or organizations including all parishes, missions, churches, cemeteries, schools, hospitals, orphanages, charities, foundations, seminaries, juridic persons, and service organizations existing at any time that either: (a) are or were located within the territorial limits of the Archdiocese; or (b) are or were directly or indirectly under or subject to the supervision or control of the Archbishop or the Archdiocese, and (iii) all Catholic religious orders that are legally responsible for the actions of an Alleged Perpetrator who, pursuant to a grant of faculties was located or working within the territorial limits of the Archdiocese when the Abuse occurred.

(v) Any person or entity whose claim has been paid in full. This provision does not apply to Settling Abuse Survivors who believe they have Fraudulent Inducement Claims against the Debtor.

PROOF OF CLAIM FORMS

8. With respect to prepetition creditors that are not Abuse Survivors – *i.e.*, holders of General Claims, Rejection Damages Claims, or Amended Schedules Claim (collectively, the “The General Creditor Claims”) – the Court approves the proof of claim form attached hereto as Exhibit A (the “General Creditor Proof of Claim Form”).

9. Each General Creditor Proof of Claim Form filed must: (a) be written in English; (b) be denominated in lawful currency of the United States as of the Petition Date; and (c) have attached copies of any writings upon which the claim is based in accordance with Bankruptcy Rules 3001(c) and 3001(d), including for secured claims, evidence that the alleged security interest has been perfected; and (d) be originally executed and filed with the Court on or before the applicable Bar Date, with a copy provided to the Debtor c/o Whyte Hirschboeck Dudek S.C., Attn: Daryl L. Diesing, 555 East Wells Street, Suite 1900, Milwaukee, WI 53202-3819 and to the Claims Agent (as defined in paragraph ____). Proofs of claim must be mailed or delivered by messenger or overnight courier; proofs of claim sent by facsimile, telecopy, or e-mail will not be accepted.

10. With respect to prepetition creditors that are Abuse Survivors, the Court approves the proof of claim form attached hereto as Exhibit B (the “Abuse Survivors Proof of Claim Form”).

11. The Court further orders the following confidentiality protocol (the "Confidentiality Protocol") be followed in this Reorganization Case:

(i) Abuse Survivors are directed not to file an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form with the Court. Instead, the original and two copies of each Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form must be sent to the Claims Agent at the following address [INSERT NAME AND ADDRESS OF CLAIMS AGENT] (the "Claims Agent").

(ii) Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms submitted by Abuse Survivors will not be available to the general public unless an Abuse Survivor affirmatively indicates his or her desire that the proof of claim be made public in Part 1 of the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form. The Confidentiality Protocol is for the sole benefit of the Abuse Survivors. Accordingly, Abuse Survivors may elect to make any of the information contained in an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim public even if they elected to file the Abuse Survivors Proof of Claim Form confidentially.

(iii) Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms submitted by an Abuse Survivor shall be held and treated as confidential (unless the Abuse Survivor elects otherwise in Part 1 of the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form) by the Claims Agent, but the Claims Agent shall distribute copies of each Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form to the Debtor, Debtor's bankruptcy counsel, bankruptcy counsel to the Committee and, upon request, to the parties listed below (the "Permitted Parties") subject to each Permitted Party executing and returning to the

Claims Agent the confidentiality agreement attached as Exhibit G to this Order (the "Confidentiality Agreement").⁵

- (iv) The Permitted Parties include:
 - (a) Insurance companies that provided insurance that may cover the claims described in the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms;
 - (b) Any future claims representative appointed by the Court;
 - (c) Any special arbitrator/claims reviewer appointed to review and resolve the claims of Abuse Survivors;
 - (d) Any settlement trustee appointed to administer payments to Abuse Survivors;
 - (e) Members of the Committee and their personal counsel (after the Abuse Survivors Proof of Claim Form has been redacted to remove the Abuse Survivor's name, address and any other information identified in Part 2(A) of the Abuse Survivors Proof of Claim Form); and
 - (f) Such other persons as the Court determines should have access to the Abuse Survivors Claims.

12. In addition to being available in English, the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form will also be available in Spanish and Hmong because of the large Hispanic and Hmong communities in the geographic territory of the Debtor (the "Region").

⁵ Access to the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms extends only to the natural person who executes the Confidentiality Agreement. A separate Confidentiality Agreement must be signed by each natural person who seeks access to the records on behalf of a Permitted Party.

13. Each Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form submitted must: (i) be written in the English, Spanish, or Hmong languages and (ii) be originally executed and sent to the Claims Agent on or before the applicable Bar Date. **ABUSE SURVIVOR PROOF OF CLAIM FORMS SHALL NOT FILED WITH THE COURT.** Proofs of claim must be mailed or delivered by messenger or overnight courier; proofs of claim sent by facsimile, telecopy, or e-mail will not be accepted.

14. The Debtor may retain and compensate any translation services that might be needed to translate the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms into Spanish and Hmong from English and to translate any completed Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms into English from Spanish or Hmong.

NOTICE PROCEDURES

15. Within five (5) days of the entry of this Order, the Debtor shall serve by United States mail, first-class postage prepaid: (i) notice of the General Bar Date and the Rejection Damages Bar Date, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit C and incorporated herein by reference (the "General Creditor Bar Date Notice"); (ii) a General Creditor Proof of Claim Form substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A; and (iii) the Bar Date Order (together with the General Creditor Bar Date Notice and the General Creditor Proof of Claim Form, the "General Creditor Bar Date Notice Package"), upon: (a) all entities who have filed a notice of appearance in the Debtor's case; (b) all entities listed in the Debtor's Schedules; (c) all entities that have previously filed proofs of claim in the Debtor's case; (d) any other entities or their counsel, including governmental units, known to Debtor as entities who may have claims

against the estate; and (e) all parties or their counsel listed on the Service List as maintained pursuant to this Court's Case Management Order.

16. The Debtor shall make the following available to the public: (i) a notice of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit D and incorporated herein by reference (the "Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice," and together with the General Creditor Bar Date Notice, each a "Bar Date Notice" and collectively, the "Bar Date Notices"); (ii) an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B; (iii) a list of diocesan and religious order priests against whom the Debtor has received substantiated reports of sexual Abuse of a minor (the "Abusers") in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit E and (iv) the Bar Date Order (together with the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice and the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form, the "Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice Package," and together with the General Creditor Bar Date Package, the "Bar Date Packages").

17. In order to accommodate the Due Diligence Period (defined below), the Debtor shall provide notice of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date by causing the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice Package to be served on the individuals identified in paragraph 18(i)-(xi) below (the "Abuse Survivor Notice Parties") no later than forth-five (45) business days after entry of the Bar Date Order and by causing all or part of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice Package, or Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice, as applicable, to be published as set forth below.

18. The Abuse Survivor Notice Parties shall include the following:

(i) All individuals who have filed or ever threatened to file lawsuits against the Archdiocese that allege Abuse by any Alleged Perpetrator.

(ii) All individuals known to the Archdiocese who contacted the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity to report that they were Abused by an Alleged Perpetrator, whether or not that individual's claim was considered to be substantiated or unsubstantiated and whether or not the report was written or verbal.

(iii) All individuals known to the Archdiocese to whom payment has ever been made by or on behalf of the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity as a result of an allegation of Abuse, including but not limited to the Settling Abuse Survivors (whether they received any or all payments owing as a part of the settlement) as well as all individuals who participated in any mediation or settlement process with the Archdiocese but did not enter into a settlement agreement.

(iv) All individuals known to the Archdiocese whose names were given to the Archdiocese or to representatives of the Archdiocese or to any Catholic Entity or any representatives of a Catholic Entity by an Alleged Perpetrator or any third party during interviews, counseling sessions, or as a part of an investigation of Abuse.

(v) All individuals who attended any daycare, preschool, kindergarten, elementary school, middle school or high school, or any seminary, college, or other educational institution (if the individual was under the age of 18 when he or she attended such college, seminary or other educational institution) in the Archdiocese (a "School") during the years in which an Alleged Perpetrator was present at the School.

- (vi) All individuals identified on the latest alumni mailing list for each School.
- (vii) All registered Catholics in every parish in the Archdiocese during the years in which an Alleged Perpetrator was present in that parish.
- (viii) All individuals known to the Archdiocese who attended or participated in any other Catholic Entity during the years in which an Alleged Perpetrator was present at that Catholic Entity.
- (ix) All individuals who contacted the Archdiocese about their children being in close contact with an Alleged Perpetrator or about some problem with the Alleged Perpetrator and their child.
- (x) All individuals whom the Debtor has ever provided or referred to for counseling, spiritual direction, or therapy support related to Abuse.
- (xi) Where any of the Abuse Survivor Notice Parties listed above have an attorney of record, notice shall also be sent to the attorney of record.

19. To obtain the information requested above, the Debtor will review the files it has within its possession, custody or control related to all Alleged Perpetrators as well as the records of the following: sexual abuse review boards, the Sexual Abuse Prevention & Response Office, the Victims Assistance Counselor, the Safe Environment Coordinator, Eisenberg Commission, Project Benjamin and the Community Advisory Board. Within five (5) days of the entry of the Bar Date Order, the Debtor will contact each Parish, School and other Catholic Entity and request that they provide the names and addresses of the individuals identified in paragraphs 18(i)-(xi) above and will also ask each School for its latest alumni mailing list (the "Information

Request”). The Information Request will be mailed to each Parish, School and other Catholic Entity on the stationary of the Archbishop as a personal request from him. The Debtor will use reasonable efforts to find current addresses for each individual identified by paragraph 18 and will promptly serve each such individual with the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice Package. The Debtor will file a declaration attesting to the efforts it made to comply with these procedures (which will include copies of each Information Request sent by the Debtor) with the Court and serve it on counsel to the Committee within thirty days of service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages. At the same time, the Debtor will provide the counsel to the Committee the names and addresses of all Abuse Survivor Notice Parties and all Alleged Perpetrators. If additional Abuse Survivors or Alleged Perpetrators are identified to the Debtor after the initial service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages, the Debtors shall, within 10 days of their identification, serve a copy of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Package on the additional Abuse Survivors with an amended Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice that includes the name of any subsequently identified Alleged Perpetrator. The information regarding any subsequently identified Alleged Perpetrator shall also be added to the Publication Notice described below. The Debtor will provide counsel to the Committee the names and addresses of all subsequently identified Abuse Survivor Notice Parties and Alleged Perpetrators.

The Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice will include the name of the each individual identified on Exhibit G (“Substantiated Abuser”), as well as the name of the church, parish, School, or other Catholic Entity for which the Substantiated Abuser worked or served, the Substantiated Abuser’s position within said church, parish, School or other Catholic Entity and the Substantiated Abuser’s dates of service or employment with such church, parish, School or

other Catholic Entity. For the purpose of this Motion and for notice of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date, Substantiated Abusers include but are not limited to the individuals listed on Exhibit G as well as any others identified during the course of the due diligence efforts required by paragraphs 18 and 19 above. It shall also include a picture, at least 3” by 5” in dimension, of each Substantiated Abuser at or close to the time of the abuse. It shall also include the following disclaimer:

This list is not exhaustive in that there may be additional priests who may have committed acts of abuse but on whom the Archdiocese does not have a report or for whom the Archdiocese determined that an allegation of abuse was not substantiated. In addition, the list does not include other potential offenders who are not members of the clergy, such as teachers, nuns, or religious order priests). The fact that this list may not include the name of the Alleged Perpetrator who abused you does not mean that you should not file an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form.

20. For Abuse Survivors who are represented, the Debtor shall serve the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages their attorneys of record. All other Abuse Survivors shall be served, first class mail, at their last known home address, after the Debtor has used reasonable efforts to locate a current address for each Abuse Survivor. The names and addresses of all parties served (including any updated addresses which were discovered when mail was returned or otherwise) shall be included on the proof of service, and the proof of service should be filed under seal, with a copy provided to counsel to the Committee, which the Committee will not disclose.

21. The Debtor shall, pursuant to Bankruptcy Rule 2002(l), give notice by publication to certain creditors including: (i) unknown Abuse Survivors; (ii) those creditors to whom no other notice was sent and who are unknown or not reasonably ascertainable by the Debtor; (iii) known creditors with addresses unknown by the Debtor; and (iv) creditors with potential claims unknown by the Debtor.

22. Accordingly, the Debtor shall provide notice of the Bar Dates by causing a copy of the notice attached hereto as Exhibit F (the “Publication Notice”) to be published as follows:

23. In addition, the Debtor shall provide further notice of the Bar Dates by taking the following measures:

- (a) The Debtor will provide the Publication Notice to all parishes and schools located in the Region and each parish and school will post the Publication Notice in a prominent location. The Publication Notice shall be no smaller than 8" X 10" with font no smaller than 10 point. The Publication Notice shall state that it is posted at the request of the Archbishop and is to remain posted within thirty (30) days after the entry of the Bar Date Order through the Abuse Survivor Bar Date (the "Publication Period"). The Debtor or someone at the parish or school at the request of the Debtor shall verify that the Publication Notice remains posted until the end of the Publication Period.
- (b) Archbishop Jerome ListECKI will prepare and sign a letter notifying Catholics in the Region of the Bar Dates and will request that each parish include said letter in its parish bulletin once a week for every week of the Publication Period. The letter will also be mailed or emailed to registered parishioners.
- (c) The Debtor will post the Publication Notice on the homepage of the following websites: www.archmil.org; www.kccllc.net/archmil; and each parish website, each School website, as well as on the homepage of each Publication's web-version. The Publication Notice will remain posted on the websites for the duration of the Publication Period.
- (d) Where Publication Notice is required by these provisions to be published on any website or internet portal, the Debtor shall also provide a videotape upload which provides the Publication Notice for Abuse Survivors in American Sign Language.
- (e) The Debtor and the Committee will maintain toll free numbers which may be used by potential claimants to ask questions or obtain copies of Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms and General Creditor Proof of Claim Form.
- (f) The Debtor will distribute a press release announcing the Abuse Survivor Bar Date to, at a minimum, the programs, schools, ministries, organizations, individuals and media outlets to which it issued press releases, information and fliers in connection with the announcement of the Mediation Program in January 2004 as is further detailed in paragraph 31 of the Motion.
- (g) A priest in each church in each parish will announce the Abuse Survivor Bar Date and the procedure for filing an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim from the pulpit one time during each Sunday mass conducted during the Publication Periods.

(h) The Debtors will also mail a copy of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice to each of the following individuals or entities within the Region: all police departments, the office of the District Attorney, the office of the Wisconsin attorney general, all licensed therapists who work with survivors of sexual abuse, the regional headquarters of Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous, all drug treatment centers, hospitals and public libraries.

24. The Debtor will file a certificate of notice by publication attesting to the efforts it made to comply with these procedures with the Court and serve it on counsel to the Committee within thirty days of service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages. The Debtor will also file with the Court and serve on counsel to the Committee a declaration attesting to the compliance of the parishes, schools and other Catholic Entities with the Publication Protocol.

25. Additionally, the Bar Date Notices and the Publication Notice will: (i) set forth the Bar Dates; (ii) advise creditors under what circumstances they must file a proof of claim in respect of a prepetition claim under Bankruptcy Rules 3002(c)(2) and 3003(c)(3) or an order of this Court, as applicable; (iii) alert creditors to the consequences of failing to timely file a proof of claim, as set forth in Bankruptcy Rule 3003(c)(2) or an order of this Court, as applicable; (iv) set forth the address to which proofs of claim must be sent for filing; (v) outline the Confidentiality Protocol; and (vi) notify creditors that: (a) proofs of claim must be filed with original signatures, and (b) facsimile or e mail filings of proofs of claim are not acceptable and are not valid for any purpose.

26. The publication protocol described above is likely to reach the widest possible audience of creditors who may not otherwise have notice of this Reorganization Case.

27. This Court shall retain jurisdiction to hear and determine all matters arising from or related to the implementation and enforcement of this Order.

~~7.~~ The Bar Date Notices and Publication Notice in the forms and manners as proposed by the Debtor in the Motion provided in this Order are fair and reasonable and will provide good, sufficient, and due notice to all creditors, including creditors with foreign addresses, of their rights and obligations in connection with claims they may assert against the Debtor's estate in this Reorganization Case.

(ii) All individuals known to the Archdiocese who contacted the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity to report that they were victims of abuse Abused by an Alleged Perpetrator, whether or not that individual's claim was considered to be substantiated or unsubstantiated and whether or not the report was written or verbal;

(iii) received payment from the Debtor as a result of an allegation of abuse; All individuals known to the Archdiocese to whom payment has ever been made by or on behalf of the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity as a result of an allegation of Abuse, including but not limited to the Settling Abuse Survivors (whether they received any or all payments owing as a part of the settlement) as well as all individuals who participated in any mediation or settlement process with the Archdiocese but did not enter into a settlement agreement,

(iv) participated in the Mediation Program but not entered into a settlement agreement; and All individuals known to the Archdiocese whose names were given to the Archdiocese or to representatives of the Archdiocese or to any Catholic Entity or any

representatives of a Catholic Entity by an Alleged Perpetrator or any third party during interviews, counseling sessions, or as a part of an investigation of Abuse.

(v) All individuals who attended any daycare, preschool, kindergarten, elementary school, middle school or high school, or any seminary, college, or other educational institution (if the individual was under the age of 18 when he or she attended such college, seminary or other educational institution) in the Archdiocese (a "School") during the years in which an Alleged Perpetrator was present at the School.

(vi) All individuals identified on the latest alumni mailing list for each School.

(vii) All registered Catholics in every parish in the Archdiocese during the years in which an Alleged Perpetrator was present in that parish.

(viii) All individuals known to the Archdiocese who attended or participated in any other Catholic Entity during the years in which an Alleged Perpetrator was present at that Catholic Entity.

(ix) All individuals who contacted the Archdiocese about their children being in close contact with an Alleged Perpetrator or about some problem with the Alleged Perpetrator and their child.

(x) ~~(v)-been~~ All individuals whom the Debtor has ever provided or referred to for counseling, spiritual direction, or therapy support related to abuse or been referred for same by the Debtor Abuse.

~~27. _____ The Debtor will serve the individuals included in the preceding paragraph (the "Potential Claimants") using the same confidentiality procedures as those approved by the~~

~~Court for Unrepresented Claimants, unless such individuals have counsel known to the Debtor, in which case service will be effectuated through such counsel, in the same fashion as approved by the Court for service on the Represented Claimants.~~

(xi) Where any of the Abuse Survivor Notice Parties listed above have an attorney of record, notice shall also be sent to the attorney of record.

To obtain the information requested above, the Debtor will review the files it has within its possession, custody or control related to all Alleged Perpetrators as well as the records of the following: sexual abuse review boards, the Sexual Abuse Prevention & Response Office, the Victims Assistance Counselor, the Safe Environment Coordinator, Eisenberg Commission, Project Benjamin and the Community Advisory Board. Within five (5) days of the entry of the Bar Date Order, the Debtor will contact each Parish, School and other Catholic Entity and request that they provide the names and addresses of the individuals identified in paragraphs 18(i)-(xi) above and will also ask each School for its latest alumni mailing list (the "Information Request"). The Information Request will be mailed to each Parish, School and other Catholic Entity on the stationary of the Archbishop as a personal request from him. The Debtor will use reasonable efforts to find current addresses for each individual identified by paragraph 18 and will promptly serve each such individual with the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice Package. The Debtor will file a declaration attesting to the efforts it made to comply with these procedures (which will include copies of each Information Request sent by the Debtor) with the Court and serve it on counsel to the Committee within thirty days of service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages. At the same time, the Debtor will provide the counsel to the Committee the

names and addresses of all Abuse Survivor Notice Parties and all Alleged Perpetrators. If additional Abuse Survivors or Alleged Perpetrators are identified to the Debtor after the initial service of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages, the Debtors shall, within 10 days of their identification, serve a copy of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Package on the additional Abuse Survivors with an amended Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice that includes the name of any subsequently identified Alleged Perpetrator. The information regarding any subsequently identified Alleged Perpetrator shall also be added to the Publication Notice described below. The Debtor will provide counsel to the Committee the names and addresses of all subsequently identified Abuse Survivor Notice Parties and Alleged Perpetrators.

The Abuse Survivor Bar Date Notice will include the name of the each individual identified on Exhibit G (“Substantiated Abuser”), as well as the name of the church, parish, School, or other Catholic Entity for which the Substantiated Abuser worked or served, the Substantiated Abuser’s position within said church, parish, School or other Catholic Entity and the Substantiated Abuser’s dates of service or employment with such church, parish, School or other Catholic Entity. For the purpose of this Motion and for notice of the Abuse Survivor Bar Date, Substantiated Abusers include but are not limited to the individuals listed on Exhibit G as well as any others identified during the course of the due diligence efforts required by paragraphs 18 and 19 above. It shall also include a picture, at least 3” by 5” in dimension, of each Substantiated Abuser at or close to the time of the abuse. It shall also include the following disclaimer:

This list is not exhaustive in that there may be additional priests who may have committed acts of abuse but on whom the Archdiocese does not have a report or for whom the Archdiocese determined that an allegation of abuse was not substantiated. In addition, the list does not include other potential offenders who are not members of the clergy, such as teachers, nuns, or religious order priests). The fact that this list may not include the name of the Alleged Perpetrator who

abused you does not mean that you should not file an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form.

20. For Abuse Survivors who are represented, the Debtor shall serve the Abuse Survivor Bar Date Packages their attorneys of record. All other Abuse Survivors shall be served, first class mail, at their last known home address, after the Debtor has used reasonable efforts to locate a current address for each Abuse Survivor. The names and addresses of all parties served (including any updated addresses which were discovered when mail was returned or otherwise) shall be included on the proof of service, and the proof of service should be filed under seal, with a copy provided to counsel to the Committee, which the Committee will not disclose.

For the purpose of filing an Abuse Survivor Claim, "Abuse" means:

Any and all acts or omissions that in any way arise out of, are based upon, or involve actual or alleged sexual conduct or misconduct, sexual abuse or molestation, indecent assault and/or battery, rape, lascivious behavior, undue familiarity, pedophilia, ephebophilia, or sexually related physical, psychological or emotional harm, or contacts or interactions of a sexual nature between a child and an adult, or a non-consenting adult and another adult, by a person for whom the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity is or was legally responsible, or who the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity failed to control, direct, train or supervise or about whose acts and propensities the Archdiocese or any Catholic Entity failed to warn, disclose or provide information. A child or a non-consenting adult is abused whether or not this activity involves

SUBMISSION DEADLINE

The United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin (the “Court”) has entered an order (the “Bar Date Order”) establishing { } at 4:00 p.m. (prevailing Central Time) (the “Abuse Survivor Bar Date”) as the last date and time for each Abuse Survivor to submit a proof of claim form. A copy of the proof of claim form that has been specifically tailored for claims of Abuse Survivors (the “Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form”) is included with this Notice. The Abuse Survivor Bar Date and the procedures set forth below for submitting Abuse Survivor Proof of Claims Forms apply to all Abuse Survivor Claims against the Debtor based upon Abuse that occurred before January 4, 2011.

WHO MUST SUBMIT A PROOF OF CLAIM FORM

If you believe that you have an Abuse Survivor Claim (which you may have even if you have never previously reported your abuse or filed a lawsuit against the Debtor), you must file an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form to maintain and/or preserve any claims that you have against the Debtor. If you already filed a lawsuit against the Debtor prior to January 4, 2011, you must still submit an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form to maintain and/or preserve your rights in the Debtor’s chapter 11 case.

ABUSE SURVIVORS WHO HAVE PREVIOUSLY SETTLED CLAIMS

AGAINST THE ARCHDIOCESE

Even if you participated in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee Clergy Sexual Abuse Mediation System and executed a settlement agreement releasing the Debtor you may still be entitled to file a Proof of Claim if you believe that you were misled by the Debtor or its representatives in connection with the mediation. For example, if you entered into a mediated settlement with the Debtor based on representations that were made to you concerning the limited resources that the Debtor had to settle your claims or that you were the only individual who was abused, which assertions you believe were untrue, you should file a claim setting forth the reasons you believe the settlement and release of the Debtor is not enforceable and/or why you believe you are entitled to additional payments (the "Fraudulent Inducement Claims"). If you believe you were misled by the Debtor in connection with the mediation, you may also wish to contact an attorney.

WHO SHOULD NOT FILE

You should **not** file an Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form if:

- Your Abuse Survivor Claim has already been paid in full. This provision does not apply to Settling Abuse Survivors with Fraudulent Inducement Claims who must file a proof of claim if they wish to pursue such claims against the estate.
- You hold an Abuse Survivor Claim that has been allowed by an order of the Bankruptcy Court on or before the Abuse Survivor Bar Date;
- If you do not have a claim against the Debtor.

Survivor Claim is discharged, the Abuse Survivor Claimant will be forever barred and prevented from asserting his or her Abuse Survivor Claim against the Debtor or its property, and may not receive any payment or distribution in connection with such Abuse Survivor Claim.

Pursuant to the Bar Date Order, submitted Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms will remain confidential, unless you elect otherwise in Part 1 of the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form. Therefore, the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form that you submit will not be available to the general public, but will be kept confidential, except that the Claims Agent will provide copies of the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms to the Debtor, Debtor's bankruptcy counsel, counsel to the Committee, and upon request, to the following parties and to any additional parties the Court directs but only after each party agrees to keep the information provided in the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms confidential:

- (a) Insurance companies that provided insurance that may cover the claims described in the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Forms.
- (b) Any future claims representative appointed by the Court.
- (c) Any special arbitrator/claims reviewer appointed to review and resolve the claims of Abuse Survivors.
- (d) Any settlement trustee appointed to administer payments to Abuse Survivors.
- (e) Members of the Committee and their personal counsel (after the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form has been redacted to hide the Abuse Survivor's name, address and any other information identified in Part 2(A) of the Abuse Survivor Proof of Claim Form).

 6 As I understand it, when you speak, you are
 7 the spokesman on behalf of the Archdiocese. Is that
 8 correct?
 9 A Yes.
 10 Q And one of the responsibilities you have as archbishop
 11 within an archdiocese is the establishment of parishes
 12 within the archdiocese. Correct?
 13 A Yes.
 14 Q And you, as the archbishop, have the power and the duty
 15 to appoint the pastor of any particular parish?
 16 A Yes.
 17 Q And you have the power and the ability to remove any
 18 pastor from any parish. Correct?
 19 A Not without cause.
 20 Q Okay. But if there is cause, you have the power and
 21 the ability to do that?
 22 A Yes.
 23 Q You also have the power and the duty to assign priests
 24 to assist the pastors within any parish. Correct?
 25 A We call them associate pastors now, yes.

 1 Q Okay. And you would have the ability for cause to
 2 remove any associate pastor? Is that what you said?
 3 A I can remove an associate pastor without cause.
 4 Q Okay. And I'm sure that you have other people that do
 5 this, but the ultimate responsibility for maintaining
 6 in the archives of all of the archdiocese documents is
 7 your responsibility. Correct?
 8 A Yes.
 9 Q I noticed in the -- some of the Canon Law, there's a
 10 reference to a secret archive, which to a lawyer,

 13 A There is an archive in the chancery which goes under

EXHIBIT J

(3) APPLICATION FOR INCORPORATION. An unincorporated church, congregation, parish or society of the Eastern Orthodox faith, may apply to the appropriate hierarchy, bishop or administrator to incorporate under this chapter. Upon receiving such permission, such body may proceed to incorporate pursuant to s. 187.01.

(4) GOVERNMENT OF LOCAL CHURCHES. (a) Every church, congregation, parish, society or committee incorporated pursuant to sub. (3) shall recognize and be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the duly appointed and canonical hierarchy, bishop or other administrator; shall accept, secure or receive the sacramental, pastoral or ministerial services of such clergy only as are so certified to be of lawful and canonical status or authority in the Eastern Orthodox Church; shall retain or secure as pastors only such clergy as have, in addition, the permission of the hierarchy, bishop or administrator certified to be appropriate; and shall in all respects conform to, maintain and follow the faith, doctrine, ritual, communion, discipline, canon law, traditions and usages of the Eastern Orthodox Church.

(b) Any action of the trustees or parish committees regarding the calling, appointment, removal or compensation of parish clergy shall be subject to approval in writing by the appropriate bishop or administrator exercising jurisdiction.

(c) The trustees of every such incorporated or reincorporated body shall have the custody and control of all the temporalities and property, real and personal, belonging to the corporation together with all revenues therefrom and shall administer the same strictly in accordance with the bylaws of the corporation and the rules, regulations and usages of the orthodox jurisdiction or ecclesiastical governing body to which such church is subject.

(5) APPLICATION. This section applies to all churches, congregations, societies, parishes, committees and other local organizations governed by jurisdictions, bishoprics, dioceses, missions of any orthodox patriarchate, synod or national church of the Eastern Orthodox Church of the patriarchates set forth in sub. (1) (a) to (g).

187.19 Roman Catholic church. (1) BISHOP MAY INCORPORATE. The provisions of this chapter, except this section and subch. II, shall not apply to or in any manner affect the Roman Catholic church or denomination, or any society or religious corporation now existing or which may be organized in connection therewith. The bishop of each diocese, being the only trustee of each Roman Catholic church in his diocese, may cause any or all congregations therein to be incorporated by adding four more members as trustees as hereinafter provided. The bishop and vicar-general of each diocese, the pastor of the congregation to be incorporated, together with two laypersons, practical communicants of such congregation (the latter to be chosen from and by the congregation), shall be such trustees.

(2) POWERS. Such corporation shall assume an appropriate name in its articles of incorporation and may purchase, accept, own and hold property, real and personal, and sell, convey and otherwise dispose of the same and contract debts, all of which shall be done subject to the bylaws and the restrictions hereinafter provided. Such corporation may sue and be sued, have a common seal, which may be changed at pleasure, and do all things necessary for the proper transaction of its business and duties and all things needful in the management of the temporal affairs of the Roman Catholic church of such congregation, and for the benefit thereof and of such members as may become attached and belong to said church in conformity with such rules and regulations as may be established by its bylaws; and also to purchase, own, hold, regulate, control, manage or dispose of any eleemosynary, educational, cemetery, religious or other property which it may acquire in connection with said church and the congregation thereof or be assigned to it by the bishop or other person or persons.

(3) BISHOP, VICAR-GENERAL, PASTOR. The bishop and vicar-general shall be and remain members of the corporation as long as they shall be and remain respectively bishop and vicar-general

of the diocese; and the pastor shall be and remain a member of the corporation so long as the pastor shall be pastor of the congregation; and whenever either or all of them shall cease to be bishop, vicar-general or pastor as aforesaid their respective successors as bishop, vicar-general or pastor shall become their respective successors as members of the corporation, and in like manner they shall have perpetual succession. The bishop and vicar-general or either of them may be represented at any meeting of the congregation or at any meeting of the directors by proxy with like effect as if personally present. The 2 laypersons shall be and remain members of the corporation for the term of 2 years and until their successors, who in all cases shall be laypersons, are chosen or selected as provided by the bylaws. In case of a vacancy in the office of bishop of the diocese the administrator thereof, or such other person as may be appointed according to the rules of the Roman Catholic church to preside over and administer the spiritual and temporal affairs of the diocese, shall be, while he is such administrator or appointee, a member of the corporation in the place and stead of the bishop of the diocese and have the same power and authority in the corporation as the bishop would have.

(4) OFFICERS; BONDS. The officers of the corporation shall be a president, vice president, treasurer and secretary. The bishop, a successor or administrator or other person appointed according to the rules of the Roman Catholic church, or administrator for the time being, shall be president; the pastor shall be vice president, and the treasurer and secretary shall be selected or chosen from among the laypersons as provided by the bylaws. In all cases the treasurer shall be required to give bond to the corporation in the sum and with the sureties the directors require, conditioned that the treasurer will faithfully account for and pay over all moneys received as treasurer and otherwise faithfully discharge the duties of the office, which bond shall, before the treasurer enters upon such duties, be approved by the president, vice president and secretary by endorsement made thereon. Whenever the secretary or treasurer, after due notice, neglects or fails to attend the meetings of the directors or attend to the business of the corporation the office shall be declared vacant by the remaining directors and the vacancy be filled by them.

(5) DEBTS; SALE OF REALTY. The bishop or administrator, the vicar-general, pastor, treasurer and secretary shall be directors of the corporation. They may, by a majority vote, contract debts not exceeding in amount the sum of \$300. Debts in excess of that sum may be contracted by the consent and vote of all the directors. Such debt may be evidenced by a note or other evidence of debt and may be secured by a mortgage on the property of the corporation, but the note, other evidence of debt or mortgage shall not be construed as implying any covenant for the payment of the sum thereby intended to be secured on the part of any of the directors, but the remedies of the payee or mortgagee named therein shall be confined to the lands and property of the corporation. The real estate of the corporation shall not be sold, mortgaged, encumbered or disposed of in any manner without the vote and consent of all the directors.

(6) BYLAWS. The directors, by unanimous vote, may adopt such bylaws, not contrary to the constitution and laws of this state, the statutes of the diocese and the discipline of the Roman Catholic church, as may be deemed necessary for the proper government of such corporation and the management and business thereof or the temporal affairs of such congregation which may become connected therewith or attached thereto. Said bylaws may be altered or amended in the same manner as bylaws are herein required to be adopted and not otherwise; and whenever so adopted or amended shall, before taking effect, be recorded by the secretary in a book to be kept for that purpose and be subscribed to by each of said directors.

(7) ARTICLES TO BE RECORDED IN OFFICE OF REGISTER OF DEEDS. Whenever any of said congregations have complied with the foregoing provisions, the articles of incorporation thereof shall be made out accordingly, be signed by the president and secretary in the presence of two witnesses, who shall sign their names thereto,

and acknowledged before some notary public or other person authorized by law thereto and filed with the department of financial institutions, and recorded in the office of the register of deeds in the county or counties where such corporation may own real estate.

(8) FAILURE TO FILE OR RECORD ARTICLES IN OFFICE OF REGISTER OF DEEDS NOT TO AFFECT VALIDITY. Whenever in the organization of corporations under this section there may have been a failure to record the articles of association or to file a copy thereof in the office of the register of deeds of the proper county, such failure shall not affect the validity of the corporation but the corporation shall be a body corporate from and after the date of the signing of the articles provided that the corporation records the articles or files a copy thereof in the office of the register of deeds of the proper county within 3 months after April 10, 1901.

(9) AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES. The articles of incorporation of any such congregations may be altered or amended by the unanimous vote of the directors of such corporation. When adopted, duplicate copies of such amendment, each with a certificate thereto affixed, signed by the president and secretary and the other directors, and sealed with the corporate seal, if there be any, stating the fact and date of the adoption of such amendment and that the same was adopted by unanimous vote of the directors of the corporation and that such copy is a true copy of the original, shall be made, and one of such duplicate copies shall be filed with the department of financial institutions and the other shall be recorded in the office of the register of deeds of the county where such corporation is located and in the office of the register of deeds of any other county or counties where the corporation may own real estate.

(10) DISSOLUTION OF CORPORATION. Any corporation organized under this section may dissolve by adopting a resolution to that effect by unanimous vote of the directors of such corporation. When adopted, duplicate copies of such resolution of dissolution, each with a certificate thereto affixed, signed by the president and secretary and the other directors, and sealed with the corporate seal, if there be any, stating the fact and date of adoption of such resolution and that the same was adopted by unanimous vote of the directors of the corporation and that such copy is a true copy of the original, shall be made, and one of such duplicate copies shall be filed with the department of financial institutions and the other shall be recorded in the office of the register of deeds of the county where such corporation is located and in the office of the register of deeds of any other county or counties where the corporation may own real estate.

(11) TITLE TO PROPERTY ON DISSOLUTION. Whenever any such corporation shall become defunct or be dissolved the property thereof shall vest in the bishop of the diocese in which such corporation is located, and if within three years from the date of such dissolution said congregation be reincorporated in the manner prescribed by this section the said property so belonging to such defunct or dissolved corporation at the time of its dissolution shall vest in such new corporation.

SUBCHAPTER II

LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION; ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

187.20 Indemnification by incorporated Roman Catholic church; definitions. In ss. 187.20 to 187.28:

(1) "Director or officer" means any of the following:

(a) An individual who is serving as a president, vice president, treasurer or secretary of an incorporated Roman Catholic church under s. 187.19 (4) or as a director of an incorporated Roman Catholic church under s. 187.19 (5).

(b) An individual who, while a director or officer of an incorporated Roman Catholic church, is or was serving at the request of the incorporated Roman Catholic church as a director, officer, partner, trustee, member of any governing or decision-making committee, manager, employee or agent of a corporation, limited liability company, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise.

(c) An individual who, while a director or officer of an incorporated Roman Catholic church, is or was serving an employee benefit plan because his or her duties to the incorporated Roman Catholic church also imposed duties on, or otherwise involved services by, the person to the plan or to participants in or beneficiaries of the plan.

(d) Unless the context requires otherwise, the estate or personal representative of a director or officer of an incorporated Roman Catholic church.

(2) "Expenses" includes fees, costs, charges, disbursements, attorney fees and any other expenses incurred in connection with a proceeding.

(3) "Incorporated Roman Catholic church" means a corporation organized under s. 187.19.

(4) "Liability" includes the obligation to pay a judgment, settlement, forfeiture, or fine, including any excise tax assessed with respect to an employee benefit plan, plus costs, fees, and surcharges imposed under ch. 814, and reasonable expenses.

(5) "Party" means a natural person who was or is, or who is threatened to be made, a named defendant or respondent in a proceeding.

(6) "Proceeding" means any threatened, pending or completed civil, criminal, administrative or investigative action, suit, arbitration or other proceeding, whether formal or informal, which involves foreign, federal, state or local law and which is brought by or in the right of the incorporated Roman Catholic church or by any other person.

187.21 Indemnification of directors and officers.

(1) An incorporated Roman Catholic church shall indemnify a director or officer, to the extent he or she has been successful on the merits or otherwise in the defense of a proceeding, for all reasonable expenses incurred in the proceeding if the director or officer was a party because he or she is a director or officer of the incorporated Roman Catholic church.

(2) (a) In cases not included under sub. (1), an incorporated Roman Catholic church may indemnify a director or officer against liability incurred by the director or officer in a proceeding to which the director or officer was a party because he or she is a director or officer of the incorporated Roman Catholic church, unless liability was incurred because the director or officer breached or failed to perform a duty he or she owes to the incorporated Roman Catholic church and the breach or failure to perform constitutes any of the following:

1. A willful failure to deal fairly with the incorporated Roman Catholic church or its members in connection with a matter in which the director or officer has a material conflict of interest.

2. A violation of criminal law, unless the director or officer had reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was lawful or no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful.

3. A transaction from which the director or officer derived an improper personal profit.

4. Willful misconduct.

(b) Determination of whether an incorporated Roman Catholic church will indemnify a director or officer under this subsection shall be made under s. 187.22.

(c) The termination of a proceeding by judgment, order, settlement or conviction, or upon a plea of no contest or an equivalent plea, does not, by itself, create a presumption that indemnification of the director or officer is not permitted under this subsection.

EXHIBIT K

THE PARISH CORPORATION



Each archdiocesan parish in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee is an independent religious corporation established according to the Civil Statutes of the State of Wisconsin.

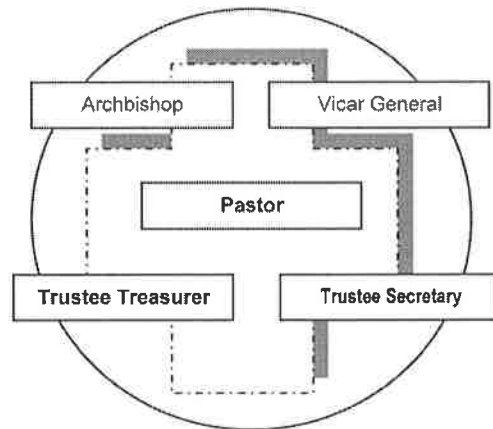
The parish corporation is a **civil body** created solely for legal purposes. It **has authority and competence only in those civil and secular matters** for which it was created.

THE CORPORATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The directors of the parish corporation board are the archbishop, a vicar general of the archdiocese, the pastor and two lay members of the parish referred to as “trustees.” The pastor holds the position of vice-president; the lay trustees serve as treasurer and secretary, and the archbishop is the president.

DIRECTORS OF THE PARISH CORPORATION ARE:

President	Archbishop
Vice-President	Pastor
Trustee-Treasurer	Parishioner
Trustee-Secretary	Parishioner
Member	Vicar General



AUTHORITY OF THE CORPORATE BOARD



The Board of Directors of the parish corporation administers all the temporal matters that are affected by **civil law**, such as:

- the acquisition, lease or sale of property
- execution of construction or major remodeling contracts
- investment management
- lending or borrowing money
- establishment of endowed or restricted funds
- similar transactions

Generally, the Board of Directors convene as required by such actions. There is no stipulated number of annual parish corporation meetings. According to the corporate bylaws meetings are usually held at the discretion of the pastor, the vice-president of the corporation Board of Directors. (*see Appendix A, Article VI, section 2*).

PARISH TRUSTEES

ARCHDIOCESAN POLICIES REGARDING PARISH TRUSTEES



1. Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years of age.
2. Bylaws require that trustees be **elected** every two years, by the parishioners, to serve a two-year term. Trustees serve until their successors are elected.
3. Parish staff and permanent deacons are not eligible to serve as trustees.
4. The archbishop, as president of the corporation, has the right to approve or disapprove any lay trustee elected by the parish or appointed by the pastor to succeed or to fill temporary vacancies of unexpired terms.
5. One trustee is designated as the trustee-treasurer and the other as the trustee-secretary.
6. Trustees are ex-officio members of the parish council and participate fully in the work of the council.
7. Trustees may not hold office on the parish council nor should they serve as chairpersons of parish committees or liaisons to committees.
8. At least one trustee (usually the treasurer) along with the pastor must sign each check issued by the parish.
9. Parish trustees are not to initiate or respond to any lawsuit in the name of the parish without the written permission of the archbishop.
10. The trustee-treasurer is an ex-officio member of the Finance/Administrative Services or Finance Committee.

TRUSTEE-TREASURER

POSITION DESCRIPTION

According to the Parish Corporate Bylaws, the trustee-treasurer is responsible for keeping accurate and detailed accounts of receipts and disbursements for the parish. Most parishes have paid staff who carry out these accounting functions. The trustee-treasurer's particular responsibility is that of parish treasury activities. This includes the care and custody of funds, assets, supervision of banking, credit, and insurance. The trustee-treasurer is an ex-officio member of the Finance/Administrative Services or Finance Committee.

SUGGESTED RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEE-TREASURER



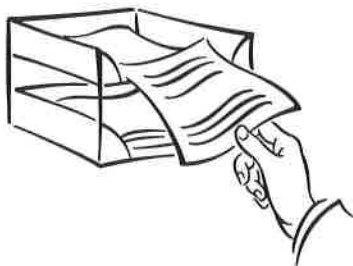
1. Oversees, coordinates or maintains accurate and detailed accounts of all receipts and disbursements of parish funds following the Parish Uniform Chart of Accounts for reporting operations of the parish. This is found in Chapter 3 of the *Parish Financial Management Manual*.
2. Coordinates bank deposits of parish funds; is familiar with banking regulations.
3. With the pastor, signs all checks for disbursements of parish funds as needed. (Checks **must** be signed by **two members of the Board of Directors, one of whom is the pastor.**)
4. Coordinates parish property and casualty insurance coverage under the Archdiocesan Self -Insurance Program.
5. Coordinates collection of parish contributions and special collections.
6. Assists in preparation of annual parish budget according to the archdiocesan parish budgeting guidelines.
7. Oversees or assists in the preparation of financial reports to the parish and to the archdiocese.
8. Serves as an ex-officio member of the Finance/Administrative Services or Finance Committee.
9. Is familiar with the *Parish Financial Management Manual*. (See page 62.)

TRUSTEE-SECRETARY

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.

SUGGESTED RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEE-SECRETARY



1. Arranges and keeps minutes of any meeting of the Board of Directors; is responsible for the corporate book of minutes.
2. Signs corporate documents and affixes the corporate seal.
3. Attends to corporate notices and correspondence; provides the parish council with copies of resolutions and minutes as appropriate.
4. Records and files proxy documents and all corporate reports as prescribed by federal, state, local and archdiocesan authorities.
5. With the pastor signs parish checks as needed. (Checks **must** be signed by **two members of the Board of Directors, one of whom must be the pastor.**)
6. Assists in preparation of annual parish and archdiocesan reports.
7. Maintains records of all real parish property and property tax exemptions.
8. Assists in preparation of and maintains parish inventory and submits it as required to the chancery.
9. Assists parish staff in maintaining a current parish census, including the names and addresses of all parish members.
10. Is familiar with *Parish Personnel Guidelines*. (See page 62.)

ELECTION OF TRUSTEES

The rules governing election of parish trustees come from Wisconsin State Statute 187.19 which stipulates that trustees are to be elected “from and by the congregation.” Directives regarding election of trustees are contained in the Parish Corporate Bylaws (see Appendix A). **Parishes must follow these stipulations in order to comply with civil requirements.**

CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS:



Parishioners who are considering accepting nomination for the position of trustee must be

- Catholic
- A registered, practicing parish member
- At least 25 years old.

They must be educated about the position. Trustee nominees should receive the same orientation as parish council candidates. In addition, they need to be familiar with the information in this book, the *Parish Council Manual*, the *Parish Financial Management Manual* and *Parish Committee Resource Book*.

WHEN ARE ELECTIONS HELD?

Since the term of service is a two-year term, trustees must be elected every two years.

Both trustees' terms can run simultaneously or they can be staggered, selecting one trustee each year. Each parish determines its preference in this matter. Staggering the terms provides for the continuity of a selection of a trustee each year, as well as attempting to avoid having two new trustees in the same year. However, simultaneous terms allow the parish to choose trustees every other year. The parish leadership should discuss the pros and cons of each situation and then formulate a policy regarding the pattern for election of trustees in their parish.

Each parish determines when the best time to hold trustee elections is. This election may occur at the same time as the annual parish council selection process, which would allow the trustee candidates to participate in the orientation with the parish council candidates. However, the difference between the two positions held by the trustee, i.e. parish council

member, corporation board member, needs to be clear, both in understanding of the responsibilities and the selection process.

Since many parishes use a discernment process to select parish council members, it may be wise to separate the trustee **election** from this process.

On the other hand, the easiest way to comply with the state statute is through a parish election of trustees. After reviewing the following directives, other options will emerge.

PARISH TRUSTEE ELECTION TIMELINE

(Six weeks before the election)

NOTICE

Pastor gives notice of the upcoming trustee election. At this time the pastor may identify a nominee for the position. Reminders of the coming election are made for four successive weeks prior to the election.

ELECTION COMMITTEE

The pastor appoints an election committee to receive nominations, supervise and carry out the election.

NOMINATIONS OPEN

Nominations:

Candidates must be Catholic, registered, practicing parish members and at least 25 years old.

The pastor can nominate one candidate per opening.

Additional candidates must be nominated in writing by 10 or more registered parish members. (See nomination form sample Appendix C.)

(Two weeks before the election)

NOMINATIONS CLOSE

Nominations must be completed.

If there is only one nominee for each position, nominations are closed and the nominee declared elected to the position.

ANNOUNCEMENT

If there is more than one nominee per position, the candidates names are announced at the weekend masses two weeks prior to the election.

ELECTION SUNDAY

The election must be held every two years by written ballot at any parish-wide meeting or before/after a designated weekend's masses. Parish members 18 years and older are eligible to vote for the trustees.

ELECTION

Nominees who receive the highest number of votes become the trustees subject to the approval of the archbishop.

APPROVAL

After any trustee is elected or re-elected, their name is sent to the chancery for the archbishop's affirmation. The archbishop, president of the Board of Directors, has the right to approve or disapprove any lay trustee elected by the parish or appointed by the pastor to fill a temporary vacancy of an unexpired term. After the approval is given, a letter of confirmation is sent to the parish to be filed in their corporate record books.

ACCEPTANCE

Trustees indicate acceptance by signing and returning their Statement of Understanding form.

ELECTION OF TRUSTEES	
Weeks prior to election	Activity
6	Announce process of trustee election and date. Appoint election committee. Open nominations.
5-4-3	Remind parishioners that nominations are open.
2	Nominations close. Candidates names are announced.
1	Candidates names are announced.
Election Sunday	Parishioners age 18 and older vote. Committee tabulates vote, reports results to pastor. Pastor sends request for approval to chancery.
Following week/s	Chancery forwards request to archbishop. Archbishop approves. Chancery sends approval notice to pastor. Trustees indicate acceptance by signing and returning their Statement of Understanding form. Pastor announces new trustee to parish.

TERM OF OFFICE

According to the Corporate Bylaws the trustee's term is renewable with no limitations as to consecutive terms. However, experience and common sense dictate that a person in a position of parish trustee for more than six years should consider moving on. Exceptions are always possible as long as the attitude is one of service and not power, of openness and not control.

RESIGNATIONS AND VACANCIES

A trustee may resign by filing a written letter of resignation with the pastor. Vacancies can occur through death, resignation, long absence or inability to perform duties. In such cases the pastor has the right to appoint a substitute or successor, who is subject to the approval of the archbishop.

As part of the process of declaring a vacancy (a trustee's neglect of duties, failure to attend meetings, etc.) the remaining directors (archbishop, vicar general, pastor, trustee) must issue the declaration and appoint a substitute or successor (*See Article IX, Section 2, Bylaws*).

LEGAL MATTERS

1. Lawsuits

Parish trustees are not to initiate or respond to any lawsuit in the name of the parish without the written permission of the archbishop.

2. Acts of Administration Requiring Unanimous Consent of the Directors

Certain administrative matters dealt with by the parish corporation require that all five directors give their approval before the action is valid and legal.

Since two of the directors of the parish corporation, the archbishop and vicar general, are not ordinarily a part of the local parish scene, and since all five directors need to vote unanimously on the acts of administration listed below, the pastor and two trustees contact the archbishop and the vicar general for their vote by proxy.

**ACTS OF ADMINISTRATION
REQUIRING UNANIMOUS CONSENT OF THE DIRECTORS**

1. Borrowing money in excess of \$300
2. Selling, mortgaging, leasing or other encumbering of parish property
3. Making an extraordinary expenditure of funds “already in hand” which is not a regular operation expenditure for any amount of money which exceeds 4% of the last year’s parish revenue. (See example on page 20.)
4. Establishing an endowment for any purpose (religious education, Catholic school, liturgical needs, building projects, etc.)
5. Entering into any building or renovation project. (In order to facilitate a workable process, the directors’ approval must be secured in the initial stage of planning.)

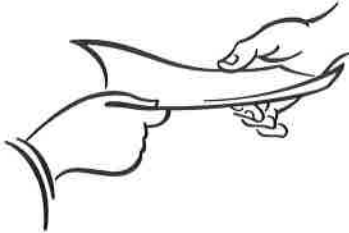
3. Requesting a Proxy

In order to secure the vote of the archbishop and vicar general, a letter explaining the proposal is sent directly to the archbishop by the pastor including the signatures of the two trustees and the parish council chairperson. The letter should contain the following information:

- A clear explanation of the situation
- Figures and funding matters
- Lender and payment schedule, if any is needed
- Timelines
- Identification of research or studies
- A statement about the consensus/vote of the parish council
- A copy of a lease agreement or endowment statutes, etc.

If the archbishop and vicar general support the proposal, they give their “vote by proxy” through the Chancery Office to the pastor.

WHAT IS A PROXY?



A proxy is the **document signed by the archbishop and vicar general** whereby they both **waive their attendance** at the parish directors' meeting **and ask the pastor as vice-president to vote on their behalf** as indicated in the first section of the document. *(See sample, Appendix C.)*

Proxies are always required and issued at various stages of a major construction process. (See Building Commission Guidelines, page 62.)

Two copies of the proxy document are prepared by the Chancery.

1. One is retained in the Chancery Office.
2. The other is returned to the parish to be signed by the pastor and trustees and then filed by the trustee-secretary in the parish book of corporate minutes.

EXTRAORDINARY ADMINISTRATION

Whenever a parish wants to use its own funds which it has on hand for an “extraordinary” expenditure (not a regular operation expenditure), it / the pastor must obtain a proxy from the archbishop for any amount of expenditure **which exceeds 4% of the last reported parish revenue**. That revenue figure is the one presented the previous year on the Annual Confidential Financial Statement, rounded to the nearest thousand.

In determining the proxy **minimum figure** for the parish, no other factors such as mortgage or school are to be used. If the 4% figure is below \$1,500, the parish may use \$1,500 as its proxy figure.

If on the other hand, the 4% figure is over \$30,000, the parish must use \$30,000 as its proxy **ceiling figure**. These ceiling figures are the amount of expenditure above which a proxy must be obtained for valid action.

Examples:

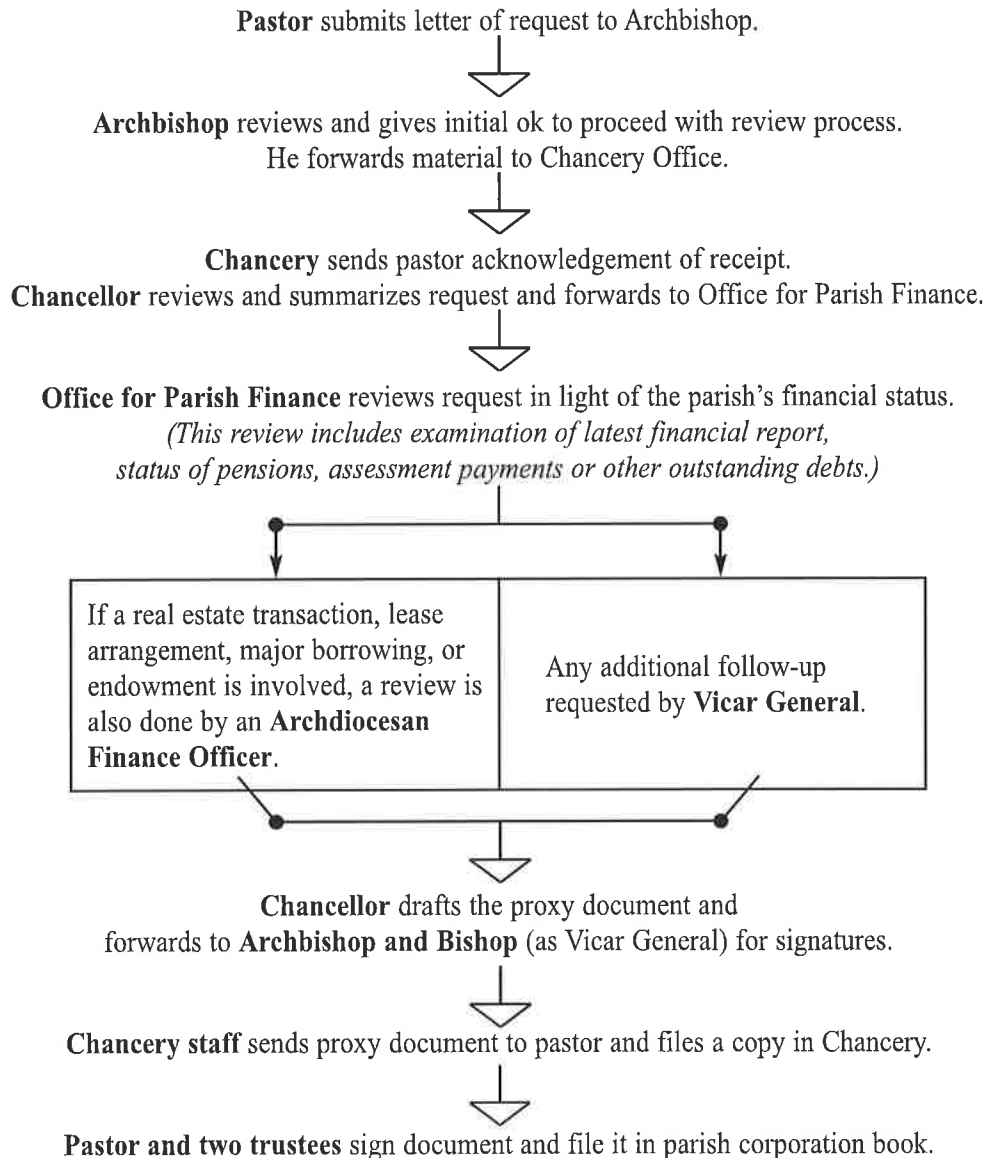
If the last reported annual income was \$325,650, the maximum amount that the parish may expend without a proxy is \$13,040 ($\$326,000 \times .04$).

If the last reported annual income was \$25,963, the amount that parish may expend without a proxy would be \$1,500, because the \$1,040 ($\$26,000 \times .04$) is less than \$1,500.

If the last reported annual income was \$810,565, the amount that parish may expend without a proxy would be \$30,000, because \$32,440 ($\$811,000 \times .04$) exceeds the ceiling limit of \$30,000.

The above required 4% formula applies in each instance a proxy is required. *The formulated amount should be determined each year by the parish Finance/Administrative Services Committee, based on the revenue figure in the Status Animarum of the previous year.*

PROXY PROCESS AT-A-GLANCE



PARISH ADMINISTRATION



Parish Administration is the action-system responsible for influencing and empowering people to accomplish the parish mission. The pastor is the chief administrator of the parish but may delegate administrative responsibilities to members of the parish staff such as a director of religious education, a school principal, a liturgist, a director of youth ministry, a business manager or a director of Finance/Administrative Services. The parish staff also serve as resources to the parish council and committees.

The parish staff is the primary administrative group of the parish. These are people employed by the parish to implement parish policies as determined by the parish council. They also manage the daily operations of the parish. Sometimes, especially in small parishes, parishioners offer their time and talent to fulfill administrative responsibilities.

PARISH ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF INCLUDES:

- Pastor
- Professional Staff
- Parishioners offering time and talent
- Trustee-Treasurer
- Trustee-Secretary

THE FUNCTIONS OF PARISH ADMINISTRATION ARE TO:

1. Assist in the development of the parish mission and goals
2. Formulate procedures consistent with the policies approved by the parish council to carry out the parish mission
3. Monitor the daily operations of the parish
4. Design, implement and evaluate programs, personnel, services and activities of the parish
5. Manage efficient and effective use of financial, personnel and material resources
6. Maintain open communication with and among various groups and individuals in the parish
7. Define strategies to carry out the long-range goals of the parish
8. Facilitate the growth and development of the people, systems and relationships within the parish

EFFECTIVE PARTNERSHIP



An open, trusting relationship between parish council and parish administration, as well as a solid understanding of the roles and responsibilities of each group, are necessary for effectively accomplishing the parish's mission.

At times one group may be required to take a stronger leadership role than another, as in the case of a committee developing or implementing a parish policy. At other times, the pastor, as the chief administrator of the parish, may be required to act autonomously. Communication and trust enable these two groups to work together for the good of the parish. The pastor and trustees are key links between parish council and administrative staff.

TRUSTEE AS MEMBER OF PARISH ADMINISTRATION

Regular communication with parish staff members and the pastor is beneficial for trustees in order for them to maintain knowledge of parish operations and activities. The most routine administrative task of the trustees is that of signing any and all checks issued by the parish. Archdiocesan policy stipulates that two directors sign each check. Ordinarily the pastor is one of the two signators. (c. 546)

The role of the trustees takes on many forms due to the individuality of each parish and each pastor. In one sense the trustees can be the pastor's closest advisors, giving their counsel on individual issues as well as moving the parish along the faith journey it envisions. In practical matters, trustees help with the administrative function of the parish by overseeing the accounting and personnel practices in varying degrees of involvement depending upon the traditions of the parish, the size of the staff and the attitude of the pastor. Most importantly the pastor and trustees seek mutual agreement on corporate responsibilities and procedures with no one acting independently of the others.

The Code of Canon Law establishes that the pastor represents the parish in all juridic matters (c. 532). That person is charged with the responsibility of administering the goods of the parish in accordance with canon law. In the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, under state law, trustees are mandated in all parishes. Canon law also requires every parish to have a finance council (c.537) to aid the pastor in administrative responsibilities. We refer to this council as the Finance/Administrative Services Committee. At least one of the trustees serves on this committee. Beyond

these requirements, the pastor, as chief administrator, largely determines how the trustees will function in a particular parish.

The Parish Corporate Bylaws (Article IV) provide for the designation of trustee-secretary and trustee-treasurer. The position descriptions on pages 13-14 serve as a guide to parishes and trustees in determining the role and duties of trustees in the parish.

As members of both facets of the parish organization, trustees have the unique responsibility of the overall parish vision and how it is carried out through daily operations.

SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES



1. Direction setting and policy development

Parish leaders set and communicate a common direction to all. Policies which implement the direction should be clearly stated and communicated.

2. Communication and public relations

Open, two-way channels of communication, which provide for both sharing information and receiving feedback, are very important to the life of the parish.

3. Material resources (property, buildings, equipment and supplies)

These resources should enable the building of a community.

4. Financial resources

Parish leaders strive for proper stewardship of the financial resources available to the parish.

5. Personnel resources

People resources are vital in meeting the needs of the parishioners.

6. Planning

The parish should have an operational plan, provide services, implement programs and monitor the daily parish operations. In addition, long-range planning is essential.

7. Stewardship and membership

Parishioners need to be regularly invited into personal ownership of the parish's mission by matching needs with talents.

8. Marketing and development

The parish's mission must be communicated to the public. Efforts should be made to secure adequate funding for the mission.
